# A REPLY TO AUDACITY

Editor 'THE SEARCHLIGHT'  
Dear Sir,  
I cannot allow the opportunity to sip byblynd I have said a word in reply to an article appearing in the Tribuna of the 13th Inst, signed Jose Guerrero, as also a postal by señor Alejandro Alvarado Quiros, and subsequently an article by Señor Jose Maria Zeledon.

All of these articles were written by men who tried to show that the Negro in Costa Rica is a menace to their culture (White as they try to make it) and that the Negro, infection in a population, (white in the majority) is due to the banana industry on the Atlantic sea-board, that this shadow now confined to the Atlantic Zone, may move to other sectors of the Republic, which would from a social, racial, and homogenous consideration be a grave problem to the safety of the Country etc. etc.

Without noticing all the hot-air the gentlemen try to throw off, every self-respecting Negro who reads the Tribuna, ought to feel offended at this diatribe, coming from men who, to all intents ought to know better.

In the first place, the Negro was invited here to work when others failed, including the Costa Ricans, when Port Limon, was only a belt of swamps malarious, where only bush existed, yellow fevers, wild animals, (Indians) could exist, it was at this time when the men brought from other parts died like rats in their holes, that the immortal Minor Cooper Keith got in his head to invite the Negroes of Jamaica to come to Limon to help him in his great prospect of making Costa Rica what it is; say so deliberately, because were there no Minor Keith, and as a

consequence no United Fruit Company, and no Negro, who was able to stand the hardships then, quite possibly the English debt might not yet have been accounted for.

The Negroes can with as much reason claim Costa Rica as the land of their adoption as the Spaniard can, and they have every right of being proud of their achievement, of making the Atlantic division what it is for progress in contradistinction to what it was, in the years 1884-1910, and according to the Statistics shown by Señor Guerrero, the Negro is not so much a menace, but rather is an asset to this beautiful country which we consider our second home, and for which we wish with all our hearts its largest success and prosperity. What Costa Rica needs is more Negroes becoming Citizens so as to fit them to enter into the Political life of the country, it does not need so much bombast and gas-bags, nor men with empty logic, but men with brains and capital, who would not be selfish and covetous to bite the hand that's feeding them, who would not hoard up their own capital and put every obstacle in the way of foreign capitalists who would invest their millions for the purpose of reaping other millions, what Costa Rica needs is men who are broad-minded, who have travelled to civilized centres abroad, and have seen success in those countries, and who realizing the necessities of their country would speak no ill of the foreigners within their gates who are helping them to shape their destinies, whether those foreigners be Negroes, mulattoes, mestizos or Indians. What Costa Rica needs is a selfish organization, among the financiers, which would give

vork to not only 28739 souls but to many millions.

The Negro as a race in Costa Rica has no intention to interpose in the other race groups, as the both cultures do not blend, for one reason or the other, and as a fact the Negro is at his best when yoked up with one of his own.

The social problems of the Negro in Costa Rica does not affect the Government but rather, thinking Negroes are they, who would like to see their race go forward, and to this end I desire to sound the clarion call to all Negroes not to depend on anyone but themselves. Our race had been a great people, respected like other race-groups. There is no superior race, nor yet any race forsooth, rather, all Biologists agree that in the beginning of progress emanated from one common stock, and that Nature in her endless time has evolved men with black skins in the tropics because they could better stand the heat, colour is merely a question of Geography, climate, environment, etc. The Negro's backwardness is painfully due to his lack of opportunities; discrimination as a result, by his more favored fellow men, with all its resultant train of evils, such as superstition, immorality and vice, but who if given equal privileges and opportunities, is second to none in all the arts and sciences of life.

Negroes ought not to leave their destinies in the hands of other races who are not well-disposed to their progress and advancements, but should put away servility, cringing, carrying of tails to the white man, humiliation of their own people, to others who claim superiority (themselves) learn to respect their women as the other races do, aim at lofty endeavours for the good of the young generation to come, and those that are here now; then, and not until then, will the deplorable state of helplessness, ignorance, superstition and vice be lessened, and gradually be done away with, and the Latins would be forced to admit after all, that the Negroes, notwithstanding what the Yankees would like to say of them as a matter of fact, as pure a race, and as progressive as any other race groups, and we would all agree win their respect and appreciation, not as "sombros" for banana trees, but as real men, and she women.

# World affairs

### Aviation

The R.100 made her successful transatlantic flight to Canada and back home to Cardington England, she and her Sister ship the R. 101 are contemplating a demonstration flight to India; afterwards they will be placed on the regular Mail and passenger service between England & Canada.

They are the largest airships afloat, the R101. having been cut amidships recently and increased by 75 ft in length; she is now 775 ft long, with space of 5,500,000 cubic ft, and a load capacity of 160 tons. Her elder sister is 709 ft. with 5,000,000 cubic feet of space and Carries 156.5 tons of cargo.

