AUTONOMIA Municipal

Según nuestras leyes, las Municipalidades pueden nombrar libremente sus empleados, sus empleados, no los de las administraciones sucesivas; no pueden contratar los puestos públicos, como no los puede contratar tampoco el Ejecutivo.

Don Cleto González Viquez en sus administraciones en su Administración, intentó contratar con el Licenciado don Luis Anderson la defensa de los derechos de Costa Rica en el asunto límites con Panamá, y aunque llegó á formalizar el contrato, ha quedado sin efecto, porque no hay contrato que resista á lo que es ilegal y á lo que es absurdo.

La Ley dá á los Gobernadores el derecho de vetar los acuerdos que considere ilegales y á la Secretaría de Gobernación el de conocer en grado las apelaciones en revisión de los vetos interpuestos por los Gobernadores.

Esa facultad merma la autonomía municipal, pero en la práctica resulta beneficiosa y necesaria.

Una Municipalidad, que se respecta, está en el deber de procurar que el Gobernador no se vea obligado á hacer uso del derecho que le concede la ley, derecho que en muchos casos alcanza la categoría de deber. Cada acuerdo justamente vetado, representa para una Municipalidad una especie de censura, una desautorización que á veces puede ser fuerza moral en la conciencia pública.

Por el contrario, si un Gobernador en casos determinados deja de hacer uso de su derecho de veto, pierde en el concepto público la autoridad moral que debe tener y arrastra también la autoridad del Ejecutivo á quien representa.

Sugiriéndonos estas reflexiones el acuerdo de la Municipalidad, sobre el contrato de don Ismael Alvarado á que nos referimos ayer.

La Municipalidad no ha debido poner al Gobernador en la disyuntiva de vetar ó de dejar de cumplir con su deber. No ha debido tomar un acuerdo que sabemos es ilegal, que no perdurará aunque se llegue á celebrar un contrato, porque otra Municipalidad, legalmente, dejará sin efecto ese contrato.

¿Por qué lo ha hecho? De público se afirma que por el do ut des, que ese acuerdo ha pasado porque de no pasar, hubiera tenido la destitución de un empleado municipal, pariente del lateral inmediato del Presidente del Municipio y es voz pública que por esa consideración y solo por ella, está disponiendo de la mayoría municipal quien no tiene ni otro mérito ni otros prestijios.

Era sólo eso cierto; podrá haber una parte de verdad y otra de exageración; pero es positivo que mientras en la Municipalidad de Limón impera el nepotismo, mientras los Municipios dispongan de los puestos públicos en favor de sus parientes, no tendremos aquí Administración Pública ni tendremos Municipalidades.

En la última sesión, el señor Gobernador preguntó directamente á don Luis Alvarado, si lo que se proponía era proteger su puesto contra la autoridad de las Municipalidades futuras, aseguérase, y el señor Alvarado contestó que sí, porque eso era la

MR. CHAMBERLAIN'S POLICY.

Mr. Chamberlain has written the following Preface to a new book by Arceideano Cunningham entitled "The Case Against Free Trade":

The opening years of the present century saw the end of one chapter in the history of the British Empire. With the Peace of Vereinging the era of expansion was definitely closed. Henceforth no extension of territory was either to be expected or desired. When the American Colonies were lost, not from lack of good intentions, but from failure to appreciate and sympathize with colonial sentiment and aspiration, it was still open to our forefathers to create a new empire in Canada, Africa and Australia. To-day no such opportunity exists, or can ever exist again. The world is occupied. The vast blanks on the maps of our youth have been explored and opened up to civilisation. The territory comprised in them has been apportioned among the Great Powers. There are no ownerless lands to which we or others can look as the sphere of future activity, or as to compensation for the loss of a province or a dominion. The future of the Empire lies henceforward, not in its power to annex new territories, but in its capacity to unite existing dominions and expand existing resources. There is a moral, but not a less difficult task. To it all our efforts should be directed whilst the nations that compose the Empire are still plastic, and before the growth of distinct national characteristics and divergent national interests has proceeded to such a point that what is now possible has forever become impossible, and opportunities that are still within our grasp have finally passed away.

