May Investigate the American Navy.

TO DECIDE ITS EFFICIENCY IN CASE OF WAR.

A general investigation of the United States Army by a joint committee of Congress is proposed in a resolution introduced in the House by Representative Julius Kahn of California.

The resolution provides for the appointment of a commission to consist of five members of the Senate Committee on Military Affairs and five members of the House Committee on Military Affairs "to institute and carry forward an investigation of the military establishment and its organization, proportions, strength, distribution, maintenance and administration, and generally into all other matters that may be necessary to reach conclusions as to the cause of inefficiency and extravagance, if found to exist, and to suggest remedial measures."

The five Senators on the investigating committee are to be selected by the chairman of the Senate Military Committee and the five House members by the House Military Affairs chairman.

The joint committee if empowered by the Kahn resolution to sit at any place, visit the manoeuvre mobilization camp at San Antonio and to call upon the War Department for any and all papers and documents essential to the inquiry.

The committee must report, the resolution prescribes, at the regular session of Congress beginning in next December. The sum of \$5,000 is appropriated to defray the expenses of the investigation.

Mr. Kahn explained why he introduced the resolution.

"The bills introduced by Mr. Hay, chairman of the House Committee on Military Affairs," said Mr. Kahn, "intended to save some \$5,000,000 or \$6,000,000 per annum. If such a sum can be saved without impairment of the military branch of the Government it ought to be done."

"But the more immediate cause for the introduction of this resolution to investigate the condition of the army is to determine definitely whether we have a military organization that would be an effective force in case of hostilities, and if not what remedial action ought to be taken by Congress in order to make our army an effective fighting force."

"I understand from men who are in a position to know that the recent mobilization on the Mexican frontier was rather a failure. True, the troops were promptly despatched to the places of rendezvous, but having arrived at their destination it developed that there was such a lack of organization that it required several months time to make the one division of troops that were mobilized in Texas half way effective."

"This would indicate that under our present system it is impossible to mobilize a single division of troops at war strength within any reasonable time. It clearly shows that something is radically wrong, and the sooner we find out what something is the better for the country." We expend upward of \$100,000,000 per annum on our military establishment. It ought

to be in a complete state of preparedness for any possible emergency.

"We recall the fact that when France declared war against Prussia in 1870 all that Von Moltke, the Chief of Staff of the latter Government, had to do was to issue an order and immediately the entire German army was in motion. Whether we have a small army or a large one our own ought to be equally efficient. I believe the country expects that much of her defenders."

"The investigation proposed by my resolution ought to enable us to show just wherein the weakness of our present military organization lies, so that Congress may promptly apply the remedy."

Home and Foreign News.

Mr. Charles Stewart, formerly Manager of the Costa Rica Railroad is now in Limon.

Ferguson *alias* Cee Gee is having a hard time in Puerto Barrios according to a passenger that came from there. He was black-balled everywhere.

The train from Banana River was fully an hour and a half late. This was in consequence of having to transfer a quantity of empty box cars at Banauita.

Their Majesties the King and Queen of England will visit Ireland on July 31st. A programme of their visit is printed; they will be occupied every day until the 13th when they will return to England on the "Victoria and Albert."

At a meeting of the Permanent Exhibition Committee, held at the Merchants' Exchange, Jamaica, on 29th ult., it was resolved to ask His Excellency the Governor again to send Mr. E. J. Wortley to the Toronto Exhibition, to represent Jamaica and take charge of its exhibits.

The man Edward Joseph, who shot and killed a man from St. Kitts on the 5th December last, was sentenced to 8 years at St. Lucas. The deceased and Joseph lived together and owing to a row they had on the banana dock he waylaid him and shot him in front of Bourcoy's building.

Further census returns in Limon show that there are 1,178,317 females in excess of males in Great Britain. The figures, however, would be greatly reduced if the soldiers and sailors abroad were counted. Females continue to increase faster than males as they have consistently been doing since 1821.

The latest news from Hayti is to the effect that the country is in a state of unrest and there is a good deal of talk about ousting President Simon from his position of Chief of State. The Governor of Jacmel was recently assassinated at that place. His assassination appears to have been the result of a speech he delivered. Those who heard it said it was full of threats, and in order to prevent possible trouble a few men conspired and killed him by mutilating his body.

Mr. C. W. Grant, who has been for the past twenty-seven years in the service of the Railroad Company goes on leave on Monday. He has been ill for some time and his medical adviser has ordered him to take six months change out of the Republic for the benefit of his health. Mr. W. Alvarado who is also an old employee of 14 years in the Company will act for Mr. Grant during his absence. We wish the gentleman a speedy recovery and hope that the desired rest and change will have the much needed effect.

