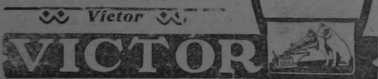

## THE TIMES Port Limon, Costa Rica (G. A.) FUTURE OF NICARAGUA.

It is not improbable that one of the developments of the future may be a union of the five republics of Central America. Many of the leading statesmen of each of these small countries realize that such a course would inure greatly to the benefit of all parties concerned, and that nothing but conflicting personal ambitions stand in the way of the fulfillment of such a union. They admit that the experiment was tried at one time and failed after just a few months, but they assert that Central America has progressed in political wisdom since the downfall of the confederation three-quarters of a century ago.

With such a confederation, maintaining a system of educating the masses in the pursuits of agriculture and other wealth-creating industries, it is certain that great good to the people at large would result. Add to this the great growth of commerce which the completion of the Panama Canal will bring to the republic south of Mexico, and the result is a new factor in the commerce of the world and in its politics.

Once the United States takes steps to guarantee peace in Nicaragua and to make investments secure, it is certain that a large immigration will be attracted to the country. Probably thousands of Americans will go there to take advantage of the exceptional opportunities which come to pioneers in a country in the transitory stage between perpetual war and permanent peace. With lands so fertile as to rival such districts as the Imperial Valley of California, with a ready market for its products, with abundant opportunities for intelligent investments, Nicaragua, on a peace footing, would possess a very strong appeal to the pioneer of many lands. Certainly no altruism could confer a greater boon upon any struggling republic than a guarantee of peace would confer upon Nicaragua. Whether the benefits to be derived by the United States from such a development in Nicaragua would be great enough to justify the assumption of the responsibilities proposed by the State Department is a question upon which those entitled to speak with authority differ widely. But whether such a course would be beneficial to Nicaraguans admits of no difference of opinion, as is shown by the alacrity with which they have agreed to the proposal.

There are those who believe that the day will arrive when at least a small interoceanic canal will be constructed across Nicaragua utilizing the San Juan river and Lake Nicaragua as a part of the waterway. Such an enterprise would certainly prove a benefit to the people of Nicaragua, giving a large portion of the western part of the interior direct water connections with the Atlantic ocean. While it is scarcely probable that the generation now living will see such a canal constructed, it is possible that the rapids in the San Juan river which now obstruct navigation and the bars at the mouth of the

river at Greytown will be cleared out, so it will be possible for the people of Leon, Managua, and Granada, each less than twenty-five miles from the Pacific coast, to send their products to the Atlantic by water. It is a most interesting fact that although the Nicaragua canal seems to be a defect project, the shares of stock of the company which undertook to build it still have a market value, some of them changing hands in France only a few months ago.

Whatever the disposition of the pending treaty with Nicaragua and whatever the future of that country, it is inevitable that the United States must ever maintain a deep interest in the welfare of this country and its sister republic. Lying between the United States and the great canal at Panama, the countries of Central America possess the power to impose irritating if not harmful conditions upon commerce. Closely allied with the United States and in sympathy with its purposes towards them and towards the other countries which must use the Panama Canal, the republics of Central America will possess a considerable influence over the affairs of Panama, especially in case the United States became involved in a war with any European power. That the countries of Central America are deeply interested in the Monroe doctrine goes without saying, but they are sometimes forgetful of the many benefits that have been conferred upon them by the insistence of the United States in maintaining that international principle.

## SHOOTING FRACAS.

### Henry Joseph Shot by his Friend at Moin.

FIFTY CENTS THE CAUSE.

Henry Joseph now lies in the United Fruit Company's hospital suffering from a wound on one of his legs, the result of a gun shot he received on Thursday afternoon at Moin.

The wounded man is a native of Antigua and came to the republic with the batch of men that arrived here from St. Kitts for the United Fruit Company; but like some of the others Joseph did not like the banana work and sought other employment. After rambling about for some time, doing a job here and there he came upon a man named Hyppolyte, a native of Colon, but who is now a resident at Moin. The friendship of the two men became more cemented until they engaged themselves in a fishing concern, when matters went smoothly with them.

