THE TIMES Port Limon, Costa Rica (G. A.) **A CHANGE IN STEAMERS.**

In view of the strenuous efforts made to extend the use of the various types of steam turbines, which have been introduced since the Parsons type was first applied to ship-propulsion, the following summary of the present position may be of interest.

The Imperial Japanese Navy some time ago adopted the Curtis type of turbine for two large armoured vessels, the Aki battleship and the large cruiser Ikuhi. Recently the Minister of Marine has taken a licence for manufacturing Parsons turbines in all the Government dockyards, and that type is to be used in the large armoured cruiser building at Barrow and in sister ships to be built in Japan. These vessels, it is understood, will be similar to the Lion of the Royal Navy, with engines developing about 70,000 horse power on four shafts.

The German Admiralty has naturally given all possible encouragement to German turbines, having adopted various types in the smaller cruisers and torpedo vessels. But in this case also a licence has been taken for the manufacturing of Parsons's turbines in the Imperial dockyards. The Parsons type has been adopted also for the great armoured cruisers of which the Von der Tann was the first example; all the latest battleships are to be fitted with Parsons turbines, and six out of the last 12 destroyers ordered are to have that type. The Hamburg-American Atlantic steamship Imperator, now being built by the Vulkan Company, will be fitted with Parsons turbines, and will be a second sister recently ordered from Messrs. Blohm and Voss, who built the Von der Tann. These two vessels are to exceed the Olympic and Titanic in size and consequently the decision is most notable. Probably the good results obtained with the Parsons turbine in the Lusitania and Mauritania have had much to do with its adoption in their German competitors. The latest French Transatlantic steamer La France also has Parsons turbines capable of developing about 40,000 horse power. France adopted the Parsons turbine for the six battleships of the Danton class, and the trials recently made have given results surpassing the guarantee in both speed and economy. In the two latest battleships recently ordered the same type of turbine has been used. For Russia the four latest battleships, for Italy three battleships, for Turkey two battleships, and for Austria three out of four Dreadnoughts included in the new programme are all to have the Parsons type. That type of turbine has also been chosen for 12 Austrian destroyers, for two Italian cruisers and two torpedo vessels, for 13 Spanish destroyers and torpedo boats, for two Danish torpedo boats, and for a Swedish cruiser. A large number of engineering firms in Continental countries are now licensees and manufacturers of Parsons turbines.

The s.s. "Zent," one of the United Fruit Company Line of steamers, is looked for here to-day from Manchester with passengers and mail. She will leave the next day for the same port she left.

Lord Kitchener to Wed.

London.—Military and society circles of this city were given a shock when it was announced that Lord Kitchener, who has always been regarded as a woman later, is to take a wife.

The announcement was made through the "Indian Daily Telegraph" of Lucknow, copies of which have just arrived.

It says that the Field-Marshal is engaged to Leonora Milford, youngest daughter of Lionel Douglass Hearsay of Kheri, Oudh, India. The Field-Marshal is said to be several years older than his prospective bride.

OVERWHELMING DEFEAT.

Manager of Hotel Beaten at Sight.

Bawled and Moeed Like a Bull While Receiving Punishment.

On Round Enough.

It is becoming quite a fashionable and apparently pleasant thing for parties so engaged to be mixing up with each other, or otherwise battering and wounding one another; when not wounding leaving the other's eye like a full grown corn, only to be nursed and doctored up before the former focus could be got.

It was only last week an ex-hotel keeper and a landlord were at logger's head in a gentleman's office not far from the Hamburg-American Line of steamers office, and despite the repeated efforts to calm the two principals it ended in a bloody struggle outside the office, the ex-hotel keeper receiving a terrible wound in the head. As is to be expected the matter was settled in the law courts, the landlord paying £10 and the other £5.

The foregoing was only a preliminary of what happened yesterday at Hotel Imperial, and which terminated seriously for the manager of the hotel, he having been whipped at sight by one that we believe is on equal terms in weight.

From what we gather the matter appears thus: An American gentleman who is said to be employed in the office of one of the largest companies operating in Limon was boarded by the Manager of Hotel Imperial and when settling his bill a misunderstanding arose between the two men, which led to sharp and unpleasant words. However the late guest and prize-man left the hotel and apparently went over to the United Fruit Company's Bank where he got change and returned to the hotel. A bystander heard the manager exclaimed: "I am going to expose you to the Company," while the other said, "I am overcharged."

