Decreto, convocando a los electores de San Juan de Concepción, Piedadas Norte, San Rafael, San Isidro y Los Angeles, todos los de San Ramón; para elegir Procuradores Síndicos, elecciones que no pudieron efectuarse por falta de quorum.

Policía.—Se despachó favorablemente la solicitud de don Francisco de Paula Amador Salcedo, para que se le permita exhumar los restos de su hermano don Manuel Amador Camargo.

—Se nombra a don José Santiago Sánchez, para Secretario de la Agencia Principal de Policía de Higiene de Pantarenas.

Cables

Constantinopla, 14.—Amenázanse desórdenes entre la frontera turco-persa cerca de Baqasid. Cinco mil persas amenazan invadir y posesionarse de Mosul, que está ocupado por tres batallones de turcos con tres cañones.

Washington, 14.—El embajador francés Jeseand conferenció con Root relativo a la cuestión con Venezuela. Francia se está poniendo impaciente. Pide a Castro una contestación categórica.

Roma, 14.—Se anuncia oficialmente que Italia, deseando concluir sus cuestiones con Venezuela, propuso el arbitraje, pero Castro ha contestado evasivamente. Titton ha ordenado a Filippo Sera, Cónsul General de Italia en San Francisco, trasladarse a Caracas en calidad de Ministro Plenipotenciario.

Petersburgo, 14.—El Gobierno se ha declarado contra el sufragio universal. El Czar sostendrá a Witte a pesar de la insistencia de los reaccionarios. Krustaleff proyectaba una revolución general. Duddulio, Prefecto de Petersburgo ha dimitado, reemplazándolo el barón Meyerhoff. Se han declarado en huelga los tipógrafos del Russ, porque no se les pagó el tiempo que estuvieron de huelga. El entierro de los restos de Sakaroff fué solemnísimamente.

Washington, 14.—Representantes de New York en la Cámara de Representantes presentaron una moción expresando sus simpatías con los judíos de Rusia.

Nueva York, 14.—En este momento la Empresa cablegráfica comercial anuncia que la comunicación telegráfica con Petersburgo está nuevamente interrumpida.

Moscow, 14.—Los telegrafistas de Reval, Kieff, Kaskan, Noogorod, Arcangel y Nerva, regresaron a sus puestos.

Habana, 14.—Se están tratando en ésta, 15 casos de fiebre amarilla.

Londres, 14.—Se han nombrado al Marqués de Butt, subsecretario de Relaciones Exteriores; a John Lawson Wilton, Procurador General; a Thomas Shaw, Lord Advocate. Probablemente se nombrará a Winston Churchill, Subsecretario de las colonias.

Nueva York, 14.—De regreso por el Japón se embarcó hoy Takhira.

Madrid, 14.—Trasest contestó a la comisión de ganaderos que le visitó, que piensa establecer en Galicia y otras regiones estaciones pecuarias para mejorar la ganadería. En caso de insuficiencia para proveer los Mercados, propondría rebaja de derechos sobre carnes Argentinas. Conca declaró ante el Senado que el incendio de los talleres de Basranca fué casual.

Colón 11.—Avisan de Bogotá que las relaciones entre Colombia y Barrett, Ministro americano son cordialísimas. Reyes le ha invitado a una comida particular a un gran banquete diplomático, se convocó una reunión de la asamblea nacional, para tratar la cuestión de la nueva división territorial del país. Se propone dividirlo en grandes provincias suprimiendo todo gasto innecesario. La asamblea también terminará la cuestión de Panamá, comensurativo con honor y dignidad de Colombia. El progreso alcanzado por Colombia desde el advenimiento de Reyes es sorprendente. Débase esto a la convicción absoluta de amigos y enemigos de que el país jamás será otra vez teatro de contienda civil. Hoy día no hay en Colombia un solo preso político.

Berlín, 14.—Se ha entablado negociaciones entre el Brasil y Alemania, se cree en esta que la cuestión se arreglará satisfactoriamente.

Berlín, 14.—El Ministro del Brasil quejoso ayer a esta cancillería del procedimiento del Panter, alegando que constituye la violación del derecho de gentes. Los asuntos se investigarán concienzudamente con entera imparcialidad, caso que tengan la culpa los oficiales alemanes, se le dará al Brasil completa satisfacción. No se han recibido aun informes del somplot de Phanter. Parece, sin embargo que se ha establecido definitivamente una casa, y es que Steinhoff no era desertor ni tampoco ayudó técnicamente a la desertión. El Ministro Basler dice que los informes hasta la vez recibidos son oscuros. Confirma el informe de que el hotelero Etajahy recibió una tarjeta postal de Steinhoff, quien había dejado su equipaje en el hotel, suplicándole enviarlo y su correspondencia a Buenos Aires. Agregó el Ministro que la cuestión no es grave y que es infundada.

