## Las quejas de muchos Productores pequeños de Banano

Ha llegado a nuestras oficinas las quejas de muchos de nuestros productores pequeños de banano; con referencia de las grandes pérdidas que están confrontando en el cultivo de banano en esta Zona.

Es generalmente conocido que la edad del boldón en lo cual crece la fruta tiene mucho que hacer con la calidad de la producción; por otro lado, se sabe que después de muchos cosechas de banano en un mismo terreno, la tierra se hace menos fértil por lo que en los racimos se encuentra una reducción de manos, casualmente lo que les está sucediendo a los productores en sus siembras. Una cantidad abundante de racimos de seis y siete manos han estado apreciando y del cual los exportadores no tienen mercado para su venta.

Somos de criterio de que algunas diligencias son necesarias, de alguna manera, para localizar un mercado para estos racimos livianos. Si no es remedio inmediatamente este asunto que exponemos, presumimos que varios de estos productores estarán obligados a abandonar su industria.

## Independencia de los EE. UU.



El martes de la semana en curso, 4 de Julio, fué el ciento setenta y cuatro aniversario de la Declaración de Independencia de los Estados Unidos en la gloriosa fecha de 1776. Una Magna Carta fué instituida la cual contiene en principio los derechos de vida, libertad y el seguimiento de felicidad de todos los seres humanos.

Esa antorcha de libertad ha sido guardada ardiendo brillantemente durante el largo periodo de 1774 años por un pueblo que lo mereció, y cada año da más evidencia de su gran premio al mundo cristiano.

## FROM OUR DESK OUR TASK

On Tuesday of the week in course, July 4th, the one hundred and seventy fourth anniversary since the Declaration of Independence of the United States of America came on the calendar of time;—a Charter was instituted which contains in principle the right of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness for all human creatures.

That torch of freedom has been kept burning brightly during the lengthened period of 174 years, by a people who earned it; and each succeeding year gives evidence of its great premium to all Christendom.

Time work wonders;—those political bonds which were severed on the never-to-be forgotten fourth of July, 1776 have been welded anew; not for the purpose of another Declaration of Independence by any given State or Nation but the two nations who were in the original picture are now the leaders in the establishment of a Council of Nations and with a Charter named—The Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

As a nation born of freedom and moved by its fundamental virtue could not stand aloft while another blow has been directed with intent to destroy freedom's pillar and the tower of right to the enjoyment of happiness by the Koreans. It is regrettable that this force of evil comprising the dreaded doctrine of communism has somewhat interrupted the peace of mind of the free nations and dampened the joys of this anniversary. made great progress on a number of smaller technical details, such as over-all length of wagons, the position of couplings and so on.

been achieved, a tremendous step will have been made in the opening up of Africa, comparable to the construction of the trans-continental railway of the United States.

### Lever Soaps to be Made in Jamaica

Agreements have been signed for the west Kingston factory of Soaps and Edible Products Ltd., of Jamaica, to manufacture certain brands of Lever Soaps. It is expected that the soaps will be made to the specifications of the Lever organization, just as the Jamaica factory now makes Palmolive soap to the specifications of the Colgate Palmolive-Peet Company.

### Film Company to Shoot at Bournemouth Baths.

Negotiations are underway for Kingswood Films Ltd. to use the Bournemouth Baths for the filming of the under water parts of «Sunken Treasures», which the company is producing in Jamaica. Kingswood have offered to pay three pounds a day for the use of the pool, and leave it in as good condition as they found it. Shooting and set construction are expected to last about three weeks.

### Jamaica May Ask Loan to Aid Jobs

The Select Committee of the Jamaica House of Representatives has in pending measures to relieve unemployment in the island now has before it a recommendation that the Government

open negotiations with the United Kingdom for a £ 2,000,000 loan at low interest, repayable in 50 years, to finance productive schemes for the permanent relief of unemployment.

The recommendation has been accepted by the Finance and Planning Sub-Committee.

In a lengthy memorandum to the Select Committee, the Chamber of Commerce has suggested many proposals for aiding the jobless situation, including a change in the type of education. It recommends a census and registration of unemployed, so that the exact number might be known.

