### What is Britain doing A Call from Matina

So while the Latin Republics are thinking that they shall no longer permit the immigration of Negroes into their countries, out of one cause or another; Britain is, also thinking what shall be done with these teeming millions of her ebony faced subjects, their progeny, and mixed breeds.

Cuba and Panama say they do not want them, because there is not sufficient works in the country to give employment to their population plus the immigrant. Honduras does not like the race, Costa Rica is feeling that they will soon be contaminating the Purity of her race; and now we see England is endeavouring after all, to free them from all these indignities and insults, by forming a great Negro Colony in Africa, which is the correct thing to do, so that these people will have a country of their own to go to whenever they are told by these countries, which they have Colonized and made habitable that they are no longer fit to live among them. In fact the ambitious ones will not wait to be told these unpleasant things. They will gradually walk out so soon as the opportunity affords itself.

The plan which Britain has in mind is to make a vast Colony of British East Africa, Kenya and Uganda, and include Tanganyika, the mandated German territory which was wrested from her. Germany of course is objecting to England using Tanganyika for such a purpose, but from records before the League of Nations as to the illtreatments by the Germans of the natives before the war, bringing about a greater liking by the Natives of British rule, no change may be likely.

The British Government desires to make all this territory something like one united Crown Colony, the distant object of which will be to develop it into a great self governing Dominion.

It will be governed by a High Commissioner, who will administer and legislate on such questions as Railways, Ports, Harbours, Customs, defenses, posts Telegraphs and general Communications etc, besides being adviser to the Secretary of the Colonies on all native questions.

His Council will consist for the present of 24 members, being 3 officers of his staff and 7 members nominated by him from each State, representing the various races, Africans, Indians and Arabs.

The proposal as made by the McDonald government, is to apportion forever to the natives tremendous areas of tillable lands, and to make them inalienable, so that other races cannot take the soil away from them for their own purposes says the 'Montreal Daily Star'; but the proposal the article goes on to say, will not meet with the approval of Parliament without a struggle because, already the white settlers in Kenya are protesting vehemently against certain phases of the proposals.

Hence it will be seen that our complaints as to

how Britain leaves us alone to be insulted by all and sundry, is bearing fruit, but we must not cease complaining. Petitions must be sent to the Secretary of States for the Colonies through the Governors of all the Colonies from which britishers have had to emigrate setting forth the unpleasant conditions under which we live as sojourners in strange lands; we must continue to agitate until the protests of the white settlers are defeated and Negro ownership of the lands is an established fact.

More honest Negro leaders of the type of Dr. H. Thorne of Barbadoes and Marcus Garvey are needed, negroes are only murmuring but they are not making impressive influential representation.

The time has arrived now when intelligent workers are necessary. Let every Negro Institution amalgamate towards this end and soon the negroes when wanted will have to be invited to labour on works of improvements in other men's territory, because they shall have enough of their own to do; but we must Economize, and Cooperate with each other to be efficient when the call comes.

### Tramway derailment again

On Sunday last the same Electric Car No. 32 which left the track last week in front of Mr. Piza's store in Central Avenue, and mounted the sidewalk causing the death of Mr. Walter Sagot the chief radio Engineer of the National Radio service, did the same trick again on Sunday last at the same spot.

Engineers of the government as well as the Company have been on the spot measuring and re-measuring to find the cause of the accident, but to any experienced eye it can easily be observed that the Southern leg of the rail at that spot is fully an inch and a half lower than the Northern rail and of course if the Car has any defects in the rigidity of the truck or a worn flange of the leading wheel it will mount the low rail rather than following the groove.

The Car has been ordered off the run by the government, and the topic on the Street and in public assemblies is, what of compensation for the death of the unfortunate man, a rising star to his country in his profession? Of course if contributory negligence can be proven, then an indemnity must be paid, but the question is, to whose fault can this accident be placed? The track was taken up and relayed, under the supervision of the government, who did

Wayss and Freitag, the reconstruction of the streets, hence if the low spot in the rail is the contributing cause of the derailment, and there is not the shadow of a doubt that it is the primary reason, then whose door shall this be placed at?

We have no doubt that if the matter is handled in a tactful manner that the Tramway Company will grant a reasonable gratuity to the deserving widow, but if force is to be used, the case appears a very arbitrary one with plenty of scope for legal arguments.

In the meantime we sympathise sincerely with the family Sagot - Castro in their great misfortune, and deplore greatly the untimely end of an ambitious and useful life, full of promise and hope.

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The officers and members of the Matina Division of The U. N. I. 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# SIQUIRRS NEWS

It has been quite a long time now, that nothing has been heard from the Squirres Division of the U. N. I. A. but now that a few live-wires have seen the necessity of throwing in their lot for the purpose of contributing in the improvement of their fellow

men, we were extremely enthused over the display of talent and culture as was evinced on Sunday last when the Division pulled of a stunt in their unveiling of the new Charter 233, recently granted as a result of the changes from the old U. N. I. A.

the new order, instituted since August 1929.

Mr. Isiah Harris very fittingly officiated as Chaplain, and amidst the strains of a march he led the Choir bearing the new charter before in a procession to the hall, which was tastily decorated with flowers suitable for the occasion. The program being lengthy, many items had to be dropped out due the shortness of time. There were delivered several addresses, especial among them being a short talk by the Representative of the Pacuaro Div. in the person of Mr. Hall, an anthem entitled "Praise ye the Lord" was rendered by the Choir, followed by recitations from the two Lindos, a solo touchingly rendered by Miss Kellerman brought an outburst of applause, followed by a recitation from Miss Reynolds of New Jersey, and followed by a lecture from the representative of the Cimarros Division in the person of Mr. Betty which was highly instructive in its worth of the History of Nations.

