## Scandalous and Shameful Termination of the Theodore Smith's Administration To the interests of Postage Stamps Collectors

A., entrusted to the care of Mr. Theodore Smith for two terms, which we expect at our earliest convenience to place before the public without the slightest item of exaggeration, but we are laconically recording here the undecent descent from office of a man in whom the Organization placed its confidence, and gave him full cooperation during the time he kept himself away from obnoxious influences.

Mr. Smith instead of ceding to the request of his constituents by vacating the Chair, so as to further inconvenience them by re-entangling the affairs of the Division, placed the registration and other books of the Division in the hands of the Limon local authorities, under the pretence of changing the membership for illegal demands, and which in spite of the crude choice which he made in vacating his seat, was unable to prove. The continual toleration of the membership allowed this gentleman to forget that they could well have indicted him before the authorities under a criminal charge for involving the Division several hundred Colonos, which without the consent of the membership he contracted, and has now heaped as a responsibility on them. In spite of all this his supporters who apparently have not as yet conceived the idea of the Organization, but will side in anyWhere, there is an opportunity of personal benefits, caused a shameful occurrence at the Liberty Hall, at a meeting held on the night of the 7th of October.

### STAMP SHOW DRAWS MANY TO BOSTON

Delegation of Collectors Here Will Attend National Exhibit Which Opens Tomorrow.

### RARE SPECIMENS LENT

Parts of Displays Will Be Shipped to Berlin for International Show There in September.

Many of the leading postage-stamp collectors in the United States will be exhibitors at the National Stamp Show in Boston opening tomorrow. The exhibition is being held by the American Philatelic Society, whose annual convention will be in session in Boston during the week. Several large rooms in Horticultural Hall have been set aside for the displays.

A large delegation from the Collectors' Club, 51 West Forty-eighth Street, will leave for Boston today and tomorrow. Among them will be Theodore E. Steiny, who will be one of the judges and who will show his choice of Sydney values of the first New South Wales issue; George B. Sloane, who will show some American pieces, including several rare "Pony Express" stamps and envelopes; Hugh M. Clark, who will show a lot of patriotic envelopes used during the Civil War period; Charles Currier, vice president of the Collectors' Club, who will exhibit several of the rarest specimens from his general collection.

Arthur Hind and Alfred F. Lichtenstein, who rank in the forefront of world philatelists, also will send portions of their collections. Mr. Hind sending his rare British Guiana, the only known copy, which he purchased at the February sale in Paris for more than \$35,000. Mr. Lichtenstein will show some of his Canadian rarities, including his collection of Harry M. Konwiser and Edward Stern, both members of the Collectors' Club, will show some of their United States franks and early postal issues.

### Will Be Shown in Berlin

One of the choice collections of United States stamps will be shown by Representative Ernest P. Ackerman of New Jersey. After the Boston show it will be taken to Berlin, as will be the exhibitions of Mr. Hind, Mr. Lichtenstein, Mr. Steiny and several others, for the international stamp show opening there Sept. 12. Mr. Ackerman left for Europe several days ago, taking other parts of his collection for exhibition. Mr. Steiny and Mr. Lichtenstein have been named as judges at the Berlin show, being the only Americans on the Board of Award. Mr. Steiny will sail on Aug. 28 and Mr. Lichtenstein about the same time.

Among Mr. Ackerman's United States stamps to be shown at Boston are copies of the rare 15 and 24 cents, with inverted centres, of the 1869 issue on original envelopes and also the only known envelope containing the 90 cents, 1869, and the 10 and 12 cent issues of 1870, mailed to Calcutta. He also has some New York postmasters, being the large 5 cent issue, a mint block of sixteen of the 5-cent, 1847, a block of four of the 90 cents, 1857, on a piece of the original envelope sent from Washington City to Hongkong and all of the special printing values, 1 to 90 cents, 1873 issue.

## News of the World

### Storm damage

The worst gale in twenty years has been witnessed on the Atlantic and Channel Coasts of France and England a fortnight ago.

