La Comisión celebró en dos semanas y media 14 reuniones de cuatro horas cada una. Aunque la tarea principal de la Comisión consistió en revisar los contratos y someter al Gobierno los comentarios y recomendaciones pertinentes, después de la primera reunión, resolvió verificar un estudio detallado de la situación económica salvadoreña y del proyecto específico sometido a su consideración. Este amplio estudio fue llevado a cabo para llegar a un juicio correcto de los términos de los contratos con base en los antecedentes completos de carácter económico y técnico.

Después de haberse terminado el estudio de la Comisión, se plantearon diversos puntos como resultado principalmente de la interpretación de la terminología legal en inglés. Estos puntos fueron resueltos en discusiones con los representantes del Banco que estuvieron en San Salvador a principios de noviembre. El informe favorable de la Comisión fué sometido poco después a los funcionarios competentes del Gobierno que autorizaron inmediatamente el cierre de las negociaciones.

Otro proyecto sobre perforación de varios pozos para proveer irrigación adicional en grandes áreas del norte del país presenta, sin duda interesantes posibilidades. Pero por cuanto las investigaciones están solamente en etapa preliminar y no hay todavía estimación de costos, la misión recomendó que el Banco permanezca a la expectativa hasta que se tengan mejores pruebas sobre la viabilidad del proyecto.

Paso a referirme a otro pro-
grama que tenía un atractivo
inmediato mucho mayor. En
diferentes regiones del país mu-
chos terrenos de buenas condi-
ciones para la agricultura
habían venido a ser inaptos
para cualquier cultivo, debido
a la invasión de una planta
conocida con el nombre de «kans grass». Esta es una hierba resis-
tente, de raíces profundas y de
difícil exterminación. El go-
bierno hindú había hecho un
satisfactorio experimento para
desarranciar arando profun-
damente con tractores dejados
por el ejército de los Estados

Unidos. En consecuencia, de-
seaba acometer trabajos simi-
lares en varias partes de la
India Central sobre una área
total aproximadamente igual a
la del Estado de Connecticut.
La misión encontró que este
era el proyecto más económico
que se le había presentado pa-
ra aumentar la producción de
alimentos, y posteriormente re-
sultó ser aún más económico,
ya que con una utilización más
efectiva se requería menos equi-
po del que originalmente se
había creído necesario.

Permitaseme alterar algo la
cronología y decir que el 29 de
septiembre pasado el Banco hizo
a la India un préstamo de diez
millones de dólares para la im-
portación de los tractores y
equipo necesarios para la li-
mpieza de las referidas tierras.
El crédito es de siete años de
plazo, al dos y medio por cien-
to de interés anual, más la co-
misión usual de uno por ciento
que se lleva a un fondo espe-
cial de reserva del Banco. Se
emplearán siete años en el des-
monte del área total de tres
millones de acres, pero ya den-
tro de este período se podrán
obtener cuatro millones de to-
neladas de cereales que aho-

rarán a la India varias veces
el valor en dólares del proyec-
to. Al concluirse los trabajos,
los terrenos reincorporados al
cultivo producirán alrededor de
un millón de toneladas al año.

La misión tuvo a su conside-
ración otro proyecto de reha-
bilitación de tierras. Se trata
de una faja de selva de pobre
vegetación que se extiende al
pie de los montes Himalayas.
Es ésta una tarea mucho más
difícil que la anteriormente des-
crita y que implica desecación de
pantanós y control de la
malaria. Por otra parte, esa es
una región deshabitada, a di-
ferencia de la invadida por el
«kans grass» y en la que, por
consiguiente, habría que comen-
zar con la construcción de ca-
sas y facilidades propias. Es
verdadero que esto proporcionaría
trabajo a los refugiados ahora
concentrados en campos espe-
ciales, pero en manera alguna
es claro que sea éste el mejor
sistema de solucionar, el pro-
blema. El Banco estimó que
sería preferible para el país
adelantar primero un experi-
mento de prueba. Con tal fin,
en el préstamo arriba mencio-
nado se apropiaron fondos pa-

EDITORIAL

Era un espectáculo admirable y de gran significancia ver a estos bien disciplinados muchachos en sus uniformes bien arreglados con sus equipos para su entrenamiento.

El año pasado el maravilloso servicio que ha prestado este cuerpo de muchachos durante la Semana Santa en las procesiones en conmemoración de la Pasión y Muerte de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo fué muy significativo. Como se ha aproximado de nuevo esta conmemoración, esa memoria nos incita a expresar nuestro pensamiento en su principio fundamental.

