POSTURAS DIFICILES

Se ha revuelto el Partido Demócrata ante la posibilidad de que el Poder Ejecutivo reciba del Banco Nacional de Seguros los siete millones que en justicia le corresponden. Y se ha revuelto porque a su política de oposición sistemática no conviene que esos dineros lleguen a la Secretaría de Hacienda y le permitan al Gobierno establecer un poco sus finanzas y desarrollar un plan de trabajo que alivie muchas necesidades. Dificil y peligrosa para su propio prestigio esa política que ahora choca con la razón y la justicia.

Pero ya que la hicieron, vale la pena anotar al margen de sus empeños unas pocas necesidades que se refieren a la provincia de Limón y que podrían llenarse con una infima parte de esos siete millones.

El puente de Cieneguita está completamente inútil. Ofrece un constante peligro para toda clase de vehículos. Cualquiera día de éstos se viene abajo y entonces quedarán inconcomunicados el campo de aterrizaje, el Barrio de Cieneguita, la población de Westfalia y todas las fincas que se extienden en esa región.

Para los dos únicos camiones que tenemos en esta ciudad, son necesarios de toda urgencia un camión que transporte el material y una apiladora que apisoné el macadam. En la forma faraónica en que ahora se está haciendo resulta costoso y deficiente.

Entre el final del tranvia de Penhurth y la ciudad de Cahuita hay un trecho de quinientos metros dentro de cacatales donde es indispensable abrir una trocha para comunicar esta población con la línea férrea.

Pero estas necesidades al azar entre otras muchas, no pueden llenarse por falta de dinero. No sería justo solicitar del gobierno el sacrificio de ese gasto si sabemos que no hay dinero para pagar a los empleados.

Veán pues los señores del Partido Demócrata cómo es indispensable ese dinero que duerme en las arcas del Banco de Seguros un sueño de inutilidad que no es explicable en estos momentos de angustia nacional. Es lamentable que sus empeños por obstaculizar toda labor o iniciativa del gobierno pongan en peligro el bienestar económico de muchas gentes pobres, y paralicen toda acción de progreso y bienestar del país. ¡Qué postura más triste y más difícil!

Sesión extraordinaria de la Municipalidad de Limón, iniciada a las diecinueve horas del quince de mayo de mil novecientos cuarenta y cinco con asistencia de los señores señores Hernández, quien presidió, Heibron, Salas y Esquivel. Estuvieron presentes los jefes de dependencias municipales señores Arrázola, Barrantes, Martínez, Montero, Mora, Mogría, Vindás y Zeledón.

Artículo I.—Acta: Se leyó, aprobó y firmó acta de la sesión anterior.

Artículo II.—Se acordó al tenor el orden del día y conocer de los problemas que presentan la falta de agua en la cañería y la interrupción en los servicios de alumbrado.

Artículo III.—Discutido el problema de la cañería, en todos sus detalles, se acordó invertir el dinero del empréstito, haciendo las gestiones pertinentes para ello, en el acondicionamiento de las bombas del río Banano, de preferencia a cualquier otro trabajo. Comparar por cuenta municipal hasta dos motores diesel nuevos que reúnan los requisitos técnicos necesarios para el trabajo a que se van a destinar, equipados con las bombas respectivas. Nominar una comisión integrada por el señor Gobernador, los señores Regidores Hernández, Salas y el señor Apoderado, Licencia don Daniel Zeledón Umaña, para que se entrevisten con los técnicos que se den las especificaciones de los motores y sus accesorios y hagan las gestiones que estimen pertinentes para conseguir las prioridades que se necesitan para que las casas manufactureras los despachen, solici-

tando la cooperación del señor Presidente de la República, del señor Embajador de los Estados Unidos, personeros del Servicio Cooperativo Interamericana de Salud Pública y demás funcionarios que puedan intervenir para que esas máquinas sean recibidas en el plazo más corto posible. Acuerdo definitivo.

Artículo IV.—El Regidor Salas pidió se dejara constancia de que la Municipalidad ha tomado una larga serie de medidas tendientes a remediar el mal funcionamiento de las bombas de Río Banano, como consta de las actas y pueda decirse que así en todas las sesiones algún acuerdo o resolución se ha tomado en ese sentido.

