Murder at Pacuarito | A Child crushed by an Engine at Siquirres | Monkeys prone to antic farces?

Just a year Mr. Hubert Harriot a very respectable resident of Pacuarito and a member of the Progressive Lodge of Siquirres was shot twice by a mysterious hand in his farm at Pacuarito; he however miraculously survived the dastardly attack made on his life, through the skill and attention of the doctors and nurses in the Limon Hospital and later in the San José Hospital.

On Sunday last however the crime was consummated, when possibly the same hand which was haunted with the death of Harriot, shot and killed him at midnight in his bed in his little house at that Place, and until now no trace can be found as to the perpetrator of the heinous crime.

Two natives and one Sinclair were arrested and declarations taken but they were subsequently released, and others arrested but with what effect we know not, but what

we are conjecturing is that if the Detective force of the Country cant unravel this mystery in a small District like Pacuarito, in which this man's habits and antecedents are well known only among the inhabitants of the district of possibly two hundred dwellers; how can they be expected to trace up any thing in a Community of two or three thousands of people.

It is therefore up to the Detectives to show themselves by connecting that first shooting with this one, there must have existed some unpleasantness in his farm or surroundings to cause the act, surely no one from outside was coming to do this brutal act. It seem therefore based on envy, spite, revenge, jealousy or provocation, it is therefore up to our detectives to show themselves worthy of the attention of our efficient chief. Cor don Abel Robles.

As a warning to those wayward boys who will not be advised by older people for their own safety; and as an eyeopener to some parents as well, we give out the following. A little boy named Harris who was under the care of Mr. Chambers at Siquirres was sent out on an errand to the Bodega, the little fellow seeing a train passing, took a fronted jump on the Engine to show his dexterity but in skipping off, his pant got caught, he was thrown on the ground and his leg badly lacerated, from the effect of which he died. Dr. Shaw did all he could for him but he succumbed in the Limon Hospital.

This is a serious lesson that should be taken by all the urchins whose greatest pride is to immitate the breakmen in their duties by jumping on and off moving trains, in spite of the efforts of the Police to check this sort of conduct. Especially is his so by the water front Rats in Limon, while our trains are getting in and out, much to the annoyance of passengers. They do not even respect the Company's special service

men who are always on the spot, but they jump off and on all the same, at times stealing whatever piece of baggage comes to their hand.

This is the sort of next generation we are creating. It is a pity our governor has not got a fund at his disposal to create an Industrial School, where all these strays and waifs could be caught up and placed to learn agriculture and trades. If a properly like Mrs. Arnold's could be bought over by the Supreme government and handed over to the Municipality it could soon be made to pay for itself by the education and culture of these boys. This would be a grand move toward the civilized progress of the community and would tend not only to lessen crime in the country, but would be a great burden lifted from the minds of the parents, as well as a great upliftment to the boys themselves by the education and accomplishments they would obtain from such a school.

We wish don José Hernández will think this out for the betterment of Limon before his term expires.

Imperial Conference

At 9 o'clock on the 1st. October the first Imperial Conference of the British Empire under the Labour government of Mr. McDonald was inaugurated with representatives from all the Dominions and India.

The Delegates for Great Britain will be Prime Minister Ramsay MacDonald. The Chancellor of Exchequer Philip Snowden the Minister for the Colonies Lord Passfield Lord Sankey and Secretary of State Thomas; Australia, New Zealand, Canada, South Africa, New Foundland, Ireland and India are all represented by their Prime Ministers, and matters of vital importance to the Empire will be taken up, such as, world commercial depression as it affects the Empire and its unemployed, closer adherence of every unit of the Empire especially in trade, cal-

ling special attention to the economic status of the Dominions and Dependencies. One thing out of the ordinary will be brought up by the South African Hertzog, will be the Status of the Dominions of the Empire so far as Seceding from the Common-wealth of Nations when feeling to do so.

This will be a very serious question and is expected to call for very heated questions affecting the disintegration of the Empire.

Ofcourse it is well known that Hertzog is never inculated British sentiments being still a Boer at heart, it is not surprising that this should be his Aims, consequently much is expected from this Conference, that will lead one to consider the depth of loyalty by the Dominions to the British Crown.

A Discounting Bank

The Executives have placed before Congress a project for instituting a Discount Bank, on account of vvhich a loan of six Million dollars is being arranged.

The other Banks are much in opposition but it vvvll be a great relief to merchants and agriculturists alike, vvhere they can take their papers and realize by a discount to settle their difficulties vvvth the other

banks, rather than be sold out at a sacrifice as is novv being done.

