Es absolutamente innecesario recordarla, una vez más, las innumerables pruebas de aquella afirmación, ya que son abundante mente conocidas en todo el Continente.

Sigue en pie el Conflicto del Tranvía de PENSURTH

Todavía no ha sido fijada la tarifa por la Secretaría de Fomento para el transporte de bananos

Ni los contratistas por una parte ni la Cooperativa por la otra se han puesto de acuerdo sobre una tarifa provisional y en cada embarque surgen dificultades ambas compañías.

Entendemos que la Secretaría de Fomento ha ordenado que mientras se aprueba esa tarifa se ajusten los contratistas al precio fijado en un decreto del año 35 que fija más o menos estas actividades en relación con acarreo de bananos en tranvías particulares.

Seguiremos informando sobre este particular que estimamos de mucho interés para la zona agrícola ya que el valle del atlántico está produciendo actualmente de tres a cuatro mil racimos por semana con enorme beneficio para los pequeños agricultores de esa región.

El Aeropuerto Nuestro

Cuando hace algunos años se inauguró el aeropuerto de esta ciudad, no se pensó siquiera en el asombroso desarrollo que la guerra daría a la aviación comercial. Quizá por eso se hizo entonces un pequeño trabajo en relación con nuestras necesidades que no eran muchas.

El edificio que se construyó, y que aún subsiste, no puede llenar las necesidades actuales. Nuestro campo de aterrizaje es actualmente puerto de escala en las rutas internacionales.

En estas condiciones es necesario acondicionar no solamente lo que ahora usamos como aeropuerto sino organizar sus servicios con mayor eficiencia.

Actualmente los pasajeros que llegan del exterior son conducidos en un camión bastante incómodo, desde el aeropuerto hasta la Oficina del Jefe de Sanidad. De allí a la Capitanía del Puerto, y de esta a la Aduana para el registro de los equipajes. Se pierden en estas tramitaciones dos o tres horas con el correspondiente disgusto de los pasajeros que no tiene por qué soportar nuestra organización deficiente. Estos atrasos, estas dificultades tienen forzosamente que alejar el turismo en vez de atraerlo como debería ser nuestro propósito.

Debería ser en el propio aeropuerto donde se hiciera la revisión de documentos y equipajes, antes de que los pasajeros recorran la ciudad. Si están enfermos pueden dejar el contagio en el avión que usan. Si no tienen los papeles en regla pueden fugarse en tanto atreído y si traen mercadería o contrabando peligroso en tanta visita y revuelta pueden escamotearla con entera facilidad.

The demand for the surrender of the Serbian Sovereignty and Independence to Austria was made by the Government of Austria, but it was the voice of Germany since on the 5th of July 1914 Germany had told Austria that whatever Austria's decision might turn out to be, that Government could count with certainty that Germany would stand behind her as an ally and friend; thus began World War I or the 1914-1919 August-November conflict.

The 1939-1945 gigantic struggle had also its almost insignificant start with the nazi aggression on Poland. Leading statesmen of the Universe had seemingly taken for amusement the egotistical announcement of Hitler's from the German Third Reich, but as stated above the nazi "war of nerves" or Hitler's method of stealthy war of conquest by demoralization and intrigue had its first minor beginning in the annexation of Austria; then the Sudeten "crisis" of September 1938, classified as the second dress rehearsal; — then and on followed the Czech territory in March 1939.

Our democracies are to man well these incidents and bear always in mind that history repeats itself. The cold bloody fact is; that we in the Western Hemisphere must watch our steps with the fastly advancing strange doctrines; — systems that are direct opposite to our civilization and will, in process of time operate against our freedom and liberties. The introduction of any formula tends, to sop the vitality of our industries and to stir consanation with Labour and Capital is not the best interest of the masses.

It is a naked truth that where there is no vision the people perish. It behooves us in our Continent to see through our own eyes; let us approach our government and Capitalists for the things we need in our characteristic mutual understanding manner; the manner according to that spoken by the mouths of the sages:

"Seek and ye shall find; — knock and it shall be opened; ask and it shall be given".

