

COST OF ARMED PEACE.

The latest computations of the cost of incessant preparedness for the "coming European conflict" are compiled by G. de Contenson and Jules Roche, the latter the editor of the "Petit Annuaire du Contribuable" (Taxpayer's Handbook). They include the military and naval expenses of the eight principal Powers of the world—England, France, Russia, Germany, Austria, Italy, Japan, and the United States. They show in the first place that whereas in the aggregate war budget of these Powers was in round numbers \$1,790,000,000 francs, or \$327,160,000, in 1901, they had only attained a total of \$384,000,000 francs, or \$383,360,000, in 1909, the latest year for which a complete set of statistics is available.

Of course in 1901 the British army expenses were altogether abnormal. The drain of the Boer wars at its greatest and the budget was approximately two and a half times that of an ordinary year. Making allowance for this, the figures show that the annual cost of armed peace in Europe had swollen in the first nine years of the century, not by 205,000,000 francs, or \$2,300,000, as appears on the face of the returns, but really by about 1,622,000,000 francs, or \$31,087,000. In practically every country the expenditures for war preparedness are still on the increase.

England reached high water mark in the matter of naval expenditures in 1904. Starting from 694,000,000 francs or \$27,760,000 francs in 1900, she reached 830,000,000 francs or \$37,200,000, in the year named. Her

to 741,000,000 francs in 1906, but by steady stages have advanced again to 822,000,000 francs in 1910.

France, starting with 372,000,000 francs in 1900, never went higher until last year, when she appropriated 876,000,000 francs for her navy; her low point was 292,000,000 in 1904; her naval appropriation has been from 300,000,000 to 335,000,000.

In the following table the massed amounts for army and navy purposes spent by each of the Powers studied are given for three sample years in millions of francs:

The authors point out that the anomalous item is the expenditure of the United States, especially as respects the army figure, given as \$1,000,000,000 in 1905 and \$1,000,000,000 in 1909. These amounts in no way represent the relative efficiency of the forces, the pay and maintenance of the officers and men being on an incomparably higher scale than in any other country in the world.

While England has kept her total expenses down amazingly, France also has been very economical. The increase in her total war figure is hardly more than 3 per cent. Germany, Russia, and the United States show enormous increases, in Germany in the neighborhood of 60 per cent. In the decade from 1900 to 1910 there was in fact an increase of 73.5 per cent. Such an increase, borne apparently without inconvenience, affords a proof of the growth of German financial resources. Of the increase about 35 per cent. was for the army, the rest going to the naval account.

Worthy of remark is the very small expenditure by which Italy, Austria-Hungary and Japan maintain their positions as important military Powers. Their budgets range between one-fourth and one-third of what the five Powers of the first magnitude lay out. It is also remarkable that Italy spends more on her army and navy combined than does Austria.

One deduction that French commentators draw is, as might be expected, that the Powers of the Triple Entente allowing for the boundless wealth of Russia and the relative poverty of Italy and Austria-Hungary, are "keeping their end up" on much easier terms than their foes of the Triple Alliance. If the outcome of the contest in peaceful armament is to depend on the depth of purses, they infer that those who have kept increase of expense within bounds will not be the ultimate losers.

An Explanation.

To the Editor of the Times.

Sir,—In view of the numberless reasons ascribed by thousands of persons, all wide of the mark—as to the cause of the absence of the Queen Mother from the Coronation of King George V, I shall be glad to publish the following, which I think will effectually set the matter at rest.

Queen Alexandra's abstention from the Abbey and the Royal processions on Coronation Day and the entry into London the day following is in strict accordance with precedent, the reason which kept her away is the same that kept Emperor William II, King Alfonso and other Royal relatives at King George's.

Strict etiquette prescribes that the King and Queen shall be the chief figures, and the presence of any other Crowned head at a Coronation is held to detract from the majesty of the monarch, and so the occupants of the Coronation chairs.

Thus the Kaiser and other near relatives of the King and Queen are represented by deputies.

