Son muchas las personas que se han acercado a nosotros a pedirnos que nos interese en nuestro semanario, a fin de que la actual Catedral sea reconstruida de acuerdo con las necesidades de espacio que requieren una población tan densa como lo es la Ciudad de Limón.

Efectivamente, nuestro primer templo católico resulta insuficiente para dar cabida con comodidad, al

numero público que asiste a los oficios religiosos.

En una ciudad de clima caliente, los lugares públicos deben ser bastante amplios a fin de que los que asisten gocen de comodidad y confort. No porque sea un lugar de oración y meditación debe pensarse que el devoto puede soportar calor e incomodidad; al contrario, eso lo distrae y no le hace agradable el rato de recogimiento espiritual.

El templo debe ser acogedor no sólo por sus ministros sino también por lo cómodo.

Our Task

FROM OUR DESK

BY THE EDITOR

The war in Korea is now occupying the minds of the nations, both the democracies and the communists or Reds.

The aggressors should be mindful of the Nazis' ambition to conquer the world and to set up their boasted superior race,— an ambition which had a still-birth. We must admit that Russia played a great part in destroying Hitler's plan, but on the other hand no one can reasonably regard the Kremlin as having anything like a stainless record in the years since the Allied Victory. The Moscow Press has never ceased its continuous propaganda against its allies of World War II. We have reports from time to time of the bad behaviour of Russian Representatives at the United Nations and other important conferences. Then seemingly, Russia became peeved of the termination of the United States Lend Lease, the Military support extended to Turkey whom he wishes for a feast, the decision to keep the secret of the discovery of the atomic bomb and for the admission of Western Germany into the North Atlantic Security Pact.

No doubt, the aggression of the communists in Korea was a trap set to see if the United Nations would keep their pledge to go to the aid of any Member State of the North Atlantic Security Pact. However, this strategy fell short of its goal for President Harry S. Truman, true to the fundamental principles of the Pact, a somewhat ruin sister to the Monroe Doctrine did not hesitate to send armed forces to the help of the Southern Koreans. Any nation or people who believe they will enjoy perpetual independence of governments and human liberties under communist domination are deeply mistaken and will drink from the bitter cup in due process of time.

These are described in a report on British Territories in East and Central Africa issued by the Colonial Office yesterday. It surveys five years of steady progress not only in agriculture but also in economic, social and political spheres.

The mounting pace of change under British administration in these African territories during the past five years is thrown into sharp relief by this report. It tells of the period of material prosperity with high prices stimulating output and of the continuing growth in social services for all communities. It also details the many plan for economic development which are laying a sure foundation for a permanently higher level of production and trade in Africa.

"Education, medical services and housing have made advances which would startle anyone who knew East Africa as it was fifty years ago. Nothing is more striking than

the universal and insistent demand for education in postwar Africa today."

It is still less than one hundred years ago that the famous British explorer, David Livingstone by his historic journey across Africa drew the attention of the world to the state of the Central African peoples. Fired by his achievement other explorers from western countries made their way to the interior of this vast continent. From his pioneer action have sprung the growing benefits enjoyed by African peoples today in their progress towards responsible self government.

A Decree of the Legislative Assembly

By the Official Gazette of August 5, 1950 we call the following for the benefit of the non-Spanish readers.

Article 1: — Reforming articles numbers 26 and 27 of Transit Law N° 63 of March 26, 1935 which reads as follow:

The General Direction of Transit will revoke the driver's license of any person who in this character or in other words indicated as responsible presumably in an accident which results in injuries or death to one or more persons in whose case the General Direction of Transit will also immediately proceed to revoke the wheel license and prevents the circulation of the vehicle by which the accident was caused with subjection to the licenses which in continuation explains.

However, when existent guarantee of security of civil responsibility, the judicial authority who knows of the happening may dictate a resolution restituting the circulation license. He can order also the res-

titution of the conductor's license if the accident does not turn up gravely and by which the operator would be assigned as dangerous to the security of persons and if no specific reiteration. If no existent security, the licenses, both of the vehicle and driver will only be restituted when there is refallen delinquency definitely or firm absolving

sentence or if previously rendered guarantee: but in this latter case the conductor's license will only be regrant if the occurrence which caused its suspension is not of a serious character. Even when there is no existent security the vehicle licenses may be restituted at any moment by judicial resolution if it treats with a Transport Company

On The Russian Military Power

Europe conquered in Ten Days

(Continued from last issue)

To avoid this tragedy, the strategy of the West must be devised with a view to keeping Western Europe from being overrun by the initial attack of the Red Army.

The choice of the Rhine as a defense line would mean sacrificing Germany. Germany is itself defenseless. The responsibility for its defense lies with the Western Powers. The German people, knowing the Russians and fully aware of what they have to expect, put their trust only in the West. If the Western Powers abandon Germany, millions of German men will join the Red Army to fight against the West, men who will feel they have been sacrificed and betrayed by the West and have nothing more to lose.

Advancing a thin defense line to the Elbe would not solve the problem or make it too difficult for the Russians to overrun Western Germany.

One cannot assume that formations of the Western Powers would obstinately defend a line several hundred miles east of their own fortified borders.

Confronted by superior Russian forces, they will look back and ask themselves why they should die on German soil. Therefore, the German Government's anxiety when asking for military security is fully understandable.

The Eastern border of Germany can only be defended with hope of success if they are occupied as a defensive zone by strong military formations and if those positions can be manned in a few hours. Furthermore, it must be made certain that strong units of the Western Air Forces can enter the battle immediately.

Mists of Western Defence

Combined operations of land, sea-and-air forces must be planned and coordinated. Equally important is the establishment of a clear-cut chain of

command. The organization and training of formations in the framework of a Western European army is a self-evident prerequisite. Only rapid and coordinated intervention by strong forces of a decisive point can secure a decisive victory. The cold war can become hot between today and tomorrow, if there is the will to wage a war. Whoever looks for a pretext will find it.

The defence of Europe will then have to be organized on the continent with support by sea and air. The center of the defence must be shifted as far as possible to the East in order to preserve operational freedom, and to prevent the Russians from conquering another 40 to 60 million men and women as slave labourers or soldiers. The part that Germany is supposed to play must be decided by the Western Powers. Even if Germany wanted to, it could not now contribute to its own defense. If the West wants Germany, it is high time to revise high policy.

One might argue that technical progress, especially in the sphere of atomic energy, has created a completely

new concept of war. This is partially true. Strategy and military tactics depend on charges in the technical and scientific fields. Unchanged, however, is the human being who must fight the battles and unchanged are the laws of space and time. Unchanged is the need to hold and secure conquered territory by land armies. Therefore, World War 11 remains the most important lesson for the war of the future. The question whether a future war can be avoided cannot be answered with certainty. But it is certain that today only a policy based on force can preserve the peace.