LOSS OF THE AUXILIARY LAUNCH «FLORENCIA» AND DROWNING OF THREE PROMINENT FOREIGNERS

It is with feelings of deep sorrow that we record the death by drowning of the following well known residents of the Atlantic zone. Mr. F. M. H. Wood British Vice-consul and Editor and Proprietor of the «Limon Weekly News», Mr. John M. Tibaut of Germania and Mr. A. D. Rather Supt. of the U. F. Co's Farms in the Zent district. The first news of the sad event reached this town at 1 30 p. m. by a telegram from Swamp Mouth signed by the Captain, in which he briefly stated, that the schooner was lost and three passengers and two of the crew drowned.

The entire town was thrown into a state of excitement as soon as the sad intelligence was made public as it was well known that the above gentlemen had left here in company with Mr. Masgrave Supt. of the Wireless Telegraph who chartered the boat for account of the U. F. Coy on Friday last for a trip to Bluefields with the intention of returning in the same boat. At about 4 p. m. the Captain telegraphed the names of those who were drowned and it then became a certainty that these gentlemen had met a watery grave. According to the statement of the Captain, the «Florenca» left Bluefields on Monday at 1 30 p. m. the weather being very fine, and the boat with all sails set forging along at a brisk rate, at about 7 p. m. the weather became nasty and sails were taken in and the machine put at 1/2 speed, the wind and sea continued to increase to the violence of a hurricane and at about 10 p. m. three huge waves struck the «Florenca» and her stern went under completely, engulfing her, and in a few moments her passengers and crew were struggling in the ocean and the unfortunate ship at the bottom of the sea. At the time of the accident Mr. Wood was below and Mr. Rather lying flat on the deck, to save himself from being washed overboard. This was the last the Captain saw of either of these unfortunate gentlemen. Mr. Tibaut swam for some distance in view of the Captain and finally disappeared beneath the waves. The five survivors with the Captain succeeded in keeping afloat by clinging to the upturned boat which was washed off the deck of the ship for 8 hours after which they righted the boats. They passed the entire night in the water and were finally drifted ashore off Pacuare.

On the arrival of the passenger train on Wednesday evening hundreds of persons flocked to the station. The survivors were received by the owners of the ill fated schooner and in company with the guards who had escorted them from Bar Mouth (to which place they had walked) proceeded to the Resguardo and made a statement of the accident. A deep gloom has settled over the entire city as the three gentlemen were well known and expressions of sympathy were heard on all sides.

Up to a late hour last night groups of Jamaicans, men and women waited in front of the British Consulate, all of whom regretted the untimely death of their Consul.

The bell of St. Mark's Church was tolled at dusk for some time in memory of the dead.

The «Florenca» was a schooner of 85 tons fitted with 50 H. P. gasoline engine and cost C 22,000. No insurance whatever was on her.

THE CAPE TO CAIRO TELEGRAPH

In the Pall Mall Magazine for November, Mr. Howard Henson gives an account of the erection of the telegraph wire from the Cape to Cairo, which it is hoped will be completed in 1907. In May, 1903, it had reached Udjidji, in German East Africa. Then there was a pause, for the country northward as far as the Sudan was terra incognita, and it was necessary to make an accurate survey of it. In the meantime the line already erected was got into proper working order, and, considering its length and the country which it traverses, this was an affair of no small magnitude. The distance from Salisbury, in Mashonaland, the starting point, to Abercorn, at the foot of Lake Tanganyika, is about 1,635 miles; and Udjidji is 293 miles farther north,—nearly 2,000 miles in all.

Cablegrams

TURKEY

Constantinople, 14.—Disorders are threatened on the Turkish frontier near Bayazid; 5000 Persians are threatening to invade and take possession of Mosul which is occupied by 3 battalions of Turks and cannons.

UNITED STATES

Washington, 14.—The French Ambassador Mons Jusserand has had conferences with Roosevelt relative to the question with Venezuela; France is getting impatient and demands a categorical answer from Venezuela.

In the House of Representatives a motion expressing sympathy with the Russian Jews was presented by the New York members.

New York, 14.—The Commercial Cable Co. has just announced that telegraphic communication with St. Petersburg is again interrupted.

—Takahira has left for Japan.

Roosevelt opened the Electrical Exposition in Madison Square Garden yesterday by pressing a button in Washington. Here all notable electrical inventions are exhibited. The most notable is

without doubt the growing popularity for culinary purposes. A model of one of the largest and most complete electrical kitchens is being operated by current generated by the Niagara Cataract. Three revolving ovens bake 240 pies per hour, in a bakery an electric motor for kneading dough has a capacity of 4 barrels of flour, there is an apple paring machine, a meat mincer, a jelly press and a dish washing machine with a capacity of 400 plates.

GREAT BRITAIN

London, 14.—The Daily Telegraph correspondent in Moji says: The mutineers of Harbin have sacked and burned houses at various points. They obtained possessions of arms and ammunition. The barracks at Chimo destroyed by fire, 400 Russians dead or wounded in the streets, the authorities cooperating in the pillage.