Damage to crops of over a million pounds has been done, several large and small steamers have been lost as a result of the heavy seas and storm, the cost of the damage done to shipping cannot yet be estimated. Four hundred tents and their contents along the Coast at Boune-mouth and Boscombe have been swept away by the storm and heavy seas, and according to the Weather Bureau indications, there are more storms hovering around in the air.

# TOME Ud. CERVEZA Y REFRESCOS TRAUBE

## De la Velada Pro-Aviacion del lunes último

Discurso pronunciado por el señor don Camilo Cruz Santos en la velada que, a beneficio del aviator costarricense Tobías Bolaños, se verificó en el Teatro Apolo de Cartago, en la noche del lunes, 6 de los corrientes.

Hablo en nombre del Comité Pro-Bolaños, quien bajo el patrocinio de miembros prominentes de la colonia francesa de Costa Rica, y con la cooperación de elementos distinguidos de esta sociedad, me ha dispensado el honor excesivo de designarme para abrir este acto, y que al hacerlo, ha usado conmigo términos tan generosos y gentiles, que comprometen mi gratitud.

Cuando ese animal superior que llamamos hombre, había logrado en lucha de siglos, de milenios, más bien, mediante el desarrollo paulatino y tenaz de la inteligencia, que es la primera fuerza de la naturaleza, conquistar el dominio de la tierra y del agua, observó que algo muy importante le faltaba para ser digno del título de rey de la creación, y bregó por conquistarlo también.

Ese reino que le faltaba al hombre para completar su conquista, era el dominio del aire. Y su impotencia para dominarlo lo hacía en cierto modo inferior a las aves, que pueden moverse a su antojo en la tierra, en el agua y en el cielo, siguiendo el libre impulso de su instinto.

Pero el animal que piensa, y que, como pensante que es, aspira naturalmente a su perfección y a su grandeza, no podía resignarse a esa inferioridad, y desde tiempos muy remotos, anteriores al nacimiento de la Historia, habíase esforzado con energía y perseverancia por dominar el tercer elemento.

De esas tentativas por conquistar el aire, dan testimonio varias leyendas preciosas y simbólicas que encontramos

en la mitología griega, fuente de toda belleza. Défalco, quien junto con su hijo Icaro, audaz mancebo, estaban cautivos del rey de Creta, quien los encerró en el Laberinto, ideó un medio ingenioso para salvarse, y salvar a su hijo: construyó unas alas que le permitieran elevarse en los aires, y volando, huir de las costas de la Isla. Así lo hizo, y en efecto, padre e hijo consiguieron llegar a Sicilia; pero Icaro, indócil a los consejos de su padre, ansió subir más aún, mucho más, volando a tal altura en los espacios celestes, que sus alas, que eran de

cera, se fundieron con los rayos del sol, y cayó al agua, en sitio que desde entonces se llamó Mar Icariano.

En la caída de Icaro, como en la de Faetón, el joven atrevido, que voló el carro de Apolo para iluminar el día; como en la de Hefesto, a quien su madre Hera arrojó del Olimpo, avergonzada de la cojera que lo afeaba, haciéndolo indigno de vivir entre los dioses; o como en la de Belerofonte, héroe también del aire, a quien aquéllos precipitaron, a la Tierra, porque pretendió en el delirio de su orgullo subir al Olimpo, apro-

vechándose de las alas de Pegasus, el caballo alarado, que los dioses dieron al atleta para combatir a la Quimera; en todas esas caldas memorables que cantaron los homéricos, adivinaron los Helenos, cuáles la ira de los Dioses, que castigó la audacia de los humanos, quienes habíase atrevido a aventurarse en el espacio, reservado tan sólo para los inmortales.

Y esa venganza implacable de los dioses persiste hasta hoy. Y no ya la mitología, sino la historia contemporánea, comprueban que la conquista del aire es un continuado martirio, en el que abundan ya hasta los mártires del sexo femenino. Algunos de esos holocaustos tremendos se han consumado en nuestro país, llenándonos de estupor y de duelo. Hoy mismo ha ocurrido una tremenda catástrofe en Francia: la del dirigible inglés R-101.

