La Tardanza de Algunos Escolares

Hace varios meses hemos estado observando que varios padres de familia incumplen en su deber de mandar a sus hijos a la escuela a la hora correcta de entrada. Aparentemente no llevan en su recuerdo el hecho de que el niño que llega tarde pierde mucho y además se inculca en él esta mala costumbre, llegando a cometerla cuando sea hombre de trabajo en tiempos venideros. Los ejercicios de comienzo de la lección en general son de valor espiritual para el alumno. La oración de la mañana significa mucho, tanto al maestro como al niño. El canto, es un alivio a la mente y un consuelo al alma. La puntualidad es una de las más grandes cualidades que el joven debe poseer y apreciar. El hábito de la tardanza firmemente arraigado no puede abandonarse de inmediato; por eso, el niño que llega tarde a la escuela está apto a estar tarde en todo lo de su vida diaria.

Entendemos que los parientes presentarán una larga lista de excusas para disminuir su negligencia, pero estamos fuertes en nuestra opinión de que todas esas excusas son vencibles. La única dificultad suponemos sea, es la condición económica, porque realmente hay muchas madres que tienen que pensar profundamente para lograr proveer la taza de té y el pedazo de pan a sus hijos. Sin embargo, esto no es generalmente así; debemos notar también el otro lado del cuadro: aquellas madres que sus costumbres las detiene de acostarse temprano para levantarse temprano. Este tipo de madres no merecen los tributos gloriosos que extendemos a las madres en su aniversario, (Día de las Madres).

Escribimos esta nota como una solicitud a las madres para que cooperen con los maestros, para facilitarles su labor.

Si el camino que usamos en nuestros días escolares pudiera decir la rapidez con que corrimos aquella milla cada mañana para llegar a tiempo para la inspección general de la limpieza.

Nuestro estimado Director, creemos, deberá buscar métodos disciplinarios más efectivos para suprimir este hábito de tardanza.

Derechos del Niño

I.—El niño tiene derecho a un patrimonio hereditario, libre de toda clase de taras, que le proporcione el máximo de vitalidad favorable a su desenvolvimiento físico y mental.

Peligro que debe evitarse

Nuestra atención fué llamada al hecho de que varios niños menores de edad arriesgan sus vidas nadando a largas distancias mar adentro del Balneario Municipal.

Debe recordarse que hay tiburones que existen en todos los océanos y mares; así es que nadie puede decir en qué lugar no llegaran, ni en qué momento atacarán.

II.—El niño tiene derecho a una gestación normal garantizada por todos los medios de que la ciencia dispone y a que su madre sea protegida para cumplir de la mejor manera posible su función maternal.

III.—El niño tiene derecho a sus padres; por lo tanto ha de nacer siempre con honor y cualquiera que fueran las condiciones de su nacimiento está capacitado para el pleno y valioso desarrollo de su vida y de sus actividades sociales.

IV.—El niño tiene derecho al pecho de su madre y a una nutrición completa hasta el momento en que se le haya capacitado mediante una educación adecuada para que por sí mismo pueda ganarse la vida.

V.—El niño tiene derecho a la satisfacción de sus necesidades primordiales: alimentación, vestido, vivienda, curación, y a todos aquellos métodos de higiene que aseguren la conservación y desarrollo de su vitalidad.

VI.—El niño tiene derecho a no hallarse nunca abandonado ni moral ni materialmente; a tener un hogar o en su defecto a vivir en otro donde sea tratado como hijo.

VII.—El niño tiene derecho a vivir sin ser explotado ni en su persona ni en su trabajo y a que la sociedad lo proteja dándole facilidades para desarrollarse su vida sin que ésta sea desnaturalizada.

VIII.—El niño tiene derecho al respeto de todos en la formación de su personalidad, libre de todas aquellas influencias que en alguna forma atenten contra su pudor o que maltratan su conciencia de niño o perjudican su cuerpo.

IX.—El niño tiene derecho a la máxima educación posible de acuerdo con sus capacidades; a convertirse en un factor de su propia educación; a desarrollarse siguiendo los intereses propios de su edad y medios educativos adaptados a él.

X.—El niño tiene derecho a vivir su infancia, disfrutando de la alegría propia de este período de vida; tiene derecho a la paz en el hogar y fuera de él y a que la sociedad le proporcione todas las condiciones que favorezcan las sus con-

La Guerra en Korea

OUR TASK

FROM OUR DESK

BY THE EDITOR

For many months we are observing that several parents are failing in their duty which we consider to be of great importance,—that of getting off their children on time for school. They seem to be unmindful of the fact that the child late at school has much to lose. The exercises at the starting hour, in general is of marvellous spiritual value to the scholars. The morning prayer means much to teachers and scholars. The morning song is an ingredient to mind and soul. Punctuality is a great estate of which the young should become into possession and should be rarely prized. Habits of lateness firmly fixed cannot be suddenly thrown off and the child late at school is apt to be late throughout life.

