INAUDITO

Nos cuentan que en la Sesión Municipal de anteañoche, don Ismael Alvarado, presentó una solicitud para que la Municipalidad se obligara por contrato a mantenerle en su puesto durante dos años más, con el mismo sueldo que hoy goza.

No es esta la pretensión del señor Alvarado; todo hijo de vecino tiene la natural tendencia a conservar el bido de que goza y don Ismael ha obrado en este caso muy humanamente.

Lo extraño, lo inaudito es que la Municipalidad nos aseguran que accedió a la pretensión.

Y ahora bien, lo cómico del caso, es que a renglón seguido se leyó un informe del mismo señor Administrador en que se cuenta de un negocio que dice que las recaudaciones en el Mercado han disminuido, sin que se pueda encontrar la razón.

Todos los tramos están ocupados; el impuesto actual es más alto que ogaño, se piensa en ensanchar el Mercado porque se le considera insuficiente y las rentas mermando.

No es un contrato el que procede hacer, sino una información para poner en claro ese enigma.

Si el señor Alvarado hubiese podido presentar un cuadro demostrando que durante su Administración los ingresos habían aumentado considerablemente, si hubiese probado que ese aumento se debía única y exclusivamente a su celo y dotes de Administrador, si hubiese llevado a la Municipalidad el consentimiento de que retirándose él, los ingresos disminuirían, su petición hubiese sido siempre irregular, pero hubiera tenido alguna lógica.

Como nada de eso ocurre no hay otra lógica que la del absurdo, por parte del peticionario, la ausencia de sentido moral por parte de la Corporación.

A un empleado que da cuenta de en sus manos, por inexcusable manera, merman las rentas que le están confiadas, se le premia con una garantía de inamovilidad en su puesto; los demás empleados municipales no tienen más que seguir el ejemplo; el Gobernador Municipal, el Jefe de Rastro, el Guardalacón, todos deben solicitar contratos, que la Municipalidad no tiene por que negarles.

A la inamovilidad judicial que los países adelantados consideran como una victoria y una garantía contra imposibles invasiones del Poder Ejecutivo en el sagrado campo de la Justicia, el municipio de Limón, que vino a limón de haber agregado, el primero, la inamovilidad municipal.

Es natural que el acuerdo de ser una idealidad amable; el señor Gobernador, que en su corta interinidad ha sabido guardarse la buena voluntad de este pueblo por la rectitud de su carácter y proceder, que vino a Limón y desligado de todo compromiso político y de todo amistad íntima, vetará el acuerdo de la Municipalidad que vendría a establecer en el país un precedente funesto y en su día, el señor Gobernador merecerá la aprobación del Ejeccutivo, como desde luego puede contar con la aprobación del vecindario.

No queremos nosotros afirmar que el señor Ismael Alvarado de nada, «que desear» como funcionario municipal; quizás sea muy bueno, pero continuara siendo el día en que está seguro de que no se le puede remover de su puesto.

Desde luego tenemos un hecho concreto; una afirmación de rentas inexcusable, precisamente en momentos en que el Mercado, por acuerdo hecho con los carniceros respecto al precio de venta de la carne debería producir más.

En que consiste la anomalía es lo que precisa averiguar, y después, si se comprueba que la gestión del señor Administrador es correcta, que continúa en su puesto un año, diez veinte, todo el tiempo que siga administrando a satisfacción de sus Jefes que serán otras Municipalidades y otros Gobernadores.

Con qué derecho la actual Municipalidad pretende imponer empleados a las Municipalidades futuras?

Esos absurdos no se presencian más que en esta desgraciada ciudad de Limón, que algún grupo considera bien propio, sin tomar para nada en cuenta la voluntad del pueblo.

Afortunadamente, hoy tenemos una autoridad íntegra que no permitirá ser arrastrado por los sueldos su legítimo prestigio.

### PATRIOTIC MEETING.

The members of the Limon Friendly and Literary Association held a meeting Monday night at St. Mark's schoolroom for the purpose of arranging a committee to make suitable provisions whereby they can entertain Sir Sydney Olivier as the guest of the Association.

The members turned out en masse and T. J. the meeting was called to order. The Ven. Rev. Archdeacon Robinson acted as Chairman and in a short speech said they met there that evening as loyal British subjects to arrange for the reception of the Governor of Jamaica. He suggested that the Vice-Consul should be asked to cooperate with the Association so as to make the affair a success and hope a suitable committee will be formed for the purpose.

Mr. deMercedo, the Vice-President of the Association, said: We have met here this evening for the purpose of discussing the advent of Sir Sydney Olivier, Governor of Jamaica, and from some plans to give him a fitting reception as loyal subjects of King George V. Within the past few days you have had an opportunity of reading in the local press two letters signed "Gosite" in which the writers sound the idea of receiving the distinguished visitor in a manner fitting his exalted position, what opinion have you formed of the idle vapors of these diseased minds who have rushed into print without being able to express themselves in readable English I do not know, but what I do know is that to attempt to ignore the proposed visit of the Governor of Jamaica among us in order to personally acquit himself with the conditions under which we live in a foreign country would seem to redound to our discredit among the large foreign element surrounding us and who, in a great measure, look upon West Indians in general, and Jamaicans in particular, as being beneath them in intelligence, and we then, in order to meet the views of a few who are in a great measure incapable of distinguishing between right and wrong, ignore the official who comes among us with a view of making good by future legislation? Or, are we to do the right thing and give him a royal reception as sons of Jamaica should do?