A esa legión de héroes y de mártires pertenece el primer aviator costarricense, Tobías Bolaños, hijo de nuestra ciudad de Santo Domingo, a quien rendimos esta noche un homenaje fraternal.

Sintió desde la adolescencia una aspiración de elevarse, un deseo loco de volar, y nada ni nadie pudo hacerlo desistir de su propósito. No pudiendo realizarlo aquí, se fue a Europa, en donde le sorprendió la Gran Guerra. Como Icaro y como Belerofonte, quiso escalar el cielo, y como ellos, fué víctima de la cólera de los dioses. Pero más estúpido que los héroes griegos, no se amedrentó con las catástrofes de los otros, ni con sus propios fracasos, y mutilado héroe en campos de honor y de gloria, volvió a su empeño cuantas veces la suerte le fué impropia.

Si el héroe moderno, estóico como los cartagineses de la antigüedad, hubiera vivido en la Hélade, los griegos hubieran premiado su audacia, su empeño y su heroísmo, haciéndole semi-dios, como Icaro y a Belerofonte, y el cantor de la liada lo hubiera eternizado en sus hexámetros sonoros; pero su país ha sido ingrato con él, porque casi todos los países son ingratos con sus héroes. Más Tobías Bolaños, que al caer del aire, combatiendo por la libertad y por el derecho humanos, había dicho, creyendo que ya todo había concluido para él: «Muero feliz, porque muero por Francia», encontró una patria maternal, que lo glorificó y que le aseguró la subsistencia, porque Francia, cuna y teatro perpetuo de héroes, como Roma, reconoce y mimica como a hijos suyos a todos aquellos

## A COUNCIL DISSOLVED

Some things occur in this life that makes the most reserved burst forth with expressions that astonishes his surroundings, who might have been accustomed to deal with a reticent, calmly disposed person, and so we find even our co-leader Cusins Hon. A. E. Dacosta expressing vehemently his disapproval at the action of the government of Jamaica in dissolving the Municipal Council of the Kings-ton and St. Andrew Corporation, at the recommendation of the Chief Justice, because it is clearly seen by anyone who has been studying the context of the report, that it is entirely the wording of the chief Justice, and simply signed by the other two who are on the Commission of enquiry Mr. F. E. Reed and Mr. A. H. Dacosta.

Anyone also who has been following the trend of affairs in legal matters in Jamaica will find that this Chief Justice Sir Fiends Barret-Leonard is opposed to every thing that tends to native uplift, his one of those officials who seem to come out from the Tropics from England imbued with a wonderful amount of self inflated idea of superiority over the natives, even though the natives are those who must bear the burden of taxpaying to be able to pay him his munificent salary of £2500 per annum, hence with this false impression of superiority this man has tried to belittle every thing that tends to bring out to public gaze, the higher intelligence of the natives in their local institutions of attempt at self representation. In keeping therefore with this repugnance he has used the opportunity so soon as it came into his hands, to recommend that the Corporation be dissolved, and a Commissioner, an aristocrat at that, be placed in the job at which was Mr. Simpson's salary when he was Commissioner in 1923, of nothing less than £2000 per annum and we would not be surprised were it now made £3000, to run the affairs of both Municipalities, which the gentlemen who composed the Council have been doing free, gratis and for nothing; and which it is considered impossible for anyone man to do efficiently.

Now that the acting governor Hon. A. S. Jellicoe has acted on the recommendation of the chief Justice's Commission and dissolved the Council let us have a peep into the matter and see the Justice or the injustice done to the "Councilors and officers who composed that Council and who have served the country faithfully and well, to the constituents of the Corporate area whose representatives these councilors are; and lastly, to the interests of representative institutions in the government of the people by the people and for the people.