The anthem "How long oh Lord wilt thou hide thy face from us" was touchingly rendered at this stage by the choir, and whilst under the spell of the ecstasy of this rendition, one could hardly but reflect that as a fact it sometimes appears as if the Lord has hidden his face from us his people, poor, despised, disfranchised, spurned even by the offscouring of other races.

The preparation for the unveiling of the Charter being made, three damsels were chosen, each representing one of the colours of the U. N. I. A. and amidst the strains of an introductory anthem, the colours were lifted one by one, and at last the Charter was exposed to the view of the enthused gathering. There were given several addresses,

but we must punctuate especially on the remarks of Mr. E. U. Binns and W. A. Pelegrove in their masterful putting of the needs of our people, and enjoining us to study, to dedicate if no more than ten minutes every day to reading, as only by reading can a people be elevated and replenished in their knowledge of passing events, as they are at present affecting the World.

A solo followed rendered by Mrs. Williams, and yet another by Miss Mary Brown which nearly brought down the house, Mr. Jones made his vinding up speech, and Mr. Stewart the master of ceremonies suitably responded; the offertory being lifted this colourful, and spectacular event was brought to its close amidst the strains of the U. N. I. A. National Anthem.

Much praise is due to Mr. Jones for his uniring efforts in the training of the Choir, as also for his dogged persistence in bringing about a transformation of this Div. and we do hope that we will have the pleasure of welcoming the President General in our midst to again revive the lagging spirit of our people.

In Jamaica we note by the «Gleaner» that the Magistrates are imposing very heavy fines on those persons found in possession of this weed, a man was fined £ 50, and a woman £ 30 for having in their possession this weed. It is to be hoped that the Magistrates of Costa Rica will follow suit by severe punishments for the use of this weed, as it is a great means of propagating crime, this weed it is said has the tendency of inclining its subjects to do all sorts of wickednesses instead of good.

It is said that the young man Powell was under the influence of Marijuana when he committed the recent murder at Esradá. It therefore becomes the duty of all citizens to point out to the authorities those persons who are addicted to its uses as well as those who cultivate the weed, so as to cease the use of it.



Si en la negociación del próximo Tratado del Canal el Gobierno de la República, no hace frente al problema en forma real y efectiva a pesar de los beneficios varios producidos por la construcción del canal, el bien más preciado para todos, la nacionalidad panameña desaparecerá, desvirtuando las cualidades y tradiciones que constituyen nuestro orgullo.

Hasta hoy la acción del obrero panameño sólo ha encontrado cierta resistencia de parte de las clases burguesas y la promulgación de leyes por parte de las autoridades constituidas que muy poco dominan el problema.

Mientras tanto, el antillano proceca en el Istmo en forma recomendable por la bondad de las condiciones en que vive. Las nuevas generaciones, ya de antillanos-panameños se encuentran en pleno derecho de su ciudadanía por su nacimiento en tierra istmeña y en pleno desacuerdo con las orientaciones del alma nacional. Y— que negar los daños que el problema antillano produce en Panamá es negar la

evidencia de lo que todos estamos palpando.—Expresar la más vibrante protesta por los conceptos emitidos por el Fiscal Segundo del Circuito de Panamá Señor Alberto V. de Icaza, en carta dirigida al señor Olmedo Alfaro referente al problema antillano, y en la que dicho señor asevera que Panamá no cuenta con elemento propio para sustituir a dichos antillanos,—dejar constancia también de la incoherencia de esta Federación en cuanto al informe que los diputados Cervera, Galindo y Villarreal han rendido sobre el proyecto de Ley sobre inmigración, informe que es adverso a la lucha emprendida contra los antillanos”.

No abrigamos odio racial contra nadie. Consideramos cada cual tiene derecho a su puesto bajo el sol y al escribir estas líneas no nos guía otro objeto que el mejoramiento de las condiciones sociales que rodean a nuestros pueblos.

Hay la proporción de elementos últimos es bastante escasa. Plenamente lo está de-

mostrando los cien años de vida independiente que llevamos y lo poco que hemos contribuido a nuestro bienestar y al progreso humano.

En nuestros países el reducido número de hombres hábiles, en las ciencias, las letras, las artes, la filosofía, etc, etc, comparados con las conquistas efectuadas por otros pueblos de la tierra en donde se ha seleccionado a las claras de nuestra inopia y nuestro atraso como material utilizable para la cultura humana.

El ofrecimiento por la República de Panamá de una faja de terreno a la gran República Anglo-Sajona para la construcción de un Canal Interoceánico no constituye de ninguna manera una opción para la destrucción de un Canal Interoceánico. Las negociaciones de un nuevo Tratado ofrece oportunidad para conseguir rectificaciones saludables.

fair chance to demonstrate his ability.

The Chairman, in closing this part of the programme, paid a warm tribute to the teacher and pupils for the wonderful programme which they had presented to the audience that day. He also paid a high compliment to

the Organist, Mrs. Douglas, whose performance at the organ he likened to the workings of a Clock.

At 3.30 p. m. a packed house returned to listen to the second part of the programme. Mr. O. F. A. Harrison, the teacher preside, and associated with him on the platform were Mr. Griffiths of Cima-rones, Mrs. Knight of Cairo, Miss Ethel Brown of Pacuarito, Mr. Cornille of Siquirres, Mr. T. Windt, Mrs. E. Reid, President Barker of Madre De Dios and several others.

The meeting commenced with the singing of the Opening Ode "From Greenlands' icy Mountains followed by prayer from the ritual.