### Ex-speaker Taking Case to England:

O. Alphonso Malcolm, ex-speaker of the Jamaica House of Representatives whose appeal against his conviction for an election offence was dismissed by the Jamaica Court of Appeal, has announced that he will take the case on appeal to England. His lawyers are expected to ask for leave to appeal to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council in London, the highest tribunal open to persons in the British Empire.

## The Fifty Colones for Renewal of Residential Cedula Is Demanded

A lawyer had occasion of a special nature to present a Residential Cedula to the Foreign Section of the Ministry of Public Security in order for a Britisher to effect a travel to the neighbouring Republic, but since the Cedula is not renewed for 1950, the officer in charge advised that the Fifty Colones Timbre must be paid by all British Citizens, and in consequence the petition to leave the Republic and return was rejected.

It is also enforced that the children of British Nationals born in Costa Rica and if desirous to apply for citizenship, must first get the Residential Cedula and pay the fifty colones tax, and of course, expense for photographs for the Cedula and those to accompany the application for citizenship. On becoming a citizen of Costa Rica, the Residential Certificate which cost so high to obtain will be of no further use to the new Oostarrican. The total cost, at least, to secure option will be a hundred colones; if undertaken by medium of correspondence; but if the party interested to get these documents effects the trip to

San Jose then it means a greater amount of money, including hotel fee, etc.

## Caribbean Review

*House Authority Moves To Settle Kingston Squatters*

Jamaica's Central Housing Authority has submitted a £ 75,500 Scheme to the Government, designed to settle more than two-thirds of the squatter population of Western Kingston.

The plan, referred by the Governor to the Legislature, will provide homes for 2,925 persons, or 875 family units, out of the 3,752 persons shown by a census taken in March to be squatting in the area under poor conditions.

It is proposed to finance the scheme equally from Housing Trust, Colonial Development and Welfare, and Loan funds. Of the total, £ 51,997 is earmarked for buildings, and the balance of £ 23,503 for development of the 93 acres at Cockburn Pen, selected for the settlement.

*Company Announces Bauxite Mining Plans*

With the passing by both houses of the Jamaica Legislature of the measure providing for aid to the bauxite mining industry, Reynolds Jamaica Mines Ltd. have announced their preparatory plans for mining bauxite in St. Ann. These involve, an outlay of some five million pounds and include the building of a ship and unloading facilities in the United States.

Constructions in Jamaica will include two large steel silos for storing the ore,

of a total capacity of 25,000 tons, a six-mile ropeway for delivering the ore to the silos in covered buckets and a 550 foot pier extending into deep water.

*University Hospital to be Largest in the West Indies*

The largest hospital in the West Indies will be the teaching hospital of the University College of the West Indies for which foundations are now being laid on a 20-acre site at Mona, Jamaica. Five hundred workmen are engaged on the project, due to be completed by December, 1951. All the hospital facilities, including X-ray clinic, will be made adequate for a 500 bed hospital, as originally planned. Owing, however, to rapid rise in building costs since the plans were drafted, ward blocks will be built to house only 200 beds at present. Ward blocks for the other 300 beds will be built later.

Total cost of the 200 bedroom, when equipped, will be about three quarters of a million pounds.

*Farm Workers Leave Jamaica for the United States*

Fifty farm workers, the first batch of 500 requested, have left Jamaica for work in the United States. The men are being recruited for work in Minnesota, Illinois and Wisconsin. Re-

ruitment is being almost entirely limited to persons already listed by employers in United States.

*Proposed Major Project to Relieve Unemployment*

The Select Committee of the Jamaica House of Representatives which has been studying ways and means of relieving unemployment in the island, has recommended to the Houses three major projects; establishment of an agricultural development corporation, city expansion in Western Kingston, by way of rehabilitation works, and swamp reclamation throughout the island.

To finance these measures the Committee proposes a cheap long term two million pounds in Jamaica through taxation and other means.

