El caserío es viejo y por su proximidad al río, los habitantes sufren frecuentemente de calenturas; don Alfonso empezó por buscar y encontrar agua potable buena y lo consiguió por medio de un artesano cuya máquina costó cien mil pesetas; está levantando casas, dibujadas y planeadas allí, para los pobres; una vez terminadas éstas, deruirá los viejos edificios, convirtiendo aquellos insanos terrenos en alamedas y Jardines; construirá ochenta ó cien chalets para familias acomodadas, canalizará el río para aprovechar sus aguas en el riego y utilizar industrialmente sus fuerzas motrices en una palabrá hará una población nueva, confortable, sana y laboriosa de lo que era un foco de paludismo.

Las casas para obreros planeadas por S. M. están divididas verticalmente para alojar dos familias, y cada una de ellas dispuesta de dos pisos con habitaciones amplias, entrada y escalera distinta y un jardín delante de cuatro metros de anchura.

Port Limon, Costa Rica (G. A.)

Importation of Bananas into England.

Southampton, which has been selected as the English port of call for the steamers of the new Direct Line Service from Jamaica which has been inaugurated by the United Fruit Company, commercially ranks high among the modern parts of the United Kingdom; historically considered she is second only to London, while geographically there exists no place which affords more easy entrance for ships, either by day or night, or which provides a safer anchorage in rough weather. The town has figured conspicuously in the history of England from Norman times, when her proximity to the ancient capital, Winchester, made Southampton not only a desirable resort of "fisher men and merchants," but the gateway to our Continental possessions, and the port of call, perhaps more than any other, into the foreign trade of the Empire Southampton, apart from her situation in a handlocked and spacious bay and her possession of the unusual advantages of double high waters, is the centre of a district varied in character and rich in historic memories. The ancient city of Winchester celebrated in 1901 the tenth centenary of her greatest historical personage, and her Cathedral, churches, hospital, and old city hall are replete with archaeological interest. Portsmouth near by is full of historical associations, and has shared with Southampton the honour of being a port whence innumerable naval and military heroes have sailed to fight their country's battles.

PRESENCE OF KINGS.

Nearly all the Kings of England, certainly from the time of Henry I, have visited Southampton, many of them having made long sojourns there, and the port, we are told, was frequently "alive with the transit of great folk." Henry V, in the prosecution of his claims to the crown of France, made this port one of his chief places of rendezvous, and ships were built at Southampton to his order of "a larger construction than had hitherto (about 1415) been attempted." Here he built the "Holy Ghost" and "Grace Dieu," each ship costing 2500. These were described as "great shippes" for those days, and they left the harbour of Southampton amid the "inspiring music of trumpets and clarions, and with minstrel song." The neighbouring town of Portsmouth has now become the naval and Southampton the commercial port, the Government policy for some time having been to discourage the development of Portsmouth as a mercantile port. Last month the largest merchant ship in the world, the White Star steamer "Olympic" (45,000 tons), sailed on her maiden voyage to the United States. Less than three centuries ago the "Mayflower" and the "Speedwell" left the town quay of Southampton with the "Pilgrim Fathers," the "Speedwell" was abandoned at Plymouth, and the 102 co-religionists were crowded into the "Mayflower" of 160 tons, and after a passage of 65 days reached Cape Cod Bay.

THE GROWTH OF THE PORT.

The history of the Port of Southampton is interwoven not only with the history of England, but with the history of British foreign trade, and in the earlier days with the history of British shipbuilding. It is well known that the Southampton district still occupies an important place in the shipbuilding industry. From the Woolston Yard there have been launched notable examples of the modern yacht, of the motor-boat, and highspeed British torpedo-boat destroyers, one of which on her trials set up new records over a measured mile. In this case the loss of the Thames has been a gain to Southampton. From the boat slips of Cowes, the near neighbour of Southampton, there have also been launched some equally notable productions in the destroyer class. It was inevitable with the growth of her shipping trade that Southampton should have established upon her quays a ship repair works capable of handling the largest steamers requiring the port, and in a shipbuilding yard. In a large dry dock, now in process of enlargement, one of the great firms has put down a first-class ship repairing plant.

The modern growth of the port dates from the beginning of the last century as the body of Commissioners now known as the Harbour Board have been in existence over a hundred years. The construction of docks at Southampton had been in contemplation before this, but no practical steps seem to have been taken until 1836, when the "Southampton Dock Company" was organized with sufficient capital to make and maintain docks. About 200 acres of mud-land were purchased from the Corporation, and two years later work actively began. Meantime the London and Southampton Railway had been projected, and in May, 1838, a month after the laying of the first stone of the docks, the line was opened from Nine Elms to Woking. From these small beginnings may be traced the progress of one of the great British railway systems, the London and South-Western, and the spacious and magnificently equipped Southampton Dock.

Every working day of the year a thousand passengers leave Southampton or arrive thither, coming and going with their luggage in the regular course of each day's work.

A New Colony for England.

England is likely to have a new region for colonization unless the Germans should take possession of the field first. The region is the locality between Babylon and Bagdad where the Garden of Eden is believed to have been situated. Sir William Wilcocks, who has been surveying in Mesopotamia three years in the interest of the Turkish Government, has expressed the conviction that it was in this locality that Adam and Eve lived, and that though now an arid desert the region was once fertile. The Turkish Government has determined to do for this district between the Tigris and Euphrates what the Anglo-Egyptian Government has done for

the country of the lower Nile. Sir John Jackson is to perform feats on the Euphrates by building barrages, so as to suffice the arid regions, with the fertilizing waters of the river.

Already about 3,000 are engaged on the preliminary work, laying out the camp &c. Then the spade will be put in at Hinda, the Assuan of the Euphrates, but that will be only one of the three great barrages on this ancient river and the Tigris. At first a district of 600,000 acres will be irrigated at a cost of 87,500,000, after which the value of the land, now practically nil, will be at least 500,000,000. When entirely irrigated Sir William Wilcocks estimates that this resuscitated Garden of Eden will have acquired a value of 1,900,000,000.

Arrival of s. s. "Cartago."

The s. s. "Cartago" arrived yesterday morning from New Orleans via Puerto Barrios with mails and passengers.

Elbot Williams was frustrated with the handling of the good ship and successfully brought his charge alongside the pier and the officers of the ship had several hawsers made fast to the pier but the ground swells were severe, the vessel surged heavily against the pier and three times broke her hawser. After several attempts to steady her proved futile it was decided to take her out to sea which was accordingly done. She brought several passengers who were much disappointed in not having the opportunity of getting ashore. The mails were also carried out with the passengers. Shipping News.

The "Cartago" brought a cargo of general merchandise amounting to 327 tons.

The s. s. "Cartago" will sail today for Colon at 5 p.m. to connect with steamer leaving for Kingston, Jamaica and Santa Marta.

It was a difficult task to supply the s. s. "Binfield" with her bananas yesterday, the ground swells beat her severely; two anchors had to be requisitioned to steady her a bit.

The coal ship that had been unloading her cargo of coal for the last few days had to suspend operations yesterday and pulled out a few yards from the pier in consequence of the angry sea.

Mails for Colon will be closed today at the Post Office as follows: Ordinary letters at 3 p.m., and registered letters at 2 p.m.

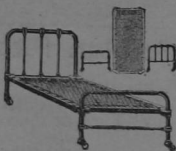

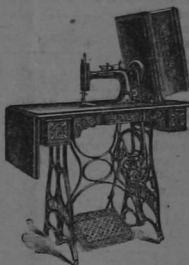

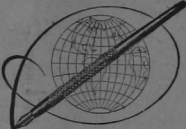