Artículo V.—El Regidor Hernández pidió se leyera el contrato que regula los servicios que presta la Compañía Eléctrica de Limón; así se hizo y el mismo Regidor puntualizó las cláusulas que dicha compañía no ha cumplido, entre ellas el pago del uno por ciento de sus entradas brutas como impuesto en favor de la Corporación, sobre lo que existe en la Secretaría de Gobernación, sin haberse resuelto, una apelación planteada por dicha empresa al acuerdo municipal que ordena cobrar las sumas respectivas. Se acordó definitivamente: que el señor Apoderado Municipal haga un estudio del contrato a fin de determinar qué cláusulas no han sido cumplidas e indique el modo de exigir su inmediato cumplimiento; además se comisiona a las mismas personas que indica el acuerdo anterior a fin de que constituya en la Secretaría

pues el salario mínimo decretado para estos trabajadores es de diez colones por ocho horas de jornada, ordinaria legal que corresponde a dicho salario, a pesar de esto se ha pagado diez colones diarios por 10 horas de trabajo.

La resolución del punto primero o sea el relativo a la jornada de los maquinistas y conductores etc. se dejó para cuando sea dictado el reglamento respectivo.

Problema de los salarios

En la imposibilidad de llegar en la conversación a resolver este problema dada la actitud de los representantes de la Compañía se convino en entrar en conversaciones para conocer de un plan concreto y especificado que los representantes de Sindicato presentarian. JAPAN'S METROPOLITAN AREA OBJECT OF DISASTROUS AERIAL ATTACKS

Tokyo has been so terribly devastated by the aerial attacks effected, since the latter part of February last, by large squadrons of the B-29 superfortresses, that competent circles declare it may no longer be regarded as of military importance.

Nearly one hundred and forty square kilometers of the city were up to last Saturday laid in ruins with the destruction of more than one hundred military objectives, which include factories of heavy war material and electric equipment, naval, military and railroad installations, as also a large number of smaller manufacturing plants. It was also released that the Imperial Palace, as well as that of Omiya were damaged, while the Temple of Sojo, the Legations of Finland and Sweden, the Imperial University and that of Buriko, were among the structures destroyed.

A radio broadcast from the doomed Capital stated that discount Kichujita Ibsi, member of the Privy Council and Deacon of the Diplomatic Service, was killed during the attack on the 25th ultimo. Dr. Yorusu Oda, member of the

Imperial Academy, and Thunji Taniguchi, vice Governor of the Bank of Japan, are also thought to have lost their lives.

More than 3,000 tons of incendiary bombs were discharged from 400 and odd flying superfortresses last Tuesday on Yokohama, Japan's second port of importance, causing serious damage to a number of maritime deposits and installations, automobile factories and ship-building yards. The fires initiated by the bombs also produced heavy losses in various sections. Other localities of military and industrial importance were

also the objects of disastrous raids during the past week.

A statement by General MacArthur places the losses suffered by the Japanese in the Philippine campaign at 378,000 or ten times those of the North Americans.

Following on the capture of Nanning, the Chinese troops have been advancing southward, and have now arrived at a point said to be eight kilometers off the frontier of Indo China. Other forces are reported advancing toward the old North American base at Liuchow.

60,000 houses were destroyed and 250,000 persons left homeless by the attack on Yokohama.

TROUBLE IN THE NEAR EASTERN REGIONS

Difficulties have arisen between France and the governing authorities of Syria and Libanus, which threaten developments of a serious character. Armed clashes have been occurring during the past several days and on Tuesday last the French troops are said to have opened artillery fire on the city of Damascus when came

the deaths of a large number of persons. The attack caused on the intervention of the British Minister, it was stated.

The trouble is said to have arisen by reason of the introduction into the country of a larger number of French troops than customary. Both Syria and Libanus are protectorates.

RAILROAD TRAVELLERS COMPLAIN OF LACK OF LIGHTING FACILITIES

We were visited a few days ago by some of the men who frequent the Abaca district of Manila. Their purpose was to complain of the inconveniences being experienced by the people who have to travel on the Limon-Manila freight and passenger combination, because of the lack of lighting facilities in the coaches.

According to the schedule under which this service operates, we are assured that the darkness of evening takes command while the train is "en route", especially during the rainy seasons.

