El horario
DE GREENWICH

Sabido es que recientemente, a principios de febrero último, acordó el Gobierno francés la adopción del horario de Greenwich. Por virtud de esta disposición, el meridiano de París ha tenido que retrasearse nueve minutos y veintiún segundos, y así ya corre parejas con el de Greenwich. Pero este horario no ha sido adoptado para el mundo naval francés, que continuará rigiéndose por el que hasta ahora tenía con objeto de evitar el improbo trabajo y los innombrables gastos que supondría alterar las cartas y las instrucciones marítimas para adaptarlas al nuevo sistema; resultando que la hora legal en Francia para las transacciones civiles es de Greenwich, mientras que el meridiano de París continuará imponiendo en la marina militar y mercante y en los observatorios astronómicos.

El horario de Greenwich no es adoptado por todo el mundo, ni aún por toda Europa. Este tipo de hora lo siguen la Gran Bretaña, Bélgica, Holanda, España, Portugal y ahora Francia y Argel. Otra sección de Europa, que comprende Alemania, Suiza, Austria-Hungría, Italia, Noruega, Suecia y Dinamarca, marcha con una hora de retraso á aquel tiempo; retraso que llega á dos horas en Bulgaria, Rumania, Turquía, Egipto y Este de África. Norte América se ha dividido para este efecto en cinco secciones, Internacional, Oriental, Central, Montaña y Pacífico, que tienen respectivamente, standard time cuatro, cinco, seis, siete y ocho horas adelantadas al horario de Greenwich.

**CORONATION WEEK
BROUGHT TO A
CLOSE.****FORTY-EIGHT MILES
OF WARSHIPS.**

Portsmouth, England, June 24.—Coronation week was brought to a brilliant and spectacular close-to-day with a great naval review at Spithead, where forty-eight miles of warships were reviewed by King George and Queen Mary and by invited representatives of the Naval powers of the day.

The review not only provided a deeply impressive spectacle, but it afforded abundant material for forming an adequate idea of the vast extent of Great Britain's sea powers. Anchored in six main columns with smaller craft in flanking lines every ship dressed and newly painted, the fleet presented a magnificent spectacle as the Royal yacht "Victoria and Albert," bearing Their Majesties escorted by two other yachts, the "Alexandra" and the "Alberta" and by several ocean liners carrying the Royal guests, the colonial representatives and Members of Parliament passed through the line of ships.

The fleet occupied eight square miles of anchorage between the Isle of Wight and the mainland and between the entrance to Portsmouth harbour and the Bramble Bank. The British vessels were assembled in five long main lines, the foreign vessels forming the sixth line. One hundred and seventy warships were flying the British flag. Included in the list were thirty-two battleships, among them the "Dreadnought," "Neptune," "St. Vincent," "Collingwood," "Formidable," "Prince of Wales," "Africa," "Dominion," "Agememnon," "New Zealand," "King Edward VII," "Superb" and "Lord Nelson." The armoured cruisers numbered twenty-five, and included such modern and formidable fighting machines as the "Indomitable," "Inflexible," "Invincible," "Defence," and "Invincible." In addition to the armoured cruisers there were nine protected cruisers. The remainder of the great fleet comprised seventy destroyers, twelve torpedo boats, eight submarines and a number of supply ships and other auxiliary craft.

Flying the Stars and Stripes the giant battleship "Delaware" of the United States Navy stood out conspicuously among the foreign warships. The "Delaware" of 20,000 tons displacement was the heaviest ship of the entire fleet, either British or foreign.

The "Von Der Tann," of the German Navy, was the next largest foreign warship in line. Next to the "Delaware" and the "Von Der Tann," the "Dresden" from France, and the "Radetzki" from Austria and the "Kurama" from Japan claimed most attention in the foreign line. Next in point of strength was the Italian cruiser "San Marco." The other foreign warships included the "Reina Regente" from Spain, the "Buenos Ayres" from Argentina, the "Chacabuco" from Chile, the "Hamidiel" from Turkey, the "Fylgia" from Sweden, the "Rossoia" from Russia, "Hai-Chi" from China, the "Giorgios Averof" from Greece, the "Bisvald" from

Norway, and the Jacob Van Heemskerk from Holland.

The progress of the Royal yacht "Victoria and Albert" along the lines occupied several hours. All the while the ships kept up a roar of salutes. The ships' sides were manned with sailors at the attention, the quarter decks were thronged with officers and marine guards; red-coated bands played "God save the King," while the bosuns' whistles piped out the order of the day.