ITALY

Rome, 14.—It is officially announced that Italy desirous of concluding the Italian questions with Venezuela, proposed arbitrage but Castro replied evasively. Titeni has ordered Filippo Serra Consul General of Italy in San Francisco to go to Caracas in the capacity of Minister Plenipotentiary.

RUSSIA

St Petersburg, 14.—The Government has not declared against universal suffrage, the Czar sustains Witte in spite of the insistence of the reactionaries. Krustaloff projects a general revolution Dudulin, Prefect of St Petersburg has resigned, Baron Meyerdorff will replace him. The composers of the «Russ» have struck because they were not paid for the time that they were out on strike. Sakaroff's military funeral will be very solemn.

Moscow, 14.—The telegraphists of Revel, Kieff, Kazan Norgorod, Arangely Nerva have returned to their posts.

COLOMBIA

Colon R. of Panama, 15.—Advices from Bogot state that relations between Colombia and American Minister Barrett are very cordial. Reyes has invited him to a private dinner and a grand diplomatic banquet. The National Assembly has been convened to treat of the new territorial division of the country, it is proposed to divide it into big Departments suppressing all unnecessary expenses. The Assembly will also resolve the Panama question in a manner commensurate with the dignity and honor of Colombia. The progress acquired by Colombia since the advent of Reyes is surprising. Owing to this there is an absolute conviction the part of friends and even enemies that the country will never be again the theatre of civil war; there is not a single political prisoner in Colombia to-day.

SPAIN

Madrid, 14.—Trasset replied to the commission of cattlemen who visited him that he intended to establish stock farms for the improvement of the cattle in Galicia and other points. In case of insufficiency to provide the markets, he will propose a reduction of tariff on Argentine cattle. Con-

cas declared before the Senate that the fire of the Barraca workshops was due to accident.

GERMANY

Berlin, 14.—Negotiations have been begun between Brazil and Germany relative to the «Panther» incident, it is thought here that the question will be arranged satisfactorily.

The Brazilian Minister complained to the Chancellerie here yesterday that the proceedings of the Panther constitute a violation of the people's rights. The matter will be conscientiously and impartially investigated and if the German officers be guilty, full satisfaction will be offered to Brazil. The report of the Captain of the Panther has not yet been received. One thing however appears to be established definitely, and that is, that Steinoff neither was a deserter, nor had he aided in any desertion. The Brazilian Minister says that information received up to now is obscure. The notice that the hotel keeper at Itajahay received a postal card from Steinoff whose baggage was left in the hotel requesting the former to send him his baggage and correspondence to Buenos Aires is confirmed. The Minister added that the incident is not of a grave character and that the rumor that Brazil had requested the United States to intervene is unfounded.

BRAZIL

Rio Janeiro, 14.—A significant dispatch has been received to-day from Rio Grande. It speaks about relations between the authorities and officials of the Panther, a reception was held to-day aboard the «Panther» at which the Captain toasted the friendship of Brazil and Germany. Rio Branco received a tranquilizing message from Berlin to-day and sent a message of 400 words in cipher to the Minister in Berlin.

The Journal of Commerce says. It is strange that the German Consul and the Commander of the «Panther» persist in saying that there was no violation of territory when there were a dozen witnesses who saw Steinoff carried aboard the «Panther» by force.

GREAT BRITAIN

London, 14.—The «Telegraph» correspondent in Madrid says that preparations are being made for King Alfonso's wedding with Princess Eugenia of Battenberg. It will be officially announced to the Cortes in February or March. Many improvements are being made in the Royal Palace. The meeting of the King with the Princess at Algeciras has been postponed owing to the proximity of the assembling of the Cortes. The pair will meet at Biarritz of Pau.

The King desires to make the union the motive for popular festivities an idea enthusiastically welcomed by the Spaniards.

CHINA

Pekin, 4.—On Wednesday the Chinese who killed the American Missionaries in Lien Chau were publicly punished. Three were beheaded, 8 were sentenced to hard labour for various terms ranging from 18 months to 5

years. Search is being made in order to apprehend those who are still at large.

RUSSIA

St. Petersburg, 14.—Since their arrest all but 4 of the workmen's delegates have been liberated. They immediately celebrated a meeting and passed a resolution affirming anew their intention to prepare for an armed uprising. Notable among the arrests in Mozuresno is that of one of the most active members of the peasant's league who arrived here to organize a conference for purpose of fusion between the peasants and workmen. The Official Messenger publishes a proclamation from the Minister of the Interior declaring the Government's intention to break up unions and dismiss all strikers.

The Exchanges of Moscow and Rostoff are entreating Witte to cede the demands, as a continuation of the strike means complete ruin. Two corps of Cossacks in barracks at Moscow held a meeting and requested to be allowed to return to their homes.

Pobiedonostzeff's influence is again prevailing at Czarkoesloe, it is said that the Emperor consults him on all important questions. This together with the thanks rendered to the Cossack and the reception of the reactionaries who persuaded the Emperor to sign again the autocratic proclamation constitutes a proof of the growing governmental tendency in Russia.