Our visitors further stated there are occasions when travellers are gripped with fear by reason of the presence of a number of characters who are known to have no regard for either law or order, and who might take advantage of the darkness and resort to acts against their personal safety, particularly during the Cash orders or Pay Day periods.

They also complained that on account of the darkness many passengers have missed the points where they desired to alight much to their inconvenience. It is suggested that this could be remedied if one of the employees on the train were instructed to announce the name of each approaching station, as has been or still is the custom on other routes.

The great purpose of life is largely determined by a realization that it is incumbent on us to help others and give due consideration to their personal rights, whether they be our immediate neighbours or only members of the general public.

The ATLANTIC VOICE invites the attention of the Management of the Railroad to the matters complained about, and feel confident that, in keeping with their well known desire to do all things possible to maintain the Company's popularity and satisfy the legitimate requirements of the travelling public, they will effect such measures as may be deemed necessary.

An advice, emanating from Copenhagen, states that fifty Nazis, who had been members of the notorious Gestapo and acted as guards in the concentration camp of Troesley, in Denmark, were tried by an Allied military Court

and condemned to pay the death penalty. They were executed immediately.

The report releases the first indication that the Allied Powers, on the Western front, had commented the prosecution of Nazi war criminals

DDT, A NEW AND POWERFUL INSECTICIDE

According to the opinion of Brigadier General James Steven Simmons, Chief of Preventive Medicine in the Office of the Surgeon General of the United States Army, the war's greatest contribution to the future health of the peoples of the universe is a powerful insecticide known as "DDT".

"General Simmons says DDT "can kill many of our innumerable insect enemies, not only the annoying household pests and plant parasites that ravage our crops and food supplies, but also lice, mosquitoes and other dangerous blood-sucking insects which are responsible for the spread of typhus fever, malaria and other serious diseases.

The initials DDT, explain General Simmons, stand for the chemical term dichloro-

diphenyl trichloroethane, a stable, almost colorless and practically odorless crystalline solid.

Its value as a military weapon for the control of insect-borne diseases has been discovered and developed by scientists during the past two years, although the substance had been known for seventy years and its ability to kill certain insect pests of plants was observed about four years ago in Switzerland.

DDT is not soluble in water, but can be dissolved in many organic solvents, including kerosene and various other oils. Effective in infinitesimal small amounts, it can be used highly diluted as a powder or in oily solution.

Investigations to determine its safety for man showed that when used as a leu-

se powder, DDT can be safely applied to the human skin, and when properly diluted can be combined with oil and used in sprays without danger from inhalation. Also when used correctly in small amounts, as a mosquito larvicide, it can be added to water without killing fish or game. Solutions in oil applied to the walls of buildings or tents for periods of several weeks, kill all adult mosquitoes that light on them.

General Simmons states that reports from extensive tests indicate "DDT is the greatest weapon now available for continuing the fight against malaria", which disease, he points out, more than seventeen million patients were treated in sixty-five countries in 1932, while in India alone that year only one-tenth of the annual toll of one hundred million malaria cases, received treatment and seven million people died.

The army now has sufficient DDT louse powder to liberate the louse-infested liberated populations of Europe against typhus, and plans have been made for the dousing of approximately eighteen million persons displaced by the war. There is already DDT for emergency malaria control work in certain combat areas, and the supply will soon be adequate for expanding the agricultural studies.

controlled by France under a mandate given by the dejected League of Nations.

The French Government will, it is stated, agree to recognition of both countries, but will not retire their armed troops until certain conditions are complied with.

These include, we are told, guarantees for France's economic, cultural and strategic interests, in keeping with the terms of the treaties concluded 1918. Neither of the countries are willing, up to this time, to accept the conditions.

In addition to that which has occurred in Damasoa, disturbances are also reported

from A Eppo, Hains od Hamon.

It was stated in the House of Commons, London, that the British Government was in communication with that of the United States of America, in connection with the recent trouble happenings, and that consideration was being given the steps which should be taken.

It is of interest to note that the Government of Iron had requested Great Britain, North America and Russia to withdraw their troops, on the ground that the war in Europe having ceased, there was no reason for their continued presence in the territory of Iron.