Joseph thought he would try his "luck" by purchasing a piece lottery ticket, and with the view he asked Hyppolyte to purchase a piece for him, giving him a dollar, with the hope of receiving 50 cents change. The piece of ticket was bought and handed to him, but without the change. On Thursday afternoon, the day of the occurrence Joseph asked Hyppolyte for the 50 cents when he was calmly told that he (Joseph) owed him fifty cents and he intended to keep it. A passage at arms then ensued which resulted in the calling of a police corporal to quell the rowdiness.

When the first encounter was finished Hyppolyte went out and called a police to put Henry Joseph in charge for assaulting him, and when they got to the room where Henry Joseph lived Hyppolyte who carried a fire arm took it out and attempted to enter the room with it in a pointing position; to protect himself he took up a stick and went after him beating him to the ground. It is alleged that the policeman who was looking on all the time drew his machete and aimed a blow at Joseph while he had the other man on the ground, but missing his aim he caught Hyppolyte on the shoulder, inflicting a severe wound.

When the wounded man was released and gained *terra firma* he felt for his gun and putting confidence in it more than his strength he aimed at his adversary and shot him in the back of his legs below the knee.

The wounded man although suffering from the effects of the gun shot procured a mule and rode to Limon and reported himself to Dr. Cespedes who examined the wound and sent him on to the hospital where he now lies with the ball still in his leg.

## Arrival of the Sarnia.

The s.s. "Sarnia" arrived here early yesterday morning from New York via Jamaica, but owing to the boisterous sea the vessel was not docked before late in the afternoon. The following is her passenger list: From New York: E. D. Lopez, From Jamaica: Miss Anna Taylor, Francisco Long and D. Watson and 100 deckers.

## Barefaced Robbery.

A barefaced robbery was committed on the dock yesterday afternoon. It appeared that a woman who was a passenger on the "Sarnia" from Jamaica brought two parcels with her that contained two dozen coronation caps, three terrai hats, three ladies hats, all to the value of \$25. The woman left the goods to go ashore to raise funds to pay duty on them but to her surprise on her return the Custom House Officer told her that a man named William Gayle paid duty on them and carried them off.

## Falling of a Large Stone at Lomas.

While a train was passing Las Lomas, 454 miles, a large stone fell from the mountain and knocked the caboose off the rails. A wrecking train was dispatched on Thursday night to clear the lines but owing to a hitch with the men that they carried they never got to the spot before Friday morning. However the wreck was cleared in time to allow the up-going passenger train to pass.

## Franco-American Treaty.

Washington.—France is practically ready to sign a general arbitration treaty with the United States similar to the one with Great Britain, it was announced. Ambassador Juesstrand's visit to Paris, where he now is on leave, is declared to have brought about this rapid determination of the French Foreign Office to conclude such a treaty with the United States.

## Colombian Minister Dead.

Caracas, Venezuela.—Dr. Carlos Arturo Torres, Colombian minister for Venezuela, died of appendicitis. His death is a serious setback to the culmination of the Venezuela-Colombian boundary treaty which was on the point of being signed after years of negotiation.

## Carnegie Peace Foundation.

PLAN TO CULTIVATE RELATIONS BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND JAPAN.

New York.—The custodians of the \$10,000,000 Carnegie peace foundation announced a campaign of popular education to establish friendlier relations between the United States and Japan. The division of leisure and education has arranged an exchange to "give to each people better knowledge of the other and to help build up a public opinion in both countries that will resist all attempts to arouse antagonism."

Under the plan distinguished Japanese will lecture at the leading American universities and American educators will give similar lectures in Japan. The committee says that the Japanese Government has heartily approved the undertaking.

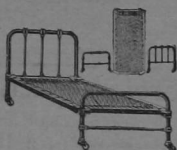