It is a common-sense political study that the territorial

EXPANSION OF THE EMPIRE

was in the main a haphazard affair. British Governments, in spite of the perhaps not unwarlike suspicions of foreign powers, have pursued no settled or reasoned policy of expansion. More often than that when proclaiming an annexation or a protectorate, they have been the unwilling agents of forces stronger than themselves. Again and again they have surrendered what British soldiers have conquered, again and again they have refused what British explorers have offered. But the genius of the race has brooked no denial, and in spite of definite refusals or reluctant acquiescence on the part of its rulers, the Empire has grown to be the vast accumulation of dominions and dependencies whose representatives assembled in London for the coronation of the Sovereign.

We have been, on the whole, wonderfully fortunate, but we cannot trust for ever to good luck. Success breeds envy; jealous eyes watch our progress, measure our strength or weakness, and seek out the joints of our armor. We are great in territory, strong in numbers, and rich in vast but undeveloped sources. But our union is of the slightest, and our development has scarcely begun. Are they also to be left to chance? Are they also to be the blind sport of forces which we but dimly understand and do not seek to control? Or is an effort to be

made to find, and having found to pursue, a common policy by which the development of each may be made to serve the interests of the whole to safeguard and promote the development of each?

This is the imperial problem of to-day. Conference after Conference meets to discuss it, yet how little real progress is made! Is it not worth while to pause and ask ourselves why? "We call our kinsmen to our councils," but when we get them there we refuse to listen to their advice. On one subject alone they have throughly spoken with a single voice. Common interests are the pledge of common action. A common trade policy is the indispensable basis of a common imperial policy. Again and again openly or tacitly, the rulers of the Empire are brought back by their discussions to this fundamental fact.

The great dominions are willing, we abuse refuse. They open the door to us; in return we slam it in their faces. An imperial policy, adopted by its under different conditions both comic and political, at a time when our industrial supremacy was unchallenged, and the Empire itself regarded as a burdensome obligation to be shaken off as soon as possible, is still pleaded as an insuperable bar now that we are subjected to ever-increasing economic competition; and the greatest of the opportunity offered by our imperial position is, in words at least, an idea common to men of all parties.

Such a state of things cannot last. We are in a position of unstable equilibrium.

Columbus Day.

To-day being the 419th anniversary of the discovery of the Continent of America by Columbus, this country being a patriotic one will mark the occasion by observing the day as one of rejoicing.

Many of the commercial houses in the town has signified their intention of closing their places of business as a mark of respect to the great discoverer, and also to enable their clerks to join in the pleasures of the day.

Two teams arrived yesterday afternoon from San José—one foot ball and the other base ball. It is expected that they will try conclusions with teams in this town. There will be other attractions during the day to make pleasure seekers feel that all work and no play makes Jack a dull boy.

The Vargas Park is last fully decorated for the occasion with flags and the band stand has been made to present a picturesque appearance.

We wish all a pleasant time and would advise moderation in all things so that there will be no cause to regret when the day is past.

The s. "Cartago" left here last evening for Colon with passengers and mails. She is expected to return here to-morrow morning when she will take a large cargo of bananas for New Orleans.

Up to the present moment no official information has been received here or in San José concerning the visit to this republic of His Excellency Sir Sydney Olivier, although there is every truth about his visiting the republic.

The new Adama of Limon is rapidly approaching completion, and will be a most imposing structure when completed. There is no doubt that the contractor, Mr. Peany, is doing his best with an able staff, and we hope that the head-tax of five colones and three colones will soon be taken off.

The purser of the s. s. "Cartago" made love with all the money that was in his charge. After the arrival of the ship at New Orleans, he was missed from on board for several hours. When the safe that contained several pounds was opened it was discovered that every penny was taken out. Up to the time the ship left that port he was not captured.