### Duration flight

By the printers devil's error we had in our last issue 7 instead of 600 hours in the continuous flight of Jackson & obryne in the "Greater St. Louis". They were forced to land on account of Motor troubles at 6-29 on Sunday morning after making a continuous flight of 648 hours, exactly 27 days; being 96 hours and 39 mins more than was made by the Hunter Bros. in the "City of Chicago". These fellows will soon be avay for a year if they go on like this.

### More discrimination

We notice that the ban against Negroes has been put in force in Venezuela; a Negress passenger from Jamaica to Honduras was refused entry with all papers properly attested were in her possession but she was not allowed to land. The matter is under discussion between the Consul at Kingston and the Honduras Minister of Foreign Relations. Is it not time for all Negroes wherever located to open their eyes and get naturalized and of necessity learn the language of the country so as to identify themselves with the life of the people among whom they live?

### Visit of Uncle Sam's Warship on special service

The United States Ship Rochester will visit Limon on the 27th. of September she is on special service along this Coast. Can it be the locating of the Entrance to the Nicaragua Ca-

nal? Whether by the Colorado Bar, or by The San Juan Bar?

There is something of great significance up, and we are seeing great prosperity in store for Costa Rica, if the boasted patriots do not stand in the way of Progress.

### Soviet Audacity

The Red government has come to an understanding by which they aspire to conquer the entire world by force of arms in 1934; they calculate to overturn the principal countries of the world by Communist ideas imbibed into the inhabitants by means of Soviet Agents, so that when they shall strike the blow every country will be in open revolt against constituted Government.

It is calculated that there are now twenty millions well trained Soviets ready to take the field and they expect to have by 1934 60,000,000 regularly trained men and women for open warfare. Travellers to Russia say that the country is deluged with men and women being trained, all sports are set aside, and militarism takes its place.

In every country they are being watched and arrested. Cuba recently arrested several prominent Communists in her midst who will be sent out the country, and those of her own nationality will be beiled in \$2,000, and called upon to report to the Police weekly, so their whereabouts and activities can be located.

### Amnesty

With a view of quelling the turbulent spirit of Sandino and his followers and bringing peace among all factions in Nicaragua during the coming elections, President Moncada has issued a proclamation granting Amnesty to all Political offenders, and inviting them to come home and avow their willingness to live peaceably under the present regime. This is a great act on the part of President Moncada for the wellbeing and prosperous development of his country. Nicaragua would certainly be the most advanced and prosperous country of Central America, had it not been for these continuous destructive warfares by the natives among themselves.

# VERY SIGNIFICANT JOURNEY

On Thursday, the American Minister to Costa Rica Mr. Eberhardt, along with Mr. Cortes Minister of Agriculture and Public works with two of his Engineers were to have left for the Nicaraguan frontier.

Mr. Eberhardt goes to San Carlos to meet and consult with the five American Engineers who are in charge of the work of surveying the route of the Nicaragua Canal and Mr. Cortes and his Engineers were to accompany him in consultation probably over the interests of Costa Rica in said Canal.

This trip has however been postponed on account of the swollen condition of the rivers. It is remembered that we announced in these Columns that there was brewing trouble over the boundary line between the two countries from the fact that the mouth of the San Juan river had silted up and Nicaraguan traffic into the lake had to be brought through the Colorado Bar, possibly these are the points that have called forth this very conspicuous visit of Notables.

It is more conspicuous still when it is considered that Mr. Eberhardt had a lunch party a few days ago, at which were present His Excellency the president of the Republic, as well as the Minister of Foreign Relations Mr. O. tavio Beeche, and Mr. Castro Quesada the

Costa Rica Minister before the Washington government; and now we see this Journey slated to San Carlos and Colorado.

All who are really interested in the welfare of Costa Rica will feel elated in the thought of the prospects of any move that will tend to the prosperity of the country, altho' there are many *scoundrel patriots* whose patriotism goes no further than their own pockets, who are willing to arouse public sentiment against every proposition put forward that will invite the inflow of Capital, under the guise of patriotism, against *entreguistas*, whereas if they be analyzed keenly they will be found to be patriotic only so far as personal interests are concerned.

It is well known by those who are following the history of the Nations that the Nicaraguan Canal must go through and as of necessity the Rio Frio Railroad into San Carlos and up to Lake Nicaragua is a necessary acquisition to convey materials for the works.

Hence our conjecture of this very significant Conference of Engineers' diplomats; whose hath eyes to see let him see.

It is to be hoped that when proposals are made, they wont meet with the frivolous objections by those *patriots* as are now being placed in the way of the consummation of the Banana Contract.