At the inception of the Banco Credito Hipotecario, it was thought that she would have existed for this purpose, but disappointments came in, but novv the nevv bank if brought into existence vvvll fill a great necessity. It is left to be seen.

Politics! Politics!

Politics has started up in Limon earlier than in any other Province. In Siquirres we find two partidos launched so as to place their members in charge of the Municipality one Paper is headed by Mr. Lester Norton and the other by Mr. George Christholm along vvvth their different runners up.

In Limon we find the Partido Independent Limonense has started its campaign pretty strongly, headed by don Carlos Mnl. Fernandez, Dr. Velazquez, don W. Prestinary and others vvvth don Carlos Orozco Amador as Secretary.

Their manifiestos are for better handling of Municipal Funds and more im-

provements from such funds for the Province.

In February the question of Candidacy for Presidential chair vvvll be thrown out, so far there are under consideration 1st. The grand old man of Costa Rica. Lic. don Ricardo Jimenez; 2nd. Lic. don Carlos María Jimenez; 3rd. Lic. don Alberto Echandi and 4th. don Oscar Rhormoser, actual President of Congress.

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What steps will Britain take

Latest advices to hand by the Gleaner show that west Indian labourers working at Maracaibo Venezuela going across from Trinidad into the oilfields and States of Venezuela are being gradually dismissed and once they return to Trinidad they are not permitted to reenter that Republic.

The same thing is being done in Honduras, where the U. F. Co. is laying off a considerable quantity of coloured labour at the request of the government, which has made laws prohibiting the entry of coloured people in the country. One lady Miss Esther Grant who had been a long lover there was denied entry and had to be conveyed back to Kingston on a U. F. Co. ship.

This is a great lesson to all west Indians in whatever part of the world they may be and ought to cause a thought to the rulers of Great Britain as to what shall be done within the Empire to find lands and employments for these industrious subjects of King George scattered all over the western Hemisphere colonizing every body's country, with no place of their own to colonize, only to be told so soon as he has made it hygienically fit for habitation "Get out of here! you are no longer needed, get back from whence you came."

On account of all these insults and indignities why we find Captain Cipriani of Trinidad in his discourses in London before the Labour Conferences, striking out in no uncertain tones for "Self Government" in the Colonies; while Dr. Harold Moodie also in London as Director of the London Missionary Society and Exchairman of the Colonial Missionary Society points out the seriousness of the Governments inattention to "my people" as he terms them by his Racial Prejudice, which as he says if Britain fails to remedy "Man will not attain full development, nor will world peace be achieved."

In commenting on "Colour Prejudice and World Peace" the Doctor said, "Every branch of the Human family was ordained of God, to make some contribution to the welfare of the whole or die out. Greek and Jew, Mohamedan and Christian have all accepted that, and history has borne it out, because it is God's

plan and purpose that mankind should have full opportunity of attaining unto the very best possible for him, hence if one section of the family stood in the way of the progress upwards of another branch, only revolution would be the result."

The coloured or inferior races as they are termed are three fifths of the peoples of the earth, and their cultural developments depend upon economic stability, which they are being prevented from having. Referring to the west Indies, there is much in the history of these colonies of which Great Britain must feel ashamed. Yet there is no more loyal inhabitants throughout the Empire. Poverty stricken Jamaica after the war, voted a responsibility on herself of \$300,000 per annum for sixty years, as her burden for the Great War, and why should this be? but for loyalty to help Britain in her financial aid; and yet economic aid was denied the west Indies to assist to keep the Sugar Industry alive. The day is far gone out of existence when the Englishman could have thought that the world existed for him alone, for he must remember that he owes much for what he has received from others.

As Dr. Moton of Tuskegee University puts it. *When a man must crucify his own finer impulses towards justice, honesty and courtesy, in order to establish his own superiority over another individual or race, he is in reality degrading himself rather than the other, and of the two is the more to be pitied; for in the end it is he who is and must be the greater sufferer.*

The Negro is not looking for any special privileges nor special legislation, he does not seek admittance into any man's private home

or dominion, hence he feels it a libel against him to say that segregation and discrimination are necessary to protect the white man's civilization, the sanctity of his home or the integrity or purity of his race.

The Negro feels that he has capabilities of culture and character which are second to no other race, given equal opportunities to develop them, hence all he seeks are those opportunities handed out to him, and even in the matter of minglings of racial strains however undesirable it may seem to be from Social standpoints he would never admit that his blood carries any taint of physiological, mental or spiritual inferiority.