Los principios fundamentales asociados con el movimiento scout, fueron fundados por Lord Baden Powell, quien ha commandado atenciones universales, obteniendo gran prestigio. Su utilidad e influencia en bien son ilimitadas, ya que sirven como una plataforma sobre el cual personas jóvenes y viejos pueden caminar y levantarse sobre una vida apretada e ilimitada. El sistema no puede considerarse solamente como una medida de atletismo; mientras beneficios físicos inmenos son obtenibles por ejercicios variables y más prácticos. El valor de este movimiento revelado en los records pertenecientes a ello. El movimiento de Boy Scout mantiene una posición elevada entre las ejecuciones que creen de vida noble y disciplinada.

Aunque de lamentar, sin embargo, es verdad que ahí existe una debilidad de nuestros jóvenes para vivir unidos y plegados a cualquier movimiento que demande unidad del alma y acción en armonía con una vida noble. Debemos llevar siempre en mente el hecho importante de que estamos viviendo en una época en la cual necesita verdadero servicio por lo que debemos estar muy bien preparados. Una generosa y una sincera cooperación en el scoutismo nos ayudará grandemente en este aspecto.

Permitimos demasiada libertad falsa que asfixia y mata nobles esfuerzos y guías, eventualmente a un lazo de vida. Nadie puede adivinar cuando terrores de un ataque pueda llegar a nuestro continente, por lo que es necesario la presencia de un grupo de auxiliares por lo menos de doscientos jóvenes bajo ja bandera del scoutismo. Hay buena razón para creer que el Estado y otras entidades asistirían en soportar el costo de uniformes y otros implementos necesarios. En vista de que en otros países se obliga la preparación militar, por qué no mantenemos un cuerpo regular de Boy Scout bajo nuestra democracia?

Tonsura y Ordenes Menores en la Catedral de Limón

El doce próximo pasado del mes de marzo, presenciamos en la Catedral de Limón; en manos del muy ilustrísimo señor Obispo Juan Odenthal, la imposición de la Tonsura, por la cual queda ingresado al Personal de este Vicariato Apostólico, el dedicado estudiante David Garro, quien a la vez recibió las cuatro Or-

denes Menores.

La Tonsura. - Es una señal que se hace en la cabeza del clérigo, cortando cabellos en cinco lugares: frente, nuca, oreja derecha y oreja izquierda, en medio de la cabeza, el sitio donde debe llevarse la tonsura. Antiguamente se llamaba corona, y representa la corona de espinas del Redentor. La blanca del sobrepeliz representa la inocencia y el candor del tonsurado.

Orden Primera. — Ostiario: Oficio de invitar al pueblo al Santo Sacrificio y alejar a los indignos del Templo, (excomulgados). El Obispo hace tocar al clérigo las llaves y le invita a sentirse obligado a dar cuenta a Dios de todo lo que custodio estas llaves.

Segundo Orden — Lector: Encargado de leer por turno los libros santos. El Obispo hace tocar el Misal al candidato y le dice: «Recibe este libro y se lector de la palabra de Dios, cumple fielmente y tendrás parte con los que desde el principio predicaron fielmente la palabra de Dios.

Orden Tercera. — Exorcista o conjurador: Su oficio es arrojar el demonio del cuerpo de los poseídos. El Obispo hace tocar el libro de los exorcismos diciendo: «Recibe este libro y ten la potestad de poner las manos sobre los energúmenos así bautizados como católicos».

Orden Cuarta. — Acolitado: Servir al Sacerdote inmediatamente en las funciones privadas y al Diácono y Subdiácono en las funciones solemnes. Al recibir esta orden, el Obispo inscribe sobre los deberes del oficio y le da al acólito una vela encendida diciéndole: «Recibe este candelabro con su vela en el nombre del Señor y entiende

OUR TASK FROM OUR DESK

BY THE EDITOR

Every person with the knowledge bearing on the very grand importance that is associated with Scouting, no doubt, has wondered as we have done regarding the disappearance of our Boy Scout Movement.

It was such a pleasing spectacle and with great significance to have fixed eyes on these native youths in their splendidly fitted uniforms and their scout out-fits in the various exercises.

Last year the wonderful services the Scouts gave to the Holy Week processions of the Roman Catholic Cathedral and the season will dawn in the next few days;—that memory has prompted us to express our thought on its fundamental principle.

The fundamental principles associated with Scouting, as founded by the late Lord Baden Powell, have commanded universal attention and earned wide esteem. Its usefulness and influence for good are unlimited and serve as a golden plank on which young and old persons may tread and rise above the cramped limitations of life. The system can in no manner be regarded as a mere sporting measure, while immeasurable physical benefits are derivable from the drills and other exercises. The value of the movement is finely disclosed in the records in conjunction with it. Scouting holds an exalted position among the achievements sprung from disciplined and noble living.