We stood almost to the man and with grim determination and effective collaboration destroyed the common enemy, but our thought is chilled with fear that if a contrary wind blows the scene would be changed.

Our thought is expressed in the vien of real democracy and without malice to any.

On a rainy mid-day after leaving the kitchen stove the exposure would be dangerous to the poor wanderer, covering at some points, more than a mile.

A RATHER INCONSISTENT ACTION

We are now experiencing what is termed as a rather inconsistent action on the part of some of our agents by returning to us, in fact, occasional weekly supplies of the Atlantic Voice, and with the statement that the issue reached its destination at a late date.

We believe that a little human thought should stir such agents to the fact that the mailing system is entirely out of the control of the personnel of the news organ; we have no command to do rect rapid delivery; it should be borne also in mind that if the newspaper is printed in San José on a Saturday; it is evident that it could not be on time for the local train on the same day; then there is no such service on Sunday, therefore, the packages would be sent by Monday's mail for such stations with only local stops, such as Pacurite, etc.

Bataan, 25 Miles
April 1946
The Editor, Atlantic Voice,
Port Limon, Costa Rica.
Dear Sir:

Permit me a little space in your paper for some Easter thoughts:
The Easter Season refreshes our memory to the incident to the Redemption of the world by Our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ; nearly two thousand years ago, yet it is within us as yesterday Redemption as we truly know, is the deliverance of mankind from the curse and penalty of sin through the sacrifice made by our Redeemer and in whom we have redemption through His blood; the forgiveness of sins, Jesus Christ the Eternal Son of God, who became man and so was and continues to be God and man; in two distinct natures and One Person forever. St. John I Chapter—IV verse reads—"In the beginning was the word and the word was with God, and the word was God. The word was made flesh and dwelt among us in His glory, the glory of the Only Begotten of the Father; full of grace and truth."
It would be easy, no doubt to get many different answers to this question — "What is the greatest truth in the world? But I do not see how there can be

any other than one answer; to those of us who believe in the Christian faith. The greatest truth that ever has been in the world: "By my Faith — is the truth of the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ of which I live to memory at this time."

BULLETINS FROM BRITAIN

GAMMEXANE (made of 666 prepared more dead) to certain insects than any substance previously tested. It was called Gammexane.

British scientists have discovered a new insecticide dead—among others pests—to locusts.

We know from the Arabian Nights that many centuries ago Arabs held the secret of mixing herbs into a powder which had the power of killing insects. But with the passage of time this secret was lost to the world and it was only 70 to 80 years ago that chemicals were first used for the destruction of pests like locusts, cockroaches and beetles. These chemicals, though moderately effective, were not at all satisfactory since they were poisonous to animal life as well as to insect, and were thus dangerous if they came in contact with any form of food, such as fruit.

It was abundantly evident that some new chemical substance should be evolved which could kill insects and yet be impotent to harm animals — including the human race. The production of such a chemical proved to be a difficult problem and for many years scientists toiled in vain to find a solution. In 1934, however, a team of scientists employed by the great British concern Imperial Chemical Industries concentrated on the task, and during the next eight years tested many thousands of chemical leads to ascertain their worth as insecticides. At last, early in 1942 they tested a chemical which seemed promising. This was a substance discovered over a century ago by the eminent British scientist Faraday, and can be called 666 for short — the chemical formula being C₆H₆Cl₆.

"MORE DEADLY FORM"
During the summer of 1942, 666 was tried on a number of insect pests but the results, though encouraging, were not consistent. Further experiments were then carried out and various possibilities were investigated, to find the cause of this inconsistency. Within a few months the answer was found, and a

POSTSCRIPTS

April, a synthetic was discovered by British scientists, it shortly to go into large-scale production. It will take the place of natural waxes—used for high-pressure lubrication, textile finishing, gramophone records and cosmetics. Carbon-paper and printing inks will also benefit from the new discovery. April will provide insulation in radio and emulsion in waterproofing, as well as highly polished furniture. The new product has the important advantage of low price compared with natural vegetable waxes.

