Abraham R. Mendez, Limon Jeweller, Pays \$ 1,250, extra judicially, for illegal embargo of house owned by Eliza Barrett at Estrada.

That the Courts of Costa Rica administer justice impartially and without any consideration whatever as to the parties concerned, was undoubtedly manifested when the Supreme Court of the Republic upheld, in a recent decision, the verdict of the Appellate Court of the Civil Bench in the case of Eliza Barrett, a resident of Jamaica Town, versus Abraham R. Mendez,

Limon's most prominent jeweller.

As it will be remembered, we informed our readers through these columns a few months ago, that Mr. Mendez had filed an appeal before the Supreme Court against the decision of the Appellate Court rendered in Mrs. Barrett's favor and in which this Tribunal held that the embargo decreed by the Civil Court of Limon on the strength of a petition filed by Mr. Mendez was unjust, because the plaintiff, Mrs. Barrett, had proven to the satisfaction of the Court that the building was constructed with her own moneys, prior to the time of

her marriage to Edward Barrett.

The action was established by Mrs. Barrett before the Civil Court of Limon praying for the release of the building, after it had been embargoed by Mr. Mendez on the assumption that it was the property of her husband, Edward Barrett, who was indebted to Mr. Mendez at the time for some \$ 800.00 originated from Lottery Tickets, which Mendez alleged he entrusted to Mr. Barrett for sale.

In replying to Mrs. Barrett's action, Mendez denied the plaintiff's allegations, saying then that the house was the property of plaintiff's husband, Edward Barrett, who was in possession of same long before his marriage. This he offered to prove.

The case was tried and decided in the Limon Court by former Judge Victor M. Cañas, and the trial conducted by Attorneys Daniel Zeledon, for Mr. Mendez, and Antonio Segura, for Mrs. Barrett. Judge Cañas decided the issue in Mrs. Mendez's favor.

Mrs. Barrett was not satisfied with the decision and immediately after she was advised of that decision, she engaged the services of the Legal Department of the Limon Service Bureau who after studying the matter decided to and did file an appeal against Judge Cañas decision before the Appellate Court of the Civil Bench, who unanimously disagreed with the decision of the Limon Court and consequently decided in Mrs. Barrett's favor.

It was then that Mr. Mendez appealed to the Supreme Court, but he was just as unfortunate before this Tribunal, at the decision of the second instance was upheld, unanimously, and Mr. Mendez ordered to pay costs and damages.

Upon the return of the case to Limon, a claim for damages amounting to \$ 2,000.00 was presented to Mr. Mendez, by the Limon Service Bureau, in Mrs. Barrett's behalf, but, after certain mitigating circumstances were brought to bear, by Mr. Mendez, an offer to pay \$ 1,250.00 was accepted and it was accordingly paid; and a suit where might had been letting with right was brought to a close.

Estrada's Police Judge
Must not Administer

Cleland's Tramway Company's Interest Civil Court Decides.

Justino Vallejos, Police Judge at Estrada, was removed from the office of Judicial Depositor of the Cleland Tramway Company's interest, now in litigation, in an order issued recently by the Civil Court for the Province of Limon.

The order is the result of an interlocutory incident established by the Legal Department of the Limon Service Bureau who is directing the interest of James A. Cleland, President of the Cleland Tramway Company of Estrada, in a suit pending against him for supposed misadministration and misappropriation of the company's funds and in which the plaintiffs are other members of the firm.

The petition for Vallejos removal was filed some three months ago, on the grounds that he was not only unable to manage the interest of the corporation with diligence but that he did not seem trustworthy, to some extent.

Among some of the facts brought to the attention of the Court to uphold the petition, it was pointed out that in submitting his report for operation expenditures, corresponding to November and December 1929, and from January to April 1930, Vallejos made charges for supposed payments to alleged two individuals, the receipt of which was not acknowledged. Payments on his statement said to be made to "Secretario" and "Carrero" were denied, in some of its most exorbitant items.

In the final argument submitted in the issue, Cleland's Counsel made particular stress on the fact that Vallejos had not refused nor even attempted to refute the allegations on which the petition for his removal as Depositor of the Company's interest is based.

