## THE TIMES Port Limon, Costa Rica (G. A.) CONCERNING SEA POWER.

The great coronation naval review at Spithead has started afresh the great topic of sea power which has been a burning issue for the leading nations for years past. Just when the negotiation of arbitration treaties and the talk of universal peace had about prepared the minds of many people to expect some abatement of the craze for naval armaments and had almost convinced others that there was real logic in so-called sea power, here comes along the greatest exhibition of overwhelming naval force and exposition of sea power which the world has ever seen.

When Great Britain startled the world with the dreadnought, less than six years ago, revolutionizing naval architecture, other naval powers were given a chance to rival her, as all constructions of dreadnought type became virtually obsolete, and England had to build up her navy to supremacy again virtually de novo. The coronation review, however, showed that despite carping and tumorous critics she has made good use of the past six years, and has now in commission as large as a preponderance of dreadnoughts over other powers as she had of ordinary battleships before the dreadnought period.

Much has been written recently of the prepossibility of forts as against the fire of ships, and it must be confessed that the practical experience of recent wars has justified this opinion. But the mere protection of ports by fortifications in no sense betitles sea power which implies the control of the open sea, the protection of commerce and the ability to protect the overseas movement of troops and munitions. It was sea power, and that alone, which gave to the United States the victory over Spain, and it was aggressive sea power, and the transport troops and supplies over sea practically unopposed, that enabled Japan to defeat Russia. Had Russia been able to effectually control the sea, Japan would never have won her victories.

The superiority of the fortification in its own sphere is therefore no argument against sea power. A coast line cannot be protected by forts alone, as fortifications can be flanked. Forts, moreover, will not keep the wheels of commerce in motion, or assist in any way in aggressive movements against an enemy, since they are defenses pure and simple. It is the necessity for the maintenance of absolute control of the sea that justifies England's great navy, just as it is our immense coastline and the protection of our growing commerce justifies the very respectable navy this country possesses.

## The Isle of Unrest.

Renewed reports of disturbance in Cuba both little good for the title of republic's future. "The Isle of Unrest" will come to be an appropriate name for the Pearl of the Antilles if its people persist in referring their political differences to the sword. Cuba has been free from Spain twelve and a half years, and has been self-

governing only about half of the time. Palma began his Presidency May 29, 1902, and ended it when the United States intervened to stay the insurrection against him in September, 1906. Gomez, the second President, was installed in office Jan. 28, 1909, on the withdrawal of Provisional Governor Magoon, so that he has held his position about two and a half years. With another election barely a year away it would seem that the restless opponents of his policies could abide the passing of the brief period intervening and then determine their issues with him by constitutional methods, however grievous their wrongs may seem to them. But ability to endure does not appear to be part of the Cuban character, and without it in a people self-government is a mere dream.

Probably the success of Mexico's insurrection is being reflected in Cuba. There is no corresponding tenure of prolonged power on the part of the Chief Executive, but when the bug of dissatisfaction bites pretax for insurrection protests against oppression are easily fanned. No doubt the opponents of Gomez who have taken the field in the western part of the island look upon themselves as able patriots devoted to the righting of their country's wrongs, but the wrongs that can be inflicted during one brief term of office cannot be grave enough to warrant an appeal to arms. Cuba is still on trial before the world and its trial is entirely fair. If it convicts itself of incapacity for self-rule one more and compels another intervention it cannot complain against its fate hereafter should independence be finally taken away from it.

## The Radium.

The supply of radium to scientific investigators throughout Germany is now facilitated by a proceeding of the Berlin Academy of Science. The academy has acquired by purchase the preparation of radium discovered recently by Dr. Otto Hahn of the chemical department of Berlin University, consisting of a white salt which emits rays of like effect with that of pure radium.

The salt is a bromide of mesothorium, and its working was exhibited before the Kaiser when the new Kaiser Wilhelm Institute was founded in the spring. It is found that a amount of the preparation corresponding to about ten grains of radium can be obtained annually. The cost to the academy is \$2,600 for 100 milligrams. The preparation is hired in doses of small quantity for \$2.50 the half year.

## Hygienic Australia

HEALTH CONDITIONS  
THERE SAID TO BE THE  
BEST IN THE WORLD.

Health conditions in Australia are better than in any other country of the globe. If the low death rate of 10.55 a thousand a year may be accepted as an index, says the "Medical Record."  
The death rate from tuberculosis has steadily been declining during the last twenty-five years and now is less than 9 per cent. of the total deaths, which is a lower percentage than any published by any other country

which complies its statistics in an equally accurate manner.