The Yankee's ire was now at its height and characteristic of the Stars and Stripes he went for the German man giving him several body punches. When content with that he lifted him up bodily and placed him on the floor (just as the banana man handle the bunches on the dock) pounding him properly. The attack was then changed to something like football, he seemed to have educated feet which were used freely. The man yelled and moed pitifully for help, when several parties went to his rescue just in time to take him from the jaws of death. When the men were separated the manager seemed to be physically weak and could hardly open one of his eyes which was swollen to a great extent.

A large crowd assembled in front of the building during the encounter which had to be cleared by policemen who came on the spot when all was over.

Travels Under False Colours.

F. N. Mighty, who made himself so prominent in Limon through the now defunct Tradesmen and Artisan's Union, sailed for Jamaica on Monday afternoon last on the "Siberia" under an alias. The man presented a passport at the ticket office that he got from the Government, marked Adrian Mighty. We know not why this man chose an alias neither are we particular to know, but we are in receipt of this fact that he appeared to be an undesirable character, as he was expelled from Loyal Plaines Lodge, Independent United Order of Mechanics for a period of 25 years for defalcation, he being Secretary for the Lodge then. It is also alleged that he sold his "slack" at Banana River and was accompanied by his wife and child. It is hinted that he was reluctant in going back to Jamaica, which, perhaps, accounts for the alias.

Skeletons Found on the Maine.

Havana.—Four skeletons were found underneath the wreckage above the engine room of the "Maine." Apparently they were thrown up from the forecastle.

Several of the bodies have been burned, indicating that they came from forward where the fires were. They were placed in individual coffins on board the "Leoidas."

Powerful Gun.

Washington.—A gun that will carry its projectile clear out of sight is the type that is to be placed in the turrets of the new battleships of the "New York" type.

One of these guns has been made at the Washington factory, and a dozen others are to follow as rapidly as the great lathes can turn them out.

The gun has been tried out at the proving grounds and has shown that it is without doubt the most powerful naval weapon in the world. With a muzzle velocity of 2,400 feet a second, the shell will have a range of about 14 or 15 miles; consequently it will land far beyond the horizon at extreme elevation.

It might hit a ship that the gunners could not see; a friend or an enemy, perhaps.

The ordnance officers will be unusually careful when ships mounting these great guns go out for target practice.

Late Arrival of the Train.

The passenger train arrived in Limon about half past eight on Monday night. She was detained at Las Masas, in consequence of a slide there.

A New Battleship Record.

DELAWARE WENT TO ENGLAND AND RETURNED ON ORIGINAL COAL SUPPLY.

Washington.—Naval authorities, pointed out with pride to the cruise of the battleship Delaware from the United States to England and return on her original supply of fuel and with a sufficient amount left to continue her trip from Boston to Gantamano. The performance is regarded by naval officials as a remarkable engineering feat and demonstrates the large radius and efficient modern war vessels. This performance is regarded as even more important than that of the same ship which after completing a cruise from Valparaiso, Chili, to Boston last winter, made a full round and eight days' run from Boston to more than contract speed of twenty-one knots. Credit for these successful trips is given to Captain Charles A. Gove and the engineer officers of the ship, as well as to the fact that she is equipped with reciprocating engines.

The latest performance was made on the occasion of the Delaware to England to represent the American navy at the Coronation. The ship left New York June 4 with 2,794 tons of coal and 282 tons fuel oil. She arrived at Tor Bay, England, June 16, and at Spithead June 19. She left Spithead June 28 and arrived at Boston July 9. During her stay abroad the Delaware took no fuel, engineering supplies or stores of any kind except fresh water. On reaching Boston she had remaining 60 tons coal and eight tons of fuel oil. The averaging speed for total trip was 13.85 knots. It will be seen that the Delaware after a period of one month and five days, during which time she crossed the Atlantic twice, had sufficient fuel remaining to steam about 1,500 miles. The Department knows of no case in which this performance has been equalled.

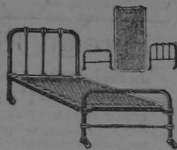

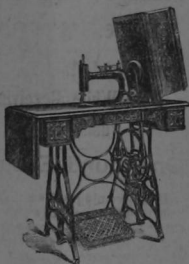