"Your Honor" in the course of this incident I offered evidence to prove and did prove that Vallejos, the depositor, was and is at the present time Police Magistrate at Estrada; that he owns a farm on "Zent Line" which demands his personal attention precisely on the very days that he should be supervising his trust; the tramway; and that no account was submitted to

RADIO PRESS CRICKET

London, (Up)—The steadily diminishing world production of gold and the consequent rise in the price of the metal, together with the huge collection of gold reserves in the United States and France and the possible effect of this situation on the continued payment of reparations and war debts are among the subjects of discussion at secret meetings of international bankers in London, financial authorities said today. The bankers include J. P. Morgan, Owen D. Young, Gen James G. Harbord, George Harrison, Montagu Norman and others of prominence.

New York, (Up)—Wall Street is now bullish as it was bearish a week ago. The change in sentiment has come so swiftly that many of the more conservative market observers are worried lest the market be suddenly turned about, taking everyone unawares and precipitating a violent reaction. Brokerage house after brokerage house swung to the bullish side as the week ended.

Washington, (Up)—President Hoover and the republican leaders are carefully and anxiously laying the groundwork for a short session of Congress which will avoid all fighting issues and concentrate on the opposing problems of economy and depression relief.

London, (Up)—Lack of accord on a unified plan of action separated the hindu and moslem delegates to the Indian round table conference. Despite earlier intimations that they stood firmly together in their demands for self government and dominion status in the British Empire. After almost a month of private negotiations, the representatives of the two religions dominant in India will start the round table deliberations with little progress made to solve their vital differences, it was revealed.

Washington, (Up)—Unemployment was estimated today by the commerce department 3,400,000 in September, an increase of 900,000 over the census bureau's estimate of last April. The total does not include persons working less than the normal work-day or work-week.

Winchester, Va (Up)—Three persons including a father who rushed back into his home in a vain effort to save his wife and three year old son, were killed in an apartment fire here today. They were Mr and Mrs Roy Stewart and their son Doran.

Madrid, (Up)—Bread riots in Madrid marked the observance of a 48 hour General Strike, with tens of thousands of workers idle in protest against suppression of a labor demonstration Friday. The Strike was scheduled to end tomorrow. Bakers were among

the workers who walked out Saturday at the orders of labor leaders. Despite efforts of the authorities, a bread shortage was felt.

Natchez, Miss (Up)—A death dealing tornado which struck the Louisiana and Mississippi cotton delta section Sunday killed four negroes, injured scores of whites and negroes, and caused an unestimated property loss.

New York, (Up)—Three previously undefeated and united foot-ball teams had their records spoiled in the play of Saturday; and today there are only six representative eleven's with no draw or defeat, according to a compilation covering more than 150 teams in all parts of the country made by the united press. The teams are Western Maryland, in the east, North-western and Doire Name in the middle west, Alabama in the south, and Utah and Washington state in the far west.

Atlanta, Ga (Ap)—Investigation of communist activities in southern industrial centers brought House Committee to Atlanta were several reputed communist organizers are under bond on capital charges.

New York, (Up)—Tony Cazoner the bouncing young fighter from Neworleans and Brooklyn, is the new light weight champion of the world by virtue of a quick one round knockout over Al Singer, the title holder.

Washington, (Ap)—President Hoover believes there will be small treasury deficit at end of Fiscal year. And this view reduced hope of maintaining current reduced income tax rate.

Los Angeles, Calif (Up)—Activities of known Kansas City gangsters now in Los Angeles were under investigation today as police sought the identity of a bandit who slugged a diamond broker and escaped with \$2,000,000 in unmounted gems, the bandits walked into the office of M. Keingold and escaped with four trays of stones.

Washington, (Up)—Repeal of eighteenth amendment has been definitely discarded by President Hoovers Law enforcement commission as solution of present prohibition problem.

Washington, (Up)—The proceeds of the army navy game at New York December 13 will be turned over to the salvation army for use in alleviating unemployment conditions throughout the country.

Madrid (Ap)—Ricting broke out anew on streets of Madrid as strikers clashed with police in various parts of city numerous arrests were made some of rioters were wounded.