After a long pause she asked him if he was good yet. "Not yet gramme" she was promptly answered. As the reply was characteristic of the wild and always blameworthy child, the Queen was not, particularly surprised, and simply said him wait till he was.

"I am good now" at length came a meekly penitent voice from under the table. "Then you can come out," answered the most regal modern Queen. And forth from under the table darted a small boy, naked as the day he was born.—P. P.

The poverty of the design and the inferiority of the engraving are criticised and the Postmaster-General will be asked in Parliament if he will consider the advisability of withdrawing the stamps and having a fresh issue designed with a portrait of the King that shall be an actual miniature likeness of His Majesty.

The s.s. "Nyocya" arrived yesterday afternoon from Manchester with mails and passengers: Mr. and Mrs. Frederick Weeks.

The late bandmaster of the Government band in Limon has just arrived here from Germany, where he has been since his absence from the republic.

It is rumored that the members of the Semi-military Display Corps have been invited to San José to hold a review during the fiestas in September.

Mr. E. B. Williams, the Representative and Business Manager of the "Daily News" Jamaica, who is now in Limon, asks us to state that his Post Box is 163, Limon, and that he can be interviewed at Imperial Hotel.

The steamships "Nyocya" and "Greenbrier" is timed to leave here to-day. The first named vessel will go to Manchester via Jamaica with a cargo of bananas amounting to 52,000 stems and the latter to New Orleans with 35,000 stems.

A cricket match was started yesterday at the Plaza del Toro between a team captained by Mr. Horton and another from the dock. Mr. Horton won the toss and decided to go to the wicket. When two wickets fell the total stood at 49—Cox 25, Dulaney 15, Horton 4, Nation 3 and 2 byes. At this stage the game was stopped as the men had to work on the "Nyocya" that had just arrived in port.

It is alleged that a systematic robbery has been going on for some time in the Ferro Corril yard and no detection could be made. It is reported that a quantity of valuable goods were missed from time to time from the lock-up cars that was allowed to remain over night in the yard. Leather to the value of not less than \$1,000, a quantity of whisky, tobacco and many other articles have recently been taken from the cars. A man is now held on suspicion in connection with the matter.

Work on the Maine

Havana, June 22.—The pumping out of the water inside the cofferdam about the wreck of the battleship "Maine" has been suspended while other work is carried on. Members of the board of engineers say that it was not their intention to pump out all of the water at once and that they do not expect to encounter any difficulties.

As the water is pumped out from time to time they are balancing and trimming the cylinders by dumping in stone.

The engineers declare that there has been no perceptible motion in the cofferdam. It is evident, however, that the work will be long drawn out.

It is probable that the water will not all be pumped out and the mud cleared away within the next two months.

London.—Tremendous investments in the rubber industry made by Englishmen in the last two years has led to the organization of an International Rubber and Allied Trades' Exhibition, which is open in Agricultural hall and will continue to June 28. The show is the first important one of its kind ever held and is attracting wide attention.

Cuba Going Ahead.

A Havana despatch says: Cuba's newest industry now under construction is a 200,000,000 soap, candle and wax factory to be owned and operated by the Ministerio de Cultura y Juventud, Costa Rica.

and glycerine factory in the Caba suburb of Havana on the Havana Central tracks at Bufo station. The Gal Bulle Soap Works of Vedado are the builders.

It will be a complete modern factory of brick and steel, the main building being 60 x 3 metres, provided with its own supply and fire protection, double the size of the Vedado plant.

A well 60 feet deep will keep two tanks holding 20,000 gallons of water each constantly filled in case of fire.

Chinese Cruiser to Visit New York.

Pekin.—Orders have been issued to the cruiser Hsich, Admiral Chang commanding which is now in English waters to participate in the naval review, to proceed to New York after the coronation.

This will be the first visit of a Chinese cruiser to the eastern coast of America. The Hsich's tons will include friendly visits to Cuba and Mexico.

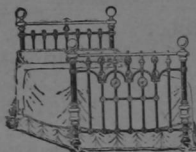
