Disgraceful Odour.

No one will dare deny the right of such a statute, but when the dogs are destroyed they should be buried into a deep hole or carried far out to sea so that the current could wash them in other directions. But instead our man was told that the animals are thrown into the mouth of the harbor, there to be decomposed and be a menace to the lives of healthy people.

Immediately opposite the old Freemason's Lodge was to be found yesterday, the carcasses of a pair of these animals that must have been thrown there. It was hardly possible for one to stand the fumes that emitted from these dead bodies. We hope the attention of the Health Officer will be drawn to this evil and a speedy remedy be made.

Benghazi

Bombardment

WAS TERRIFIC SLAUGHTER

OF TURKS—FOREGNERS

ALSO KILLED.

Malta, Oct. 24.—In letters received here from Benghazi, Tripoli, the writers estimate the casualties among the inhabitants resulting from the bombardment by the Italian fleet at 4,000. The British consulate was badly damaged and consul John Francis Jones was wounded. Several Jews who are British subjects and had taken refuge in the British consulate, were killed or wounded. Numerous buildings, including a Maltese church were destroyed. Eight Maltese were killed and ten wounded, it is said.

The correspondents add that wild panic prevailed in the city.

London, Oct. 24.—The correspondents of the "London Times" and the other English papers at Tripoli have been reporting by way of Malta that the affair at Benghazi was much more serious than the Italian censorship had permitted to be known.

ANCIENT TRIPOLI WORTH SEEING.

CAPITAL CITY, SURROUNDING OASES, TOWN TOWER, MINARETS, AND DAZZLING WHITE DOMES OF MOSQUES, COMPLETE PICTURE OF INTEREST.

Tripoli, on which the attention of the world is now focused, is very little frequented by the traveler. Even those privileged few who "do the Mediterranean thoroughly" do not call at this little town—typically Moorish in aspect, and which is chiefly built on a small North African promontory some two hundred miles south of Malta.

The tourist sometimes calls at every harbor between Tangier and Tunis, but even if he is the happy owner of a steam yacht and has decided to sail eastward, to Egypt or Palestine, it will in all probability not even occur to him that Tripoli and Benghazi are not far out of his route, and he will sail in a straight line, from Tunis to Alexandria, totally ignoring this vast and mysterious land which has in turn been conquered by the Phoenicians, the Romans, the Vandals and the Arabs, and is now once more a matter of contention.

And why should the tourist visit Tripoli? Unless he is a keen student or archaeologist—and from this point of view Tripoli, with its remarkable wealth of antiquities, is well worth a prolonged stay—there is little to attract him to this barren or rather unattractive land. Here and there a few oases balance their palms and there are a few fertile tracts, especially along the coast, but the desolate and extensive wastes of sand or rock between these make one hesitate to travel far in this inhospitable land where Europeans are from welcome where water is scarce, railroads unobtainable where the sirocco blows fiercely—especially at this time of the year—and where the general atmosphere that pervades the little squatted towns, with their tortuous, evil-smelling streets, the market places outside the walls, and the primitive encampments of aggressive-looking nomads, seems to remind one unpleasantly that Tripoli was for many centuries chiefly famous for its pirates, the dreaded scourge of the Mediterranean.

The capital, without claims to great picturesque interest, is not an ugly place as viewed from the sea, from outside the roadstead guarded by a dangerous bar.

It is surrounded, like most Moorish and Tunisian cities, by dilapidated walls. On one side of the harbor are a few forts and earthworks, which boast a few guns, and at the other end stands the "castle" of the Turkish Governor. Above the town tower the minarets and the dazzling white domes of a few mosques, which are the religious and political places of rendezvous of the Muslim inhabitants.

The population of the European quarter, called Marina, is chiefly Maltese, though there is a considerable Italian colony and a few thousand Jews. In the narrow paved streets at Tripoli, Arabs, Turks, Kabyles, Moors,

The three large market places which spread outside the city ramparts are really curious. There ivory and ostrich feathers are brought from the south by the caravans along desert roads, which have been used for centuries. Earthenware, native and European tissues, fruit (mostly dates, figs and olives), and all kinds of vegetables are everywhere in evidence.

But what is most interesting to the visitor is Meshiga—or Meshiga—a vast and delightful oasis to the east of Tripoli. There, amid the verdant palm groves, are the tombs of the Karanoulis Sultans (a Karanoulis and his descendants governed Tripoli during the eighteenth century and until 1835), and there also, in rustic, Central African cane huts, live the Sudanese negroes, descendants of slaves captured in the "south," who are such a typical feature of Tripoli.

Here and there are scattered groups of mud-houses, where Arabs dwell, and beyond, amid the sandhills, are the tents of nomadic nomads.

The rapid description of the capital of Tripoli and its environs were not complete without a mention of the stretched Greek sponge fishers, to many of whom die of paralytic as a result of constant diving, and of Lebda, a small harbor, sixty miles east of Tripoli, chiefly known for its exports of esparto grass.

Esparto grass is one of the phrases which recur most frequently in the conversation of Tripolitans, for it is one of the chief exports of that little known land. The fibre of this precious plant, which attains a height of several feet and grows in thick, wide clusters, is used for all kinds of purposes. Mats, baskets and ropes are made with it, and when it has been washed and bleached it is extensively used by paper manufacturers.

Turkish troops are everywhere to be seen in and around Tripoli, and the Arabs of the interior are well armed fanatics, wonderful riders, excellent marksmen, and sturdy men who know not fear and who have the most bellicose instincts.

Chased by Turks.

SIEMER HAS EXIJTING EXPERIENCE SENATOR PERCY ABOARD.

New York.—Officers of the Austrian Lane steamer March Washington, which arrived from Trieste, Patras and Palermo brought belated war news in the report that the Alexandria Washington was chased for some distance off the port of Patras by a Turkish torpedo boat.

The excitement occurred on the night of October 9, which was unusually dark. The torpedo boat kept up the chase until she had focused her searchlight on the liner's bow and learned the steamer's name.

Among the passengers on the Marlia Washington were United States Senator Leroy Percy of Mississippi and Mrs. Percy.

Earl of Onslow Dead.

ENGLISH PEEL HAD LONG AND BRILLIANT CAREER.

London.—The Earl of Onslow died. William Hillier Onslow, was born in 1853, and had been a chairman of committees and deputy speaker in the House of Lords since 1905. He was a Conservative.

He was twice a lord in waiting, was Under Secretary for the Colonies in 1887-88, parliamentary secretary to the Board of Trade in 1888, Governor and commander in chief of New Zealand in 1888-92, president of the Board of Agriculture in 1903-05 in Lord Salisbury's and Mr. Balfour's Ministries.

The French Navy.

Toulon.—The torpedo-boat destroyers "Triton" and "Mosqueta" collided during the manoeuvre of the French navy. The "Mosqueta" was rather badly stove in, but was able to get port. No fatalities have been reported.

Paris.—The "Aidi" affirms that absolute difference of opinion exists between Vice-Admiral Bellue and the Minister of Marine, M. Delcasse, as to the cause of the explosion on that destroyed the "Liberte." The Admiral who commanded the second squadron, to which the battleship belonged, maintains that the disaster was due to decomposition of the powder in her magazines. M. Delcasse refuses to accept that explanation.

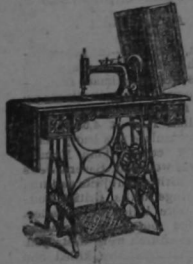

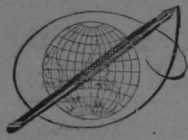