Heavy claim against the government

Don Arturo has also been retained in the Case of the family of Walter Sagot vs. the Tramvay Co. for the death of that unfortunate young man.

It is however expected that there will be an extra judicial settlement rather than going to courts.

Should high officials be partial? Trinidad's Advance

The Minister of Finance and the manager of the Canteen of "The Club Social of Cartago" are having a tiff over the closing of the Club's canteen on Sundays in keeping with the requirements of the Law with regards to the dispensing of spirituous Liquors.

Canteen, Mr. Gonzalez, claims that the order for his closure originated from a personal spleen of the Minister Mr. Aragon, seeing that this has never been done in all the experiences of the Club in its 24 years of existence; but from the fact that himself and Mr. Aragon had a dispute over a bill which was presented

him for conveniences supplied him from the Canteen, in which a bottle of Whisky was disputed but subsequently paid for, but a threat was issued that the Canteen would be closed on Sunday, which was effectively carried out; hence he feels that a man in the high offices of the Minister should be impartial in the manipulation of the Law and close all other canteens of the kind in San Jose and all over the country, which have been hitherto granted concessions to supply the needs of its members by Tickets etc.

The following resolution is down to be forwarded by the Legislature of Trinidad and Tabago to Downing St.

"That whereas it is the policy of the Imperial government to grant to such

of her Peoples throughout the Empire full measures of representation upon application.

And whereas it is the opinion of this House that the Colony of Trinidad and Tobago should be

granted a fuller measure of representation in the government thereof:

Be it resolved
That his Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the colonies be requested to appoint a Royal Commission, at an early date, with a view to making investigations into the question of granting to the inhabitants of the Colony of Trinidad and Tobago **Self government**.

Efforts are also being made to grant the privilege to women of sitting in Legislature and Municipal Councils.

Why should Jamaica not take the example of Trinidad we wonder? This is an example of the injustice done by the Dissolution of the Corporation Council.

By the Gleamer we find that Citizens Associations are the order of the day in Jamaica, and as a result of these Societies in every Parish, large properties are being bought by the government to be sub divided and sold to the small settlers to provide independent holdings. We find Burnt Savannahs in Westmoreland a property of 537 acres is to be bought at the simulation of The Hon. J. W. N. Hudson to be sold to settlers.

Ambassadors of good will to meet.
It is probable that the Prince of Wales will meet Colonel Lindberg on his trip to South America as he too is contemplating a fly to those regions just about the same time that our Prince will be there. As both these are looked upon as Ambassadors of good intentions for their individual Countries, it is significant the coincidence of the meet of these in-

ternational travelling Agents It is likely that Prince George will accompany his brother. They are both studying Spanish for this occasion.

Repatriations

By the report of the Protector of Immigrants in Cuba we find that for the last six months no less than 939 Jamaicans have been repatriated, while 840 were sent home for the year 1929; he claims that there have been 60,000 Jamaicans in Cuba 25,000 of whom were employed as domestic servants 15,000 as skilled artisans and 20,000 as labourers entirely dependent on the Sugar Estates, and as there are most of them in a bankrupt condition, that great distress and privation are staring these labourers in the face; to cope with his firestone duties in trying to relieve these men and answering the many thousands of letters he receives monthly asking for relief, he is now asking for another Assistant in office; as his travelling being so very tedious, when it is considered that Cuba is 750 miles in length; and he has to attend the Courts, plantations, villages and cities daily.

THE DESERTS MASTERED

ALEXANDRIA, Egypt, Sept. 30.—Iraq will soon have its own air force, King Feisal announced today after flying from Abukir to Amman with a Royal Air Force escort to visit the Emir Abdallah. Airplanes, King Feisal said, are essential to Iraq, both for defense and communications, and early next year eight machines will leave England in the hands of Iraqi pilots to form the nucleus of the air force, which by 1934 is to comprise three squadrons. The personnel is now in training and conscription will be introduced. The King has purchased a plane, which he proposes to fly himself to interest his people in aviation. The Anglo-Iraq treaty, according to Feisal, will be submitted to the Iraq Parliament in November. "I am sure it will pass," he added. "The treaty is the last step of independent Iraq for the liberation of other Arab countries."