We are very sensitive to the long list of excuses that these parents will come forward with for this negligence, but we are strong in our opinion that everyone is surmountable. The only set-back which we surmise to be difficult is the economical condition, for truthfully, there are many mothers who have to ponder deeply and scratch their heads to find the with-all for the cup of tea and slice of bread for their children, and no doubt, time creeps on with the wondering thought. However, this is not generally so. We must look also on the other side of the picture of those mothers whose social indulgence keep them away from the early to bed and early to rise system. This type of mothers do not merit the glorious tribute which we extended to Motherhood, but a fortnight ago.

There is a momentum in punctuality which serves as enhancement to a high mark in life. Parents, see to it that your children are ready on time for school. The teachers will appreciate your cooperation in this respect.

If the road we used in our school days could tell the story, it would tell how rapidly we ran that mile each morning in order to be on time for the teacher's inspection of clothing; to see the fingernails are free of dirt; to see that no foreign matter is in the ear; to see clean teeth; to see that the shoes are well cleaned and if barefoot to see that the feet are washed; to see that hair is well combed; the hair in which his pencil does not pass through freely is subject to question.

Our esteem Director and his staff should find a very effective measure to discipline the late arrivals at school. We are cognizant of the labour they exercise in trying to correct these habits, but seemingly talking alone will not effect the cure.

Jamaica Scouts to be Guests in London

The Jamaica Boy Scout Association has accepted an invitation from the London Scout Council for a patrol of six scouts under 18 to be guests of scouts of the City of London in the summer, 1951. The patrol will visit the Festival of Britain daily.

For the first two weeks the visitors will live in the homes of London scouts, and will spend the next three weeks in camp at Gilwell Park, home of British scouting.

Youth Hqtrs Now in Trinidad

The Secretariat of the Caribbean Federation of Youth has been transferred from Jamaica to Trinidad, with the Trinidad and Tobago Youth Council in charge.

The Federation is pushing plans to celebrate Caribbean Youth Week beginning Sunday, August 17, and climaxing with a Caribbean Fair to be held in Trinidad on Saturday, September 2.

Oil and Fats Talks to be held in Barbados

Further discussion of the oils and fats industry of the British Caribbean territories are taking place early next month, when the Working Committee of the Oils and Fats Conference meets at Barbados. Sir John Saint, retired Director of Agriculture in Barbados, will preside.

One of the matters for discussion is Trinidad's request to be allowed to sell raw oil outside the British Caribbean area.

Marryshow to Attend House of Commons Opening

Hon. T. A. Marryshow, veteran legislator of Grenada, has been selected by the elected members of the Wind-

ward Islands' legislatures to represent the Windwards (Grenada, St. Vincent, St. Lucia, Dominica) at the formal opening of the new House of Commons, London, in October.

Trinidad Appointed Attorney-General at Home

Trinidad-born Joseph Louis Mathieu-Perez, now acting as first Puisne Judge of Trinidad, has been appointed by the Secretary of the State for the Colonies as Attorney-General of Trinidad, to succeed J. Wilcox-Wilson. Mr. Mathieu-Perez was educated at St. Mary's College, Trinidad, and was called to the bar in 1917. He became City Magistrate in Port of Spain in 1936 and a judge in 1941. He will be 52 in September.

Grand Juries to be Abolished in Barbados

The Barbados House of Assembly has given unanimous approval to a Bill providing for the abolition of grand juries and the institution of alternative procedure. The Bill, which was moved by Granly H. Adams Leader of the House, was based on the Act of 1933 which abolished grand juries in the United Kingdom.

The function of a grand jury in Barbados is to decide whether or not an accused person has a case to answer before the criminal Court of Grand Sessions. It was an essential step in the legal process when laymen held positions as magistrates and judges, but now that all these posts are filled by trained lawyers, the need for this lay jury no longer exists.

Suffrage Bill Goes to Committee

The Legislative Council of Barbados has asked a Select Committee to report on the bill to provide for adult suffrage, the reduction of the number necessary

Few Controls Remain in B. G.

Only distribution controls remaining on commodities in British Guiana are those on galvanized iron sheets, still in short supply, saw teeth, and white pine lumber, imported in limited quantities from hard currency sources.

All of British-Guiana's imported foodstuffs became free from internal control with the recent removal of distribution restrictions from flour, salted fish, condensed milk, split peas and corned beef.

Control was also recently removed from iron and steel bars and rods, iron spikes and barbed wire.

Pushing Peanut Plans

A huge peanut industry supplementary to the tomato industry existing there is being organized in St. Elizabeth, Jamaica, and a company is negotiating for the purchase of the recently closed cassava factory in north St. Elizabeth for manufacturing peanut oil and cake for export.