Now, a complaint of the misconduct of one or two of the members on this council was

brought before the Council by certain of its members; immediately the Council formed itself into a board of enquiry to investigate the complaints, but it was soon found out that the law as it stands debarred them from certain scope, to efficiently carry out their enquiries. They could not take a witness on oath, they could not compel any witness to come and declare before them who might not be willing to give a voluntary statement etc., therefore so as to be able to clarify these complaints in a satisfactory manner to the public, the Council asked the government to help them to investigate this matter by placing at their disposal the necessary scope of law which was lacking in the means at their disposal within their Jurisdiction; the cost of which they offered to pay; in consequence of this request, the government, named and instituted this Chief Justice Commission with full power to investigate and call any person on oath they may require.

Mark! the request was not made to the government by outside parties, who might have seen something irregular

going on in the Council, to which the eyes of the members of this body were closed, but rather was made by the members of the Council itself, when they saw that the law did not give them sufficient scope to honourably and efficiently carrying on this enquiry; and after this investigation has been carried out at the wish of the Council, what do we find; but that this Commission operating at the request and under the expense of the Corporation Council, recommends that the Council is found incompetent to carry out its duties and be therefore dissolved, and a Commissioner be appointed to carry out the duties of the whole Council, because 3 or 4 of the members of the Council have been found guilty of misconduct. Can any thing be considered more unjust to the faithful members of the Council who have laboured honestly, faithfully and well for the constituents who placed them in power, during nearly a decade of years?

Can anything be more unjustly prejudicial to the best

# The dream of Britain a Wreck

The R. 101 the greatest airship built, left England on Saturday for India, and on Sunday morning while passing over the South Eastern France, caught afire and fell broken in two, 47 of the 53 occupants were burnt to death and another of the wounded has since died making 48 dead six badly injured.

The R. 101 is the greatest hit in Aeronautic Science and has been the largest airship of Zepelin type afloat she was the pride of Great Britain the sister ship R-100 having just recently accomplished the linking trip to Canada and back, and now the R-101 was on a similar tour of goodwill to India when disaster overtook her.

She has recently been cut in twain and a piece spliced in between midship to make her yet longer than the R-100, it seems as if the centre beams could not bear the weight

of the ends which caused the collapse. The Wreck is a national calamity, many of England's most famous men are among the dead. The bodies have all been recovered and taken back to England where they lie in State at Westminster, Abbey.

The French authorities did every thing possible to rescue the dead and dying and a day of mourning has sympathetically been declared by the French government.

The funeral ceremony will be performed for the dead in St. Paul's Cathedral.

interests of Representative Institutions at a time when every group of men all over the world is endeavouring to make itself heard? What has the Council done, that is unworthy of the privilege of self representation? This Council consists of 17 members and if four of these have committed themselves, under their obligations entered into, why not give the other 13 the chance of expelling them from amongst them, as they asked to be helped by the government to do, when they agreed to pay the cost of the enquiry; why then penalize these gentlemen by making them appear in the eyes of the world in a similar category as those condemned of graft?

And now for the attempt at belittling us in the viewpoint of Representative government. We know that there are some self interested Englishmen such as this chief Justice, Lord Baden Powell and many others who would be only too glad to tear down the structure of Representative government; and substitute therefor Crown government; this is one of the attempts to prove that the people of the West Indies are not honest enough to be entrusted with self representation (see how this hired servant of the people, insulted Mr. J. A. G. Smith an honoured representative of the people for years and years, because he objected to the manner the interests of his Client were being handled, by calling him "an impudent man" and other similarly ungentlemanly remarks why, because he wanted Mr.

Smith a gentleman who was trained in the same College as himself to forget his culture and training and get into in similar or more abrupt strains; so he could have shown him up as one of the uncultured representatives of self government. We have heard with surprise of how the chief Scout told his friends in the United States and Canada, that he had been convinced during his travels in the West Indies and Central America, that Britain had made a mistake in extending culturing education to the natives, which in his opinion should only have been along Industrial lines.

And now of graft, does history not record graft (not petty but gigantic) in all countries of the world? Even in the British Parliament have we not heard of this thing? In American politics, in French and German governments do we not hear of corruptions and great grafting transactions by which great, influential men have been imprisoned? Suppose a few smaller men are weak enough to follow the example set them in these great countries, is this reason for breaking down responsible institutions and insulting honourable gentlemen for the sins of a few? Certainly not, and we are waiting to hear the last word from Sir Edward Stubbs, Governor of Jamaica who is now in England, but will leave Europe about the 16th of this month, because we will not be led to believe that he too will coincide with this damnable attempt to insult our honourable representatives and belittle our status in Representative Institutions.