Though regretted, it is nevertheless true that there exists a weakness among our youths to stick to any movement which demands the binding of soul and action in harmony with noble living. We should all bear in mind the important fact that we are living in an age which calls for real service for which we must necessarily be prepared; a generous and true hearted cooperation in Scouting will greatly aid us in this respect.

We indulge in too much false freedom which smothers and kills noble endeavours and leads, eventually, to the pit-falls of life. There is no telling when the terrors of an attack will be on us, hence the need, we believe for the presence of a fully prepared auxiliary group of at least two hundred youngsters under the Banner of «Scouting». There is good reason to believe the State and other able sources would assist in bearing the cost of uniforms and other necessary outfitting articles. Since forced soldiering is evidenced elsewhere, why not a greater VOLUNTEER SCOUTING under our Democracy.

First United States International Trade Fair Chicago, August 7-19, 1950

Chicago, March 15.—Austrian firms will emphasize consumer goods according to space reservation received today by the First United States International Trade Fair which will be held in Chicago, next August 7 to 20.

Reservation for 4,100 square feet of space was transmitted for the Austrian National Committee by Eugene Frisch, delegate from Austria to the European Trade Fair Board of the OEEC (Organization of European Economic Cooperation), which is coordinating exhibits from the Marshall Plan nations for the First United States International Trade Fair.

Largest single assignment of

space for products of Austrian firms was made for display of gift items. These will include fine and costume jewelry, gems and stones, watches and clocks, novelties and accessories, china, sterling and plate silverware and pottery. Special displays will show hollow glassware, crystal, lead crystal and colored glassware.

The other major division of space reserved by Austrian firms will accommodate products of the apparel industry. These will include men's apparel of all types; women's, children's and infants' wear—especially sportwear, lingerie, hosiery and hats; fashion accessories for both sexes, including belts, wallets, handbags and handkerchiefs.

Leather goods, such as traveling bags, trunks, brief cases, kits, fitted bags and miscellaneous leather products will also be shown.

Other consumer merchandise to be shown by Austrian firms will be smokers' supplies, such as tobacco, cigars and cigarettes, pipes, holders, ashtrays, lighters,

and Switzerland. Each is eligible by reason of its membership in a United Nations Specialized Agency.

Member-nations will be asked to sign on the dotted line for the sums they are prepared to invest in the well-being of mankind, as insurance against atomic death. It is predicted that both East and West bloc nations will contribute funds and technicians. Even before the checks are deposited, the United Nations will forge ahead with expanded technical assistance plans, out of current budget. By mid-year it seems certain that a vast net-work of programs will be under way, in South America, the Near East and Africa. Any attempt to gauge the scope would be premature, with virtually every under-developed area on the globe pushing its claim to early industrialization.

Plane for a world Boom

How to attain a thriving world economy is the paramount question before the UN Economic and Social Council, currently holding its Tenth Session at Lake Success, under the able presidency of Ambassador Hernan Santa Cruz. Delegates see prosperity, full employment and a global boom as the one sure answer to the H-bomb. For a well fed, well-heeled world is less likely to be inflamed by the torch of war than one in which two-thirds of the planet's two billion people are living close to starvation level.

In the absence of the Russians, the ECOSOC session raced through six items of its agenda the first day, which in time of their active participation might have required ten days. All the same, there was full regret that the USSR chairs were unoccupied.

Plan of Action

A basic plan for maintaining prosperity at a high level in the advanced countries was unanimously approved. It calls for three measures.

1: Adoption of a full employment figure or *target* when it declines will serve as a warning that action is needed.

11: A full-fledged government program of fiscal and monetary policies, investment and production planning, wage and price policies, aimed at stabilizing consumer demand at the full employment level.

111: A system of compensatory measures to be automatically applied whenever unemployment rises to a predetermined level for three successive months.

ECOSOC had before it the General Assembly's recommendation for urgent action on economic development of the underdeveloped countries. But the Assembly warned that social welfare questions should not be overlooked in programs of industrial expansion in the backward area. This suggestion has been promptly met by planning for community services to accompany technical assistance. (To be continued)

Universal Declaration of Human Rights

(continued from Saturday March 25th)

Article 15: Everyone has the right to a nationality. 2: No one shall be arbitrarily deprived of his nationality nor denied the right to change his nationality.

Article 16: Men and women of full age, without any limitation due to race, nationality or religion, have the right to marry and to found a family. They are entitled to equal rights as to marriage, during marriage and at dissolution. 2: Marriage shall be entered into only with the free and full consent of the intending spouses. The family is the natural and fundamental group unit of society and is entitled to protection by society and the State.