Many of you have read in "The Times" a reproduction of a letter signed J. B. Parker. Mr. Parker is a black man, one who represents the backbone of the Island we proudly call our home, he was once Chief Secretary of the National Club of Jamaica, of which Mr. Cox was the shining light and about the last man we would have expected to take up the matter of Sir Sydney's visit to Panama in the manner which I show in his letter. Mr. Parker like another writer (Mr. King), says that Sir Sydney should be greeted as the King's representative and to further give force to his writing has gone ahead of Sir Sydney to Pauama in order to arrange a fitting reception for him; that the people of Jamaica, more especially the peasant classes, are pleased over the proposed visit is proven by the interest they have shown in the matter, and which they say will assist His Excellency in his plans to establish Agriculture

ral loan banks for the benefit and progress of the Jamaica peasantry; there is also another object in view, and one of greater importance to our Island home, that of personal observation as to how Jamaica will be affected by the opening of the Isthmian waterway.

Sir Sydney's plans to acquire the information himself is most praiseworthy, and his position among the most intelligent of the Americans who have from time to time reproduced his writings concerning the negro race is a proof that he is well thought of, under the circumstance the information he will gather from the heads of the Canal Company would be withheld from another man, his visit therefore, must in years to come be of benefit to our Island.

Extending his visit to these shores then will have a twofold effect, that of making him acquainted with our progress, and at the same time give these among whom we abate in the impression that we still have the protection of the British Crown.

A short time ago Mr. Cox visited us, he addressed at least two thousand Jamaicans, and as far as I can learn his only grievance was against certain high officials forming the Privy and Legislative Councils of Jamaica and with the exception of one reference to His Excellency the Governor in which he again brought out personal grievances I am not aware that he blamed the Governor for the wholesale emigration to Central America.

These are my views, we can speak to him as our Governor, I do not think we can, do too much to welcome His Excellency.

Several of the gentlemen present spoke in an eulogizing manner of Sir Sydney and made suggestions as to the manner of his welcome. The speeches were many and lengthy and all in favour of giving the gentleman a hearty reception, save one gentleman.

After a few desultory remarks Mr. Wynter made the following resolution which was seconded by Mr. S. C. Nation, and carried unanimously:

"That a committee along with the cooperation of the British Vice Consul be appointed to draw up a programme for the reception of Sir Sydney Olivier as guest of the Association, said committee to consist of 12 gentlemen with power to add to its number."

The following is the Committee appointed: Messrs. David deMarcedo, Pres. dicit; Archdeacon Robinson, S. C. Nation, O. P. Nunes, Rev. Worsfold, G. E. Robinson, E. C. Gayle, Henry Hylton, Peter Noel, Peter Blackman, James Steibel, Drysdale.

Mr. deMercedo said he would like to remind the members that they were not inviting the Governor to their Association to lay their grievances before him, but simply as a guest, and as such it would be out of harmony with their ideas.

Among the speakers were S. C. Nation, G. E. Robinson, O. Wynter, J. B. Babo, E. C. Gayle, Horton, Preston and Gerard Nixon.

One of the speakers, a young man, was very obstreperous throughout the meeting and had to be called to order several times by the President.

The next meeting will be held on Wednesday next, 18th inst. at 7.30 when the committee will set down to business.

After a vote of thanks was given to the President the meeting closed about 9.15.

### Governor Olivier's Visit.

(BY HENRY HYLTON.)

There has been much mewling and snarling and snipping about the visit of Sir Sydney to Costa Rica and Colon which should strike no one as unseasonably strange for they are just the fruits of the seeds sown by the said Governor and his colleagues. No intelligent West Indian, British or non-British dare deny that the negro race in particular is yet the victim of a bad administration set up and maintained by a succession of autocratic tyrants forced on the West Indies. Besides these foreign despots there have been and still are local descendants of the men of Babel who held these people as chattels. The religion of Jesus Christ, highest and almost alone in love, has not yet reached their hearts to destroy the old and to create the new man whose love measures out liberty, equality and fraternity. Heirs of cruelty they believe the more cruel still and although the eternal engine is stayed from the "biggor" back yet "the little finger of Rehoboth is thicker than his father's loins."

Starving people are filling Jamaica; who will feed them? naked; who will clothe them? sick; who will heal them? In prison who will release them? The broken hearted; who will bind them? With grievous wrongs; who will redress them? Dying in foreign lands; who will welcome them home? The prisons are full as the result of wrongs, and many in a land of plenty. "O that mine eyes were fountains of tears" I would shed them for the grand-fathers—all honorable men—that have been cast into prison in the time of their gray hairs and tottering knees for the non-payment of taxes—Men who have been made rich with their coffers overflowing, with the monies of the land of *sun and dry*; men who have worked in golden slippers have been put on pension, whereas those who have borne the heat and burden of the day and have done the highest good have been turned out to starve and die. God Almighty forgive me if my indignation is righteous. Send a message in the Legislative Council to present your grievances and be bound and made a lie—persecuted for righteousness in a "righteous nation."

What is Sir Sydney coming to Costa Rica for, the welfare of the negroes of Jamaica in particular and the West Indies in general? Has he found a saint? Has he found a Cox, brought about his conversion like the confutation at the cross of Christ? Negroes, beware! lest he comes here as a fox and "When the fox preaches, beware of your gossam."