United Kingdom manufacturers have just produced what are believed to be the largest stainless-steel tubs in the world. They are 14 inches outside diameter, one quart of an inch

thick, and over 20 feet in length. They are to be used in food plant and will be subject to severe high-frequency vibrations.

LIQUID SPRING SUSPENSION

Radio instruments in bombing units sealed aircraft cases were shown working in boiling water at the Radio Components Exhibition recently held in London. This striking demonstration was one of several emphasizing the close attention being paid by British manufacturers to the design of apparatus suitable for severe tropical conditions. Seventy nine firms took part in the exhibition, which contained ingenious war-winning technical developments side by side with entirely new devices for peacetime production. A notable feature of almost every exhibit was the remarkable reduction in weight and size compared with its counterpart part of a few years ago.

Britain has produced a revolutionary suspension system likely to make obsolete existing methods of springing and shock-absorbing.

This development—the liquid spring—was evolved during the war by British experts in aircraft undercarriage production to assist the aircraft designer in reducing the weight of his machine. It is one of the developments which enable Britain's bombers to carry ever-increasing loads in safety.

In peacetime it will assist in industry and transport by air road and sea. Where the new British spring is used, construction will be simplified, dead-weight reduced and efficiency increased.

Previously, suspension systems have used metal springs, rubber springs or compressed air. Oil was used as an auxiliary only, for shock-absorbing or damping-down movement.

The new simple system uses oil to do the full job, thus obviating many complications and the risk of failure of rubber by climate, and leakage of compressed air.

The principle applied is the compression of liquids under high pressures. This was once believed to be contrary to physical principles and therefore impossible, and later was considered impracticable on a commercial scale. Wartime research, however, proved that all liquids can be compressed and that liquid springs can be produced superior in resiliency and durability to those previously available to the engineer.

Paraffin, subjected to a pressure of 11,000 pounds to a sq. inch, can be reduced in volume by 5 per cent; under pressure of 50,000 pounds to a square inch the reduction is 15 per cent.

Further research in war-time Britain led to the production of a special light mineral oil which could be compressed by over 17 per cent, at 50,000 pounds and by 20 per cent at 60,000 pounds a square inch. Even greater compressions by using pressures of the order of 100,000 pounds are likely to be obtained with new oils.

Perspex plastic is not a general substitute for all materials; its potentialities lie in doing an existing job more effectively, and in enabling valuable jobs to be done for the first time.

British scientists and manufacturers are cooperating over an enormous and varied field and are discovering how best to make Perspex useful and widely available in the service of mankind.

SKULL SURGERY

Already bone substitutes have been used in plastic surgery and in bone replacement operations. Rapid polymerisation, or setting, can be achieved with the aid of high frequency short wave apparatus, the whole process taking only ten minutes.

An important new development in the surgery of the skull has been made possible. Unplasticised fully polymerised Perspex sheet is heated on a hot-plate to about 130 degrees centigrade, to make it workable. It is then hand-pressed on a negative mould which has been built up from a Zelex impression, which can be speedily obtained.

The moulded Perspex can now be fitted at the original operation. Another rapid method is to combine the acrylic with a setting agent which accelerates the hardening, rapidly and harmlessly. After exposure to the polymerising effects of an ultra-violet lamp the finished shape is ready for fitting.

Perspex can be used for the external splinting of limbs. Unlike plaster, it is transparent, light and allows the passage of ultra-violet radiations. Experiments are being made using an absorbent filler in the acrylic, which will allow for the removal of perspiration, thus giving all the advantages of plaster-of-paris together with greater ease of removal. The new method will be clean in use and will avoid water being brought against the skin surface.

The wide variety of uses for the new material puts it in a class with steel. In fact, weight for weight, it has almost the same strength, though it is structurally much more bulky.