After the "Victoria and Albert" had made its tour of the anchored line, it took its station near the "St. Vincent," "Collingwood" and other vessels comprising the first battle squadron. Admiral Togo, of Japan, Admiral Vreeland representing the United States Navy together with other foreign naval officers and also the flag and commanding officers of the British fleet paid their respects to the Sailor King, who received formally on the quarter deck of the Royal yacht. As the officers in full dress uniform and attended by the members of their staffs, came over the side of the yacht they were greeted by the blast of the bugles, the ruffles of drums and finally by a cordial handshake from His Majesty.

Their Majesties, accompanied by the official envoys of other countries, came from London in a special train. The King wore an Admiral's uniform with a robe of the Order of the Garter. The Prince of Wales in Midshipman's uniform; Princess Mary and nearly all of the Royal ladies were dressed in navy blue. With Their Majesties were all the other members of the Imperial family. Many special trains were run from London carrying Indian Princes, Peers and Peeresses, Members of Parliament, and others of the Admiralty and Diplomats.

NEW INTERNATIONAL HYMNS
SUNG IN AMERICAN
CHURCHES.

New York.—In many churches in America, particularly the Protestant Episcopal, what is known as a new international hymn was sung. The air is "American" or "God Save the King," and the words voice the sentiment for peace and arbitration and general good feeling between Great Britain and this country. The special reason for its use was that it was the Sunday before the coronation. Part of the hymn follows:—

Two empires by the sea,
Two nations great and free,
One anthem raise,
One race of ancient fame,
One tongue, one faith, we claim;
One God whose glorious name
We love and praise.
Deeds often do fathers wrought,
What battles we have fought,

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**UNSUCCESSFUL
DASH.****Wounded in Attempting to
Rescue Unfaithful Girl.****Brown Now Lies In Hospital****SUFFERING FROM SHOT**

George Brown, for demanding the surrender of his girl Letitia from the room of another man at Cahuita, was shot in his right thigh on Friday night.

It appears that Brown and his paramour lived together at Cahuita for a long time, but for some reason or other she deemed it best to divide her love between him and another man. It is said that when Brown is in Letitia's company it is "my own dear boy"; but when far from him and in the presence of the other man it is, "I love you and only you dearly," and so it went on till the climax came.

Brown got a wink of it and like a good general set to work and devised plans to entrap the enemy with his prize bird. So well planned was the campaign that it did not take more than half an hour to surround the camp where his unfaithful girl and his opponent were securely locked up.

He commanded her to come out of the house at once, threatening to fire on the camp if she did not obey him. This apparently did not scare Letitia or her then general. The man either refused to let the girl out of the room or she was not inclined to have the flag of truce raised, thereby allowing the camp door to be opened.

However, the girl remained under cover and would not budge. This caused Brown, to be more enraged and through this defiance he swelled and fumed and threatened vengeance but to no effect, his girl was securely locked up in the arms of the other man, whom she loved.

The ordeal becoming too great for him he decided to beat a retreat, and like a crest-fallen soldier that was bereft of all honor and without the hope of a medal started a slow march from the yard towards his house, but before he covered much ground an army of dogs made a charge at him. Brown then showed what he intended otherwise. Drawing a revolver which he carried in his back pocket fired on them laying low in death one of them.

A policeman that was in the vicinity of the place heard the report of the fire arm, and on learning what transpired between Brown and his girl made for the yard where he was. He called him, but instead of obeying the "bobby" he took to his heels which proved a faithful member, as he easily outdistanced the police and got out of sight.

When the upstart calmed down to some extent the man returned to his yard and a little while after the policeman appeared on the scene accompanied by another man. Brown told our "scribe" that he heard the remark "see 'im day," and before he had time to look round he received a bullet in the back of his right thigh from the gun the policeman carried, which passed through coming out in front without fracturing a bone.

Brown was placed in a room until next day (Saturday) when

he was put in a boat and conveyed to Limon where on arrival he was put on a stretcher and taken to the United Fruit Company's Hospital. The policeman was sent on foot by way of the beach unescorted. This being so we cannot vouch for his presence in Limon.

George Brown is a young man about 26 years of age and is a native of Jamaica. He is not in a dangerous condition and expects to be discharged from hospital at an early date.

Ward. Col. Ward had done his best for the city and for the island. If any one man in Jamaica was entitled to or should have received some distinction on this occasion, that person was Colonel Ward.

Dr. Love seconded, Mr. Simpson did not feel ready to say anything on the subject. Little had been said because people did not care to say what they felt.

As a mark of respect to Colonel Ward, the vote was taken, all the members standing.

It was voted that the resolution be withdrawn.