MORE ALLIED GAINS IN PACIFIC

Everything indicates, we are told, that the final phase of the battle of Okinawa is in progress with the certain defeat of the Japanese forces, as the First Division of the North American Marines have penetrated the exterior fortifications of the enemy's key position of Shuri, while the seventh division of the regular army, operating from Sumizoto, threaten the encirclement of the remains of the Japanese garrison.

Tokyo admits that the organized resistance of their troops have been broken and that the Allied victory will have a decisive influence on the war in the Pacific.

It has been officially released by Washington that the Okinawa campaign has been the most costly for the North Americans up to this time. The number of casualties suffered up to the 23rd. of the past month was given as 3,444 while the naval units, which were either damaged or completely lost, reached a total of seventy-two.

The North American forces who operate on Luzon are reported to have destroyed resistance in the northeast, and

SOMETHING OF THE WAR CASUALTIES

According to Premier Churchill's announcement, last Tuesday, in the House of

Commons, the armed forces of the British Commonwealth of Nations suffered 1,128,315 casualties during sixty six months of fighting or from the start of hostilities to the end of February this year. The number killed is given as 307,201 and is included in the total.

These figures are apart from the losses suffered in consequence of aerial attacks over Great Britain, which caused 60,585 deaths among the civil population and injuries to 236,175.

Mr. Churchill also stated that during a period of fifty-two months in the first World War, the casualties of the British Empire totalled 3,286,000 including 996,230 killed.

A Washington release states that the casualties suffered by the army and navy of the United States of America, up to the 14th. ultimo, shewed a gross total of 996,029 of which the killed were 224,546.

BULLETINS FROM BRITAIN

25-POUNDER BLAST-ED WAY FOR "TEN TON TESSIE"

Air history was made when Lancasters dropped on a German target the RAF's largest bomb. "Ten Ton Tessie" weighs 22,000 pounds. A blast demolition bomb, it has a penetration even greater than that of the 12,000 lb. "earthquake" and it is packed with an explosive more highly concentrated, therefore even more highly effective, than that of the "earthquake". The devastation it causes is almost incredible.

In view of the fact that, so far as Germany at least is concerned, this 22,000 lb. bomb probably represents the culmination of the gradually, yet most impressively mounting weight of single bombs it is interesting to note the increase in bomb-weight and in bomb-load from the outbreak of war until the present day.

During the last war, bombs—comparatively few of which weighed more than 25 pounds—were at first thrown by hand from the aircraft and later released through an aperture in its floor. At the beginning of the present war the heaviest bomb used was the 250 pounder, although the 500 pounder soon came to be used for raids on German industry. The 500 pounder remained the heaviest up to the summer of 1940 when the 1,000 pounder was introduced but long after this the 2,000 pounder arrived.

It was not until 1941 that the RAF dropped its first 4,000 pounder, not until 1942 that this bomb became a regular component of the bomb load. During the eighteen months ending December 1943, 8,000 pounders were occasionally carried, but the 4,000 pounder was the most popular of the heavier bombs. Aircrafts called them "cookies"; a pleasant, or an ungainly and unpleasant object, and the 8,000 pounders were "corporate cookies".

Early in 1941 came the 12,000 pounder. It is worthy of recall that, as the first form of the 8,000 pounder consisted of two 4,000 pounders joined together, so the earliest form (used in late 1943) of the 12,000 pounder consisted of three 4,000 pounders joined together. But the earliest form of the 22,000 pounder seems to have been the single 22,000 pounder.

U. K. LED WAY TO VICTORY

The collapse of the Nazi war machine—the most powerful engine of aggression ever created—comes just over six years after Great Britain took the first definite step to rout the German plan for world domination, and save the world from one thousand years of Nazi tyranny.

When Germany swallowed Czechoslovakia in March 1939 and the last hope of peace in our time perished, commentators and students of a literate world over the world attacked Naziism and called for a stand against it by the freedom loving nations.

Britain alone took a decisive action. On March 31st, 1939, the Anglo-Polish Pact was announced, making it clear to Germany that the next step in her career of aggression—an attack on Poland—would involve war with the United Kingdom. France identified herself with this stand. Two months later for the first time in history the United Kingdom introduced conscription in peacetime. All men of twenty and twenty-one had to register for military service. Work was speeded up on the shadow factory scheme for swift expansion of war production.