In New South Wales the notification of cases of pulmonary and throat tuberculosis has been compulsory for over ten years. The walls and ceilings of houses in which cases occur are sprayed with a solution of formalin and the floors are washed with a solution of corrosive sublimate.

The effectiveness of the educational campaign is shown by the fact that open air sleeping is more general than in any other country. There is scarcely a dwelling house constructed nowadays in Australia, even a laborer's cottage, which is not provided with a suitable verandah for outdoor sleeping. There is very little expropriating on the sidewalks or other public places.

Ordinances to prevent the contamination of milk and other foodstuffs are well observed. In shops where fresh milk is offered for sale it is customary to find sheets of water running over the front windows and walls for the purpose of catching dust. All large cities, like Sydney, Melbourne, Adelaide and others, have tuberculosis sanatoria and also a large number of beds for chronic cases. The Greenvale Sanatorium, near Melbourne, will compare favorably with similar institutions in Europe and America.

Gratifying progress has been made in isolating chronic and more particularly open cases of tuberculosis. In New South Wales, Victoria and South Australia it is estimated that at least 50 per cent. of these cases have been placed in hospitals and a good proportion of the remainder under supervision. The health officials believe that only a few years will elapse before every case of pulmonary and throat tuberculosis will be under such control as to reduce the danger of transmitting the infection to a minimum.

## What is Guarro and What is Garri?

Well to inform our readers according to the doctors of Limon that there are many fighters who have been worn bitten the past two weeks, and have been compelled to keep bed. "This stuff is a mixture said by "John Chinaman," composed of alcohol and other ingredients for 10 cents per glass.

Guarri is an animal that bears a close relationship to the swine, and has its nature to a great extent, while guarro is a mixture of foul stuff that a certain class of people in this republic is addicted to swallowing in large quantities irrespective of the results they know will follow as a consequence.

It is very advisable for some of the young men of this town to desist from imbibing in this pernicious beverage that does no good to the system, only serve to enrich the coffers of the grog for nothing Chinamen and a lasting evil to themselves.

If one were to make inquiries as to the cause of every crime they would be convinced that it was through the influence of this overbearing spirit. We cannot in strong enough language protest against the lawless habit of gulping this dirty stuff—guarro, *Smoke "La Nacional" cigarettes. The best, the cheapest in the country.*

## Shipping News.

The "Harry T. Ings" is looked for to-day from Mobile in ballast.

The s.s. "Origen" came into port yesterday afternoon from New Orleans. She came in ballast.

The s.s. "Maunistee" from Manchester, arrived here yesterday afternoon. She brought passengers and mails.

The s.s. "Raitua" is expected to arrive here to-day from New Orleans. She brings passengers and mails.

The s.s. "Maunistee" will leave here this evening for Manchester with a cargo of bananas to the extent of 52,000.

## War Game in Germany.

Berlin.—Practically 1,000,000 men have been called out to take part in the field maneuvers of the German army this summer. In addition to the regular army strength of 622,000, over 355,000 reservists have been called to their colours, making a total effective strength for the Emperor's land forces of 977,000. Adding to these the men serving with the fleet, an armed force of more than a million, will be engaged in the gigantic war game.

## Serious Clash in Lima City.

Lima, Peru.—The opening of the preliminary sessions of the Chamber of Deputies was marred by a demonstration in which two persons were killed and several wounded.

Dr. Mosquedá, the President of the Chamber presided. The Government failed to keep order, but several secret police were on hand to quell the rioting and the wounding of several deputies. None of the deputies were injured but Dr. Mosquedá's hat was smashed by a stone.

## Pope's Encyclical.

Rome.—The Pope in view of the increased cost of living, has issued an encyclical on the faith, with a view to helping the working and salaried classes. The Pope has abolished the obligation to hear mass on the days of St. Joseph and St. John the Baptist and Corpus Domini, which henceforth will be solemnized on the nearest Sunday. Catholics must continue to attend mass on San Jago, Christmas, New Year, Twelfth Day, Feast of the Conception and St. Peter and St. Paul. If any such feast fall on a least day the Pope will dispense Catholics from fasting.

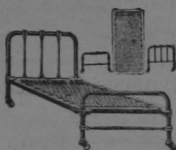

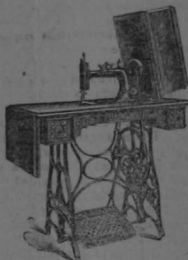