If Britain thinks that because she has and is dominating a quarter of this earth's surface she is destined to go on doing so for ever; she had better be at once undeceived by remembering what Rome was in the ancient days, and what Spain was, only yesterday. Will she remember that what brought on the warfare which caused the downfall of the Roman Empire was coloured Prejudice? Take heed and be affected by the continual insults being offered to her coloured subjects and find a place under the Sun where they can concentrate their energies without let or hindrance. Let Britain watch well the threat of the Tyrant Herzog of South Africa to break loose from the Empire so as to enslave the Negroes of Africa more than he now has them. His secession would be the happiest day for Negroes, imagine what would then happen? Again we warn, protect these people in times of peace who have been of great help to you in times of war or vvvien war does come, you may find them pitted against you under some one's protection.

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Breach of Customs Laws in Grand Turk

Two eminent barristers were sent over to Turks Island in defence and prosecution of a high Customs official in that dependency. The Hon. J. A. G. Smith defending and Mr. S. R. Braithwaite prosecuting Mr. Been a Customs officer of the

Island. In the cross-examination of the witnesses for the Crown by the Hon Mr. Been it came out that Mr. Been had instituted prosecutions against the principal witness for breach of the Customs Law (Smuggling) to be tried on the 15th,

July, when on the 14th July he was called by the chief Commissioner and offered £10 being £50 for himself and £2 each for his men to make a statement against Mr. Been, which gave rise to the present case. The case is therefore teeming with interest and watched by the entire Community.

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Kingston and St. Andrews Corporation

What will happen to the Kingston and St. Andrews Corporation just at this moment? The findings of the Commission appointed to investigate into the conduct of certain members of the Council have been placed before the Privy Council for decision with certain recommendations.

It is said that all the Councilors who have been summoned before the Commission to declare on matters before such Commission have been condemned except Mr. Penso; hence it is thought that the Council will be dissolved and Mr. Simpson will again be called to administer

the affairs of the City and Corporate area as Commissioner.

One Mr. Vivian Durham has been holding a series of meetings in Kingston and St. Andrews showing the incompetence of the members of the Council to carry on the Administration of the affairs of the ratepayers; and getting resolutions drafted praying for the dissolution of the Council. While on the other hand another group headed by Mr. Marcus Garvey have been holding meetings and drafting resolutions with a contrary idea to dissolution.

This latter group claim that such occurrences of graft happen all over the world, and all that can be done is to expel those members found guilty of graft and replace them but to dissolve the Council on account of the misconduct of one section would be an insult to the Community, in the face of representative institutions. We feel this is the right view to take of the situation, and its only envious, prejudice persons could think otherwise.

There is a feeling that the Chief Justice and one or two other men in high official Standing would like to see the Council dissolved, so as get out certain members from it, and then make laws to keep them out, but we do not think that His Excellency the Governor will give assent to this sort of prejudicial feelings as a means of penalizing an entire Community.

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Religion a necessity but Fanaticism a menace

IN A NICHE in a beautiful church on the Red Square in Moscow, now the House of the Moscow Soviet, is inscribed Lenin's great challenge to religion:

"Religion is the opium of the people."

Is atheism to prevail in Russia?

Persons who are international-minded have watched with interest Russia's struggle for freedom, and have found in their hearts a sympathy for its people, who are going through an uncomfortable rebirth of government. Now, however, many church people are viewing with alarm the Soviet's campaign against the church, saying that it can lead only to destruction of the Russian social structure. When the leaders of the Russian people succeeded in throwing off the yoke imposed upon them by the monarchical form of government, they saw their country the victim of domination by an aristocratic few, who had kept the masses of the people in ignorance and poverty. The church was a factor in that aristocracy's scheme of power. Under the Czars, the Church of Russia was second in power and authority only to the ruler himself. The Soviet leaders were jealous of any group or institution that might threaten the Soviet's power, so they began to take from the church both its power and its wealth. They have taken the church's land and income, and in some cases have even taken over control of the church buildings, allowing services to be held only with the permission of the local authorities. Public officials are not allowed to evidence religious beliefs of any kind.

The Russian church has offered many medieval practices and superstitions to its people as religion. The masses of the people know too little of true religion. To modern Christians religion is spiritual light and joy and happiness, a practicable guide for living; to the Russians it was too largely mystery and superstition.