Canada's revenue for the year ending 31st March, 1911, totalled \$117,078,408 which is said to be the greatest the Dominion has ever had, and is sixteen and a quarter million dollars ahead of the previous year. In the last fiscal year the Dominion's revenue amounted to \$72,965,391; excise, \$18,869,837; postal returns, \$9,146,953; Public Works and Railways, \$10,818,534; Miscellaneous, \$7,970,291. The expenditure on revenue account last year was \$87,778,998, an increase of eight and a quarter millions. The expenditure on capital accounts totalled \$33,606,222, a decrease of a half million.

CORONATION HONOURS.

HON. DR. J. PRINGLE A
KNIGHT OF ORDER OF
ST. MICHAEL AND ST.
GEORGE.

Limon.—The Coronation has been signalled by a free hand distribution of honours. Sir Joseph Warrley is promoted to a Baronetcy. Hon. Mr. Andrew Fisher and Sir Edward Morris are made Privy Counsellors.

Altogether twenty new baronets are created. The stage has been recognised by the Knighting of Mr. George Alexander. The Baronets and Knights include men conspicuous in Commerce and Science. Several hundred decorations have also been bestowed.

Shipping Strike.

Limon.—The strike of seamen is spreading among the dockers in the North and the coasting trade on the Clyde and a tie up is threatened. Yesterday clerks in the office of the shipowners attempted to load and unload ships in the Clyde, but they made poor substitutes for the busy dock-side labourers who have gone out. The stewards of the White Star liners "Meganion" and "Dominion" and the Allan steamer "Virginia," all at Liverpool, struck yesterday.

For the Children.

London children will long remember the Coronation fete in addition to the King's entertainment at the Crystal Palace a host of festivities to which they were invited.

All children attending the London County Council's school in the week's holiday, and a number of local authorities made arrangements for local celebrations of various kinds, at which many children were present.

Provincial cities and towns were also following the King's example. The Manchester festivities included the entertainment of 15,000 children, and it is suggested that the festival should take place in Heaton Park.

The King's committee appointed to arrange for the entertainment of 100,000 children at the Crystal Palace on June 30 made all the necessary arrangements.

Sir William Carrington has conveyed the King's wish to the committee that absolute impartiality was to be shown, so that school children of every denomination should be properly represented.

Declaration of London.

Limon.—A score of prominent admirals met under the Presidency of Admiral Lord Charles Beresford and unanimously considered the Declaration of London, the international agreement governing prizes of Naval warfare adopted at a conference of the naval powers two years ago; 104 admirals signed the petition to the Premier pleading with him not to ratify the Declaration of London.

A Remedy for Hiccough.

Hiccough is a sudden and spasmodic contraction of the diaphragm, determining a spasmodic shock to the walls of the abdominal and thoracic cavity, and is accompanied by a rough and articulated sound caused by the sudden closure and sonorous vibration of the vocal cords.

Among the numerous remedies employed against this disagreeable symptom there is one recommended by Dr. Pettit, Beaumont, which, although not really new, is little known. It has the merit of being extremely simple and is said to be remarkably efficacious.

It consists simply in swallowing as quickly possible a teaspoonful of powdered sugar without any admixture with water. The hiccough will be immediately stopped. If it comes on again, the same remedy again will be found successful.

What is the action of the powdered sugar? Probably it sets up a kind of reflex action. The sugar certainly plays no special role in this case, and it is probable that any inert powder would have the same effect.

Dr. Pettit has made use of this remedy for some years, and it has rarely failed. Accordingly he recommends recourse to it even when the cause of hiccoughs may have been the usual standard remedies.

This expired in the Spring of 1910 and he got another year off. Now his leave is extended until 1912.

Future of the W. I.

Limon.—Speaking at a dinner given to representatives of the West Indies who have arrived here for the Coronation, Mr. Asquith said that the outlook for the colonies was full of promise and none the less so by reason of the fact that the Panama Canal was approaching completion. The ultimate facts of that great enterprise were at present incalculable, but could hardly be doubted, he said. It would be in the long run favourably influence the economic progress of the West Indies.

Mexican Troops Through U. S.

Washington.—President Taft has granted permission to Mexico to transport across United States territory such portion of the Mexican forces as it may be necessary to send it into Lower California to enable the government of President de la Harro to suppress the socialist rebellion now going on there.

The action of the United States was taken at the request of the Mexican government and is in line with the steps taken by President Taft in co-operating with Mexico in the re-establishment of peace by the arrest of the four Mexican plotters at El Paso by the secret service agents of the United States.

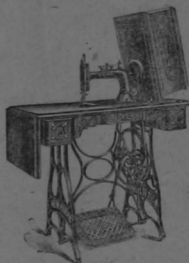

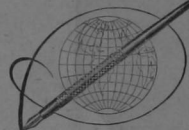