These very important developments, that of the incendiary. Early in the war it was discovered that ton for ton, incendiaries, in bulk, create, caused roughly twice the damage caused by high explosives. But to ensure the greatest effect for incendiaries, "heavies" had to be employed; the latter blew out doors and windows, and removed roofs, and then the incendiaries functioned most efficaciously. The mixing of incendiaries with "heavies" in the most effective proportion and the varying of loads to suit the various types of target—these two questions, these two arts, received a close attention and much study.

Along with these developments went the improvement of fuses and the introduction of new explosive fillings; it is estimated that, bomb-weight for bomb-weight, the efficiency of bombs has, since the outbreak of war, increased very considerably indeed.

When you add that increase in the general efficiency, hence in the destructiveness, of bombs to the increase in weight from 250 to 22,000 pounds, you can the more readily get some idea of the devastation caused by one of these new ten-tonners.

Meanwhile negotiations had been opened for a security pact with Russia. These negotiations failed. The Russians signed a pact with Germany, stood Hitler's armies, then invaded Poland. The United Kingdom, in concert with France, declared war on Germany. This declaration was rapidly followed by those of the British Dominions.

It is to the undying honour of Great Britain and France that they first—ad voluntarily—look up the challenge of Nazi aggression. France was defeated but Great Britain and the rest of the Commonwealth stood in the ring alone against the powerful and highly mobilized enemy, then reinforced by a new partner in aggression, Italy.

The United Kingdom's war front has been relatively the greatest among all the belligerents. And the key position Great Britain has held through the struggle is due to the fact she entered the war without having herself been attacked, but she carried on the attack, the stern rigour of events had ranged beside her a faithful coalition of peoples.

The Germans never lost sight of the fact that Britain was their key enemy. Ever in the first flush of victory over France, Goebbels reminded his countrymen: "No victory will be of any avail to us, unless the British are laid low".

When the Germans marched into Russia the official Nazi paper said that this was "merely another phase in the struggle against England".

A year later a Nazi spokesman wrote: "We must be most fully conscious of the fact that the real enemy is Britain".

RAIDS ON KYUSHU

In addition to the strategic bombing of Japan's industries, which are largely centred in Tokyo and Nagoya, waves of B-29s have been blasting the airfields of Kyushu, southernmost of the Japanese islands. These raids are aimed primarily at shattering the airfields which serve as staging points for enemy aerial assaults against the Allies.

Another purpose of these raids is to break up the defences along Japan's southern flank.

The Superfortresses usually numbered between 200 and 300 have struck in daylight at hangars, runways and parked

JAP PREPARATION IN MANCHURIA DEMOCRATIC WAY OF LIFE

A Chinese spokesman recently arriving in Chungking from Manchuria revealed that the Japanese are desperately strengthening their defences and war preparations there.

They have already completed the construction of double tracks for the main railways in Korea and are now engaged in laying double tracks through the N. W. provinces and Jehol which comprise Manchuria. Those railways which already possess double tracks include the Dairen-Harbin section of the South Manchuria Railway and the Antung-Mukden railway.

The double track for the Mukden-Shanhai railway section of the Peiping-Liaoning Railway is under construction, while plans are being made to build similar tracks for the Harbin-Peian and the Peian-Heiho Railway.

In order to protect these railroads from guerrilla attacks the Japanese have constructed many reinforced concrete fortresses along the rail lines. The shortage of Japanese pilots has forced the enemy to recruit Chinese bombing missions. Whenever a Chinese flyer is sent in combat duty, he is given only a limited amount of fuel and no parachute. This is a precaution to prevent Chinese pilots from seizing the opportunity to fly to Free China.

All these feverish preparations are of course futile, for very soon all Manchuria will be within Allied bomber range.

Anti-aircraft fire has been the most part negligible, and no fighter opposition was encountered.

In the most recent raid nine airfields were attacked within an hour and a half. These fields stretched all over Kyushu from Utsu in the north to Kanoya in the extreme South. Approximately 325 miles from the northern tip of Okinawa, Other fields blasted were Niitogahara, Kushiro Izumi, Kaku, Achiata and Oita.

Powerful and frequent carrier-plane attacks against Japan will supplement the shattering B29 attacks as soon as Okinawa has been completely conquered. The flow of B-29s to the Mariana airfields is increasing every day, and in the approaching weeks and months their missions will increase tremendously both in number and in size, and many more industries will be under