There was another wreck on the lines, this time it was at Desierto. We have not received any information as to the extent of damage in consequence but we know a man was conveyed by train to Limon, probably suffering from injuries sustained in the mix up.

A stall holder (woman) in the market was fined £5 by Dr. Céspedes for having kept in her stall a quantity of excrement from her bladder, through an accident the pan in which it was kept upset and the liquid became offensive, and took her the exposure. If the market authorities were alive to their duty and the comfort and necessity of their tenants this would not have occurred. What should have been done long ago is now attempted—the building of a water closet.

It is reported that a military officer from San José eloped with a damsel from Limon very recently, and took her to the capital where they have been playing "high jinks." They have been caught and a good number of persons that was on the scent gathered at the railway station yesterday afternoon to see them land from the train as it was rumoured that they were to be brought down.

Turco-Italian War.

MARCO POLO'S PRIZES.

London.—A dispatch from Rome says a telegram has been received there from Catania, with a captured warship, having on board a Turkish general, 20 horses and 5,000 rials.

The Royal Tribuna announced that the Marco Polo had captured the Turkish transport Sabah.

LONDON ADVICES.

Confirm Report of Bombardment Complaint by Turkey.

London.—A dispatch to a news agency here from Rome says that the bombardment here from Tripoli by the Italian fleet has begun. The message is dated on Oct. 10 and the hour at which the bombardment began is left in doubt.

Up to early afternoon there has been no confirmation received here of this report, though late advices indicated that the attack on the Tripolitan forts might begin any moment.

A message to Italy from an Italian warship off Tripoli under a recent date quoted the Italian Consul as saying that the bombardment would begin in three days after the notification to the population to evacuate, which was given on Saturday.

Another dispatch to a paper at Rome from Malta also set forth that the bombardment would begin early.

The Turkish Ambassador, Tewfik Pasha, presented a note from his government to the Foreign Office complaining that, contrary to all international rules of warfare, the declaration of war against Turkey had

been preceded by hostilities upon the coast of the Italian warships.

For this reason, both lawfully and by reason of the existing situation, Turkey had the right, he contended, to employ again Italy not only measures arising out of a state of war, but also any measures which the present situation might permit her to take. Notwithstanding this right Turkey had proposed such measures, while making a fresh appeal to the powers in the conviction that it was still possible to end the war.

Duke of Connaught

London.—It is officially announced that the Duke of Connaught, the new Canadian Governor General, will be accompanied by the Duchess and the Princess Patricia and will sail from Liverpool for Quebec by the "Empress of Ireland."

A Great Battle.

St. Petersburg.—A Teheran despatch says, according to Government advices, a great battle was fought at Nobaran, 50 miles from Teheran. Solar Ed Dowlah, brother of the deposed Shah, lost 400 killed and 200 captured in addition to several big guns. He retired in the direction of Hamadan to the west, the Government troops pursuing him.

Strike Over.

Dublin.—The railway strike is virtually ended. The Transport Union having withdrawn its embargo on railways having "black leg" timber which was the origin cause of the strike. Representatives of the strikers have met the railway directors and arranged terms for the resumption of work.

Lady Doctor.

Mrs. Marie Beard, M.B. and Ch. M. of Glasgow University, eldest daughter of Mr. Justice Beard, has applied to be placed on the roll of registered medical practitioners in this colony. Mrs. Beard, it is understood will engage in active practice and will have the distinction of being the first lady doctor to set up a practice in this colony.—Jamaica "Daily Gleaner."

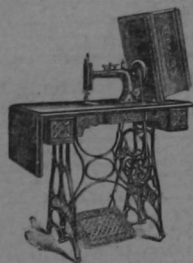

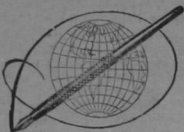