Article 17: Everyone has the right to own property alone as well as in association with others. 2: No one shall be arbitrarily deprived of his property.

Article 18: Everyone has the right to freedom of thought, conscience and religion; this right includes freedom to change his religion or belief, and freedom, either alone or in community with others and in public or private, to manifest his religion or belief in teaching, practice, worship and observance.

Article 19: Everyone has the right to freedom of opinion and expression; this right includes freedom to hold opinions without interference and to seek, receive and impart information and ideas through any media and regardless of frontiers.

Article 20: Everyone has the right to freedom of peaceful assembly and association. 2: No one may be compelled to belong to an association.

Article 21: Everyone has the right to take part in the government of his country, directly or through freely chosen representatives. 2: Everyone has the right of equal access to public service in his country. 3: The will of the people shall be the basis of the authority of government; this will shall be expressed in periodic and genuine elections which shall be by universal suffrage and shall be held by secret vote or by equivalent free voting procedures.

Article 22: Everyone, as a member of society, has the right to social security and is entitled to realization, through national effort and international co-operation and in accordance with the organization and resources of each State, of the economic, social and cultural rights indispensable for his dignity and the free development of his personality.

Article 23: Everyone has the right to work, to free choice of employment, to just and favourable conditions of work and to protection against unemployment. 2: Everyone, without any discrimination, has the right to equal pay for equal work. 3: Everyone who works has the right to just and favourable remuneration insuring for himself and his family an existence worthy of human dignity, and supplemented, if necessary, by other means of social protection. 4: Everyone has the right to form and to join trade unions for the protection of his interest.

Article 24: Everyone has the right to rest and leisure, including reasonable limitation of working hours and periodic holidays with pay.

cigrette cases, humidors and pipe racks.

Recreational equipment to be shown will include games and toys, sporting goods and athletic equipment, hosting and marine equipment and photography supplies.

Textiles, for apparel, drapery and upholstery and home furnishings such as indoor and outdoor furniture, bedding, floor coverings, household linens, lamps and pictures will also be shown. A separate division has been set aside to display Austrian brushes for home and industrial uses.

Special industrial machinery and electrical equipment will also be shown.

Travel and tourist information will be presented in a display of the Austrian government.

In addition to space reserved by Austria, twenty-nine other nations have already contracted for space to exhibit goods of their industries at the First United States International Trade Fair. More than 40 different countries will present their products when the Fair opens next August.

Thousands of buyers from the United States and other countries will attend. An office to accommodate buyers from the Atlantic Seaboard has been recently established in New York in the lobby of the Warwick

Hotel, 65 West 54th Street.

The Fair will be held at four of the largest exhibition buildings in Chicago; the Navy Pier, the International Amphitheatre, the Coliseum and the Chicago Arena.



A. M. Meldrum of San Francisco, California, uses a trucktrailer to demonstrate the hydraulic wheel-suspension device he invented as an aid in loading and unloading cargo. The mechanism permits elevating and lowering the trailer so that the bed is even with the loading dock. The wheel unit is somewhat similar in construction to the retractable landing gear of an airplane and can move a distance of 53 inches. A small gasoline engine, mounted in the forepart of the vehicle, furnishes power for the hydraulic system. Each wheel unit can be operated independently of the other. It took Meldrum 2 years to build the entire assembly which he calls the "Hi-Lo" trailer. The photo shows the trailer lowered to ground level.

The Atlantic Has Been Reprimanded for Negligence

Many weeks ago some very prominent and highly regarded ladies informed us that whenever certain films are being screened in the local theatres, among some of the English spoken youths who occupy the galleries, their conduct and language are disgraceful and disdainful; not only the bad taste of their behaviour and expressions, but their noise forms an impediment in the way of the enjoyment of the other patrons who are outside their gang. The question arises that rigid police vigilance is needed and those indulged in the evil should be ejected without fear or favour.

The ladies reprimanded us for being slow in exposing this bad practice and at the same time our attention was invited with regard to the lengthy blowing of the horns at the theatres at the seven an nine o'clock starting hours.

The complainants found on good reason for the ten or more minutes of sounding the horns. Some citizens residing near one of the theatres remarked that they are hard daily workers and retire to bed between the hours of eight and nine o'clock at night, and many nights they are awakened by the continual blowing of the horns. If needs be to sound these horns as a means of calling the theatre goers there should be no cause for such prolonged sounding.

We hope the proprietors of our theatres will effect the remedy for the disgraceful conditions mentioned, especially that of the badly behaved youngsters.