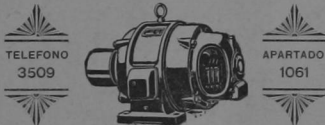

# Happenings at Estrada

Referring to the recent Murder at Estrada which got accidentally closed out in our last issue. The murderer Ivan Powell was caught by the vigilance of the Agent at Estrada while crossing the Matina Bridge to make good his escape towards the Coast.

Friday last was a day of great consternation at Estrada when all the friends and acquaintances of Powell gathered to take a farewell glimpse of him as he was being sent to Limon to take his incarceration and trial for the brutal murder of his concubine Mabel Dunn. Who because she could no longer stand the continual ill-treatments he meted out to her from time to time signified, her intention of quitting and actually left his premises and his companionship, for that of her uncle with a wounded spirit Ivan inveigled her into his quarters and there he stabbed her several times and ultimately shot her dead in the room and ran away in the bushes until Thursday night, no longer feeling himself safe in the bushes around Estrada under the influence of the keen police Agent in that locality Mr. Justino Vallejo, he endeavoured to get nearer the Coast line, but fell into the hands of the very man he did not want to encounter.

It is rumored that certain people around Estrada were endeavouring to shield the perpetrator of this brutal act, but it is this true, such persons should be denounced for participating in such a crime.

Where two men get in an encounter, or a man suffering under the perse-

cution of another, or a set of men, and falls by incriminating himself, there is some reason for sympathy, but in an unprovoked, hasty crime as this, even a parent would be tempted to give up the party committing such an inhuman act. Brotherly feelings cannot be brought to bear in such an instance, all obligations of fraternal ties are dead in such a case, because surely the perpetrator could no longer be considered 'Worthy' of ones, paternal or fraternal affections; and anyone who attempts to condone such a crime, is a bad citizen, because in such uncalled for crimes every good citizen ought to help the Police to bring the criminal to Justice, rather than put obstacles in their way; and anyone operating in a contrary manner cannot be looked upon but with an evil eye by the police.

We hereby beg to congratulate Mr. Justino Vallejo and his men for the activity displayed in this case, and will go further and say, if we had such men at Pacuarito, the murder at that place would not still be a mystery.

This makes three murderers in association at the same time in the Limon Carcel from Estrada awaiting sentence within eighteen months this is the 3rd murder case that the valiant Agent of Police at Estrada has had to clean up. Certainly a record for the Village of Estrada; with floods and murderers the residents of this place are having a busy time.

Hablando con el Regidor don Agustín Calvo acerca de la pavimentación de la calle del comercio y otras obras de Cartago, le preguntamos:

—Que opina de la nueva exposición que hizo el jueves último en "EXCELSIOR" el Sr. Bejarano?

—Se reluce a decir que la solicitud al Sr. Ministro de Fomento se ha debido hacer por medio de una comisión y no por telegrama, como si el Sr. Cortés no le diera buena atención a un despacho telegráfico procedente de la Municipalidad; y además la Comisión hubiera ido, a no haber tenido que atender las razones que expuso el Sr. Ministro, lo otro hubiera sido una necesidad que no tenía objeto. Entre aquellas razones adujo el Sr. Cortés la de que había gran urgencia de arreglar la carretera que estaba en pésimo estado, pero que inmediatamente que esta obra fuera terminada, se pavimentaría la calle del comercio de Cartago, de acuerdo con lo ofrecido por el Sr. Ministro anterior, Sr. Volio.

Como verdaderamente el estado de la carretera en algunos trayectos era muy malo, y además la pavimentación de la carretera es también de beneficio directo para Cartago, preguntamos al Sr. Bejarano cual de las dos obras era más urgente. Por otra parte, habidas las razones expuestas por el Ministerio, cómo hubiera podido la Municipalidad imponerse al señor Cortés?