*Chief Justice Heads Cricket Body*

Sir Allan Collymore, Kt., Chief Justice of Barbados, was elected president of the Barbados Cricket Association at its sixteenth annual general meeting held recently.

### To study Federation Proposals

The Legislative Council of Barbados, the island's upper house, has appointed a committee of five to study the recommendations contained in the reports of the Standing Closer Association Committee, which deals with federation of the B. W. I. and the Commission on the Unification of Public Services in the West Indies. They are Honourable H. A. Cuke, Hon. Dr. H. G. Massiah, Hon. Dr. St. John, Hon. G. D. L. Pile, and Hon. G. B. Evelyn.

### Emigration A 'Must' for Barbados

J. H. Wilkinson, Leader of the Opposition Party in the Barbados House of Assembly, recently told of political meeting sponsored by the Barbados Electors' Association that emigration is a must for Barbados in order to reduce the island's redundant population and make a decent standard of living possible. He declared that delegations should be sent to Canada and U. S. to make contacts.

In former years, Mr. Wilkinson's party, which represents conservative thought in Barbados, was opposed to emigration.

### Another West Indian Ascends the Bench

The King has been pleased to approve the appointment of William Andrian Date, Chief Secretary, Windward Islands, as Puisne Judge of the Supreme Court of the Windward and Leeward Islands.

Mr. Date was born in 1908, in Granada, and educated at Granada Boys' School and Lodge School, Barbados. He was called to the Bar by the Middle Temple in 1930, and was in private practice in Granada and St. Vincent before being appointed as a magistrate, sub-collector and district officer in St. Lucia in 1933. He was promoted to be Crown Attorney, St. Vincent, in 1939, and transferred to Jamaica as Legal Drafts man in 1944. He took up his present post in 1947.

### Barbados House Passes Adult Suffrage Bill

A Bill allowing every person 21 years old and over to vote at general elections, and abolishing property qualifications for persons seeking election to the House, has been passed by the Barbados House of Assembly. Should this Bill be passed by the Legislative Council, and so become law, it will mark the end of a long struggle for political emancipation, which began in 1930.

It was in 1930 that the first Bill seeking to lower the income qualification of voters was introduced in the House. This was defeated, it was not until 1943 that the income qualification was reduced to \$96 a year, and the vote was given to women.

The present Bill also reduces the quorum for the 24-member House from 12 to nine members.

### Barbados Commerce Resents Non-Representation

Lack of representation of commercial interests among the members of the Barbados Legislative Council was a topic of complaint at the annual general meeting of the Chamber of Commerce. The subject was raised by A. R. Toppin, who said that on the Council were doctors, planters and representatives of all other sections of the community, except the most important one, which was commerce.

Last member of the Legislative Council, who might have been said to have been representing commerce, was Hon. D. G. Leacock, who recently resigned the presidency of the Council.

Members of the Legislative Council are not elected, but are appointed by the King on the recommendation of the Governor.

### Closing Seawell Airport to Heavy Planes

Seawell Airport, Barbados, is being closed to heavy aircraft for about three weeks to permit work to continue on the new runway being built at the aerodrome. Meanwhile, British West Indian Airways will be required to use their lighter planes, and heavy aircraft, like Trans-Canada Airlines skyliners, which call at Barbados weekly, will land at Trinidad and transfer their Barbados-bound passengers to Bwia.

The new runway is expected to go into use in September.

### Barbados Advertising Abroad

Barbados is now advertising its tourist attractions in Great Britain, Canada, the United States, and Venezuela, according to the latest report of the Barbados Publicity Committee, which shows that 17,212 passengers disembarked at Barbados during the year under review including more than 800 from Venezuela and 517 from U. S.

### Police Move to Combat Juvenile Delinquency

The Barbados Police are moving to combat juvenile delinquency by launching a Boy's Club for the underprivileged to keep them off the streets and help them to avoid temptation. Col. R. T. Michelin, Commissioner of Police, who started working on the idea when he noticed that last year 700 juveniles were taken before the courts, is interesting Sportsmen in the conduct of the club, and hopes to have centers in other parts of the island.