Because of their inherent religious tendencies and their ignorance, the Russian people were easy subjects for the church's dominion. Before the religious revolt the country was filled with wandering priests and pilgrims, traveling from shrine to shrine, worshipping the "incorruptible saints." Each of these saints was a religious fanatic who had literally buried himself alive in a cave, receiving food and water through a small opening. After a time he died, and in the dry climate the body became a mummy. The mummified body was carried to a monastery and

inscribed as an object of worship.

Often such mummies were found by the Soviet authorities to be mere waxen images, placed by unscrupulous churchmen to exploit the people. The churches were also filled with "ikons," richly adorned images and reliefs of the saints. These the Russians were taught to worship and kiss in reverence. In Leningrad the Soviets have a collection of eleven hundred pairs of spikes, each pair of which pervades a hung in some village church, labeled as the original spikes that held the Saviour on the cross.

The professional pilgrims who spent their time traveling from shrine to shrine,

worshipping the ikons and lavishing their money upon the priests and churches, form the main body of the 12,000,000 Russian dissenters from the church. They are said to have deserted the church principally because theirs was never a religion of the heart. To their religion was a heart of rituals, of deified shrines, and of jeweled ikons. They were impressed by the wealth and beauty of the cathedrals, and awed by the supernatural knowledge of the priests. Of the teachings of Christ most of them knew very little. One man wrote that he asked a group of Russian travelers what they thought of the teachings of

the Sermon on the Mount. They had never heard of it.

Fantastic practices and rituals once made a strong handle whereby the church held the people, but these same practices are now the chief weapon for the attack upon the church. It is this part of the church that the Russian people are discarding from their religion. Great numbers of Russian churches and cathedrals are deserted today. Many are being used for government purposes. But this fact in itself is not significant. The large majority of the churches were built during the Czarist régime, and represented the lavish power and wealth of the monarchy, rather than any religious devotion of the people. After all, religion is not a matter of churches, but of people and of souls. The Russians who still attended services attend solely for the worship, not because of superstitious fear or compulsion. The churchmen, in an effort to prove their sincerity in the face of so much antagonism, are keeping the services plain and devout.

The majority of the Russian people have not deserted God. They are even more faithful because of the attack that is being made upon the church. The 1926-7 census of Russia showed that the country then had a population of 147,013,609, of which 120,000,000 were church

We have heard of vvhere there have been several supposed treasures but we have never seen a successful one, especially if money is to be advanced to get the spirit to yield it up to you; dont be deceived by these exploiters of human flesh and blood tell him get up your treasure in my land I will give you a half of it, but do not advance ten dollars on the job, to buy candle nor any other implements of superstition, you can count on being that much out of pocket, plus the ridicule of your friends.

Miss Deane of New York deserves to lose her money if she could be so stupid as to pay £ 600 just to get a dream of a winning Ticket. This case of Joslyn Davis for robbing from Violet Deane € 3,000 for such a purpose ought to be very interesting.

Is Sport merging into Warfare?

By latest sporting papers we note that a most alarming state of enthusiasm existed at Monte Video among Football fans; when Uruguay contested the Championship of the Football season with Argentina.

The fans committed all sorts of breaches of decency during the game. The Authorities relieved these would be enthusiasts of over five thousand revolvers while entering the gates to the Stadium which had an unprecedented crowd of 98000 spectators.

The Argentine players and sympathizers were much infuriated over the loss of the game, and made fights and stoned innocent ladies in the Pavilion who happened to be dressed in opposite colours.

This seemed barbarous, to imagine that people engaged in a pleasant pastime could be so uncivilized as to conduct themselves in such an outrageous manner. They ought to be rejected from competing in further games, until they be disciplined into the knowledge that these games are only intended to be

indulged in by players of gentlemanly deportment.

This is the same conduct which was meted out to us in Cuba last year, in the great Olympic games, when the Cubans behaved very rudely towards the Costa Ricans, inasmuch that the Mexicans had to chime in with the Costa Rican players, to put a stop to this rough ungentlemanly way of playing. Had it not been for the superior conduct of the Costa Rican public last month, the same thing might have occurred here during the contests with the Fortuna, fortunately however by the better cultural teachings of our boys a scene was avoided.

The Junta de Control of the League ought to penalize any player or Club who commits any breach of propriety which might cause a rupture in the game. Very strong measures should be adopted in such cases, so as to put an end to ill feelings between contestant races in international contents especially.

El Banco de Redescuentos

Sus grandes ventajas
