Muy pronto, según se nos informa, entrará en vigencia la ley que crea la Junta Liquidadora de Ventas de Cacao, cuya sede será la ciudad de Limón.

Nos complace en alto grado la realización de este ideal, que abrigamos desde hace muchos años y que alguna vez hemos publicado en la prensa capitulina.

La Junta Liquidadora debe ser integrada, en su mayoría, por verdaderos productores de cacao, dándole, hasta donde sea posible, representación a los diferentes sectores de la provincia que lo produzcan.

No sabemos de cuántos miembros se compondrá; pero en todo caso, Siquirres, La Estrella, Matina y la Línea Principal, deben ser representados por finqueros con arraigo en cada uno de estos lugares.

Sugerimos, desde luego, la presencia de un exportador, como delegado de su gremio, y el de un representante de la banca local.

No conocemos el proyecto, pero suponemos que la Junta

funcionará, más o menos dentro del mismo mecanismo que la del café.

Podría pensarse en establecer, sino ahora, más adelante, la Bolsa del Cacao, para las ventas de consumo local, las que se harían en subasta pública, al mejor postor.

Este procedimiento traería como lógica consecuencia la lógica puja de clases, lo que daría estímulo al productor para mejorar el beneficio y hasta el cultivo de su grano.

No debemos dejar pasar por alto el hecho de que, muy pronto, estará montada la gran fábrica de cacao en marqueta, para la exportación, en la capital y que esta nueva industria consumirá gran parte de nuestra producción.

Otros industriales que se dedican a la elaboración del cacao, continuarán siendo magníficos compradores de nuestro grano de oro, y en la venta por sistema de subastas públicas se favorecería en mucho al productor.

EDITORIAL

DEL MOMENTO POLITICO

Se anuncian elecciones de diputados para este año. A pesar de que nuestro mayor anhelo es, el retorno del país a la constitucionalidad en todos sus aspectos, no creemos conveniente por ahora, lanzar a los ciudadanos a una nueva lucha política.

Las elecciones de la Constituyente fueror, prácticamente, pacíficas y ordenadas; no hubo casi campaña, a excepción de unos cuantos artículos de prensa; los partidos que se disputaban las curules no eran antagónicos, al contrario, más bien daban la impresión de partes homogéneas, separadas de un todo; traían el recuerdo de la teoría de la nebulosa.

Había discrepancia solamente en cuanto a los candidatos, pero no en los principios. Podríamos hacer una excepción en cuanto del Partido Constitucional, cuyos dirigentes, aunque un poco heterogéneos, lograron hacer una mezcla, parecida a la del agua con el aceite: no logró emulsionarse.

Las cotaciones en la Asamblea Constituyente, a favor de la Junta de Gobierno, en casi todos los asuntos, a excepción de uno, y a pesar de alguno que otro discurso de oposición, confirman nuestras afirmaciones anteriores.

Hemos querido con esto demostrar que, a la Constituyente no llegaron otros partidos políticos que les que están en el poder, y que por lo tanto no hubo lucha política y que desde luego, no se puede establecer la premisa de que las elecciones fueron tranquilas porque ya los ánimos no estaban exaltados.

Bien sabemos todos, que de los partidos derrotados en la revolución pasada, uno ha sido descalificado y no pudo presentarse a elecciones, y el otro, por renuncia de su Presidente Efectivo, quedó acéfalo.

No dudamos, ni por un momento, de que las elecciones venideras, serán absolutamente puras, pero la campaña sí será intensa, ya que se desarrollará en un ambiente de perfecta libertad.

Por eso posiblemente sea que un grupo grande de costarricenses se sienten indecisos, como el caminante al llegar a una horqueta de caminos desconocidos. No sabe qué obstáculos encontrará en uno u en otro. A dónde llegará por éste, a dónde lo llevará aquel?

Seguir con la constituyente hasta Mayo del 50, puede ser una buena solución; elegir diputados para integrar el Congreso Constitucional, tal vez sea mejor.

Pero, salta la duda: y las consecuencias de la campaña? El tiempo perdido? Las eridas en el espíritu que difícilmente se restañan? La división de la familia costarricense, ya de por sí bien profunda?

Todo ésto, nos preguntamos, no será mejor posponerlas para más adelante? Para cuando las cicatrices de las heridas pasadas comiencen a salir a flor de piel?

Creemos que es preferible meditar un poco más sobre estas cosas, con calma, con serenidad y más que todo, con la filosofía de los viejos costarricenses.

leche diarias (sin incluir a los padres o personas mayores), el precio de 0.50 c/u., igual a 1.50 y que hoy esa misma cantidad les cuesta ₡ 1.95, no podrán hacer el mismo consumo al proveedor de alimentos del hogar, sea el padre o la madre, no se les aumenta el jornal en proporción.

Desde luego, si esa familia destinaba ₡ 1.50 al día para el capítulo de leche, con esa suma comprará hoy solamente 2 botellas y 1/3. Los 2/3 de botella que quedan faltando habrá que reducirlos proporcionalmente de la dieta de los cinco ni-

ños. Y con tres botellas equivalen a 9 vasos, quiere decir que si cada uno tomaba un vaso y 4/5 al día, ahora recibirá un vaso y 2/5. Le habremos restado 2/5 de vaso de leche diaria a cada niño, igual a casi un vaso cada dos días.

Un vaso 2/5 al día para un niño cuyo alimento básico es la leche, significa la sexta parte de la ración, que según los médicos, debe tomar diariamente.

Es necesario, entonces, que el Estado venga en auxilio de este niño, sino poniendo al alcance económico de sus padres las otras 5/6 partes de leche

IN THE WARD FOR THE INVALID

The Atlantic Post learns that there are more or less fourteen incurable invalids in the incurable section of the San Juan de Dios Hospital. Their permanent disability is said to be creating a grave problem to the Social Protection Board, due principally to the fact that these imbecile patients had their bloom of life given services for many years to the Atlantic Railroad and the Costa Rica Banana Companies and now in their days of imbecility they sought refuge in the National Benevolent Institution.

It is read between the containing lines that present day contracts with companies requiring workmen will include responsibility for the care and protection of those becoming aged after their days of work in youth. In other words there would be some humanitarian provision and which would at the same time serve as a means of reducing the burden of the State.

A situation to be grappled with

We believe in a square deal for all and when it is observed to the contrary we cannot refrain from airing our views.

and prattle unbecomingly without regard to the feelings of respectable stadium guests, when such crude specimen of humanity are detected they should immediately be expelled from the stand, even if the Management is to sustain the loss of a few colonies by the way of refunding the entrance fees received.

3.—It should not be permitted under no circumstance to allow the crowd to completely invade the whole area of the catcher, batsmen and umpire from the home plate to first and third bases. The grounders on the diamond in front of the stadium

present the worst encroachment to those on the stadium; blocking entirely their view.

In this connection, we are of opinion that some drastic action is needed and suggest that one determined and stern policeman should be engaged. There should be no difficulty in keeping the diamond clear of spectators.

The playground is intended for the players and umpires. The boisterous onlookers are often times responsible for unpleasant uprisings at some of the exercises.

Dysentery and other tropical diseases attended with yellow fever were too powerful for the Asiatics and the Europeans and also characteristic of these races, bent upon egotisms; the will of adoption to tropical customs and conditions could not have been easily blended. The natives of this Republic, born and reared under the influence of the milder climate of the interior provinces, they, in coming to the labour front on the Atlantic Zone, whether it was on the farm, the railroad, the docks or any other place of work had become very easy victims to the pestilences; many arrived in Limon and having experienced for short periods the existed state of things, were unable to withstand them; the bodies of a few daring ones were moulded here while the more fortunate ones effected a hasty retreat to the interior provinces. It is to be reminded that it was not the beautiful, modern and habitable Limon of today. Health and other essential conditions were quite to the contrary.
