# We must of necessity economize

It is very satisfactory to learn that the International Bank has started up making loans to help agriculture. This is a good augury that there may be a glimpse of light ahead of us, which those who are not in the forefront of the Commercial world might not be able to see.

The International Bank has several millions of colonies invested in Agricultural and other transactions, but due to the crisis, had desisted from negotiations in the agricultural lines, hence the news now broadcasted that she is inclined to open up such operations again, must certainly be taken as a token that the Directors are able to see that the prospects are brightening up a bit.

Ofcourse we do not believe that there will ever be that open hand in dealing out loans as were done hitherto, because the valuation which was formerly put on some properties were extremely liberal in fact extravagant, but now that everyone has profited by the experiences of the past, any help that will be forthcoming on a sober basis of property valuation will be a great boon to farmers and property holders.

It is clearly evident to all that the value on all properties henceforward cannot be gauged from the standpoint of what they were five or ten years ago, when we all went crazy over the price obtainable for our products, forgetting that a reaction is always bound to take place in every such rise or fall in production.

The War came by and there was a rush in the demand for man povver, and with it the need of supplies, consequently abnormal prices were paid for labour as well as for products necessary for supplying this great strait; hence the price of landed properties naturally followed in the wake, cost of labour then made the cost of producing necessarily abnormal. The vvar ended, the Capitalist saw that the only way to bring labour back to a normal stage was in substituting man povver by Machinery hence all brains were directed in that direction, with the result that so much machinery was invented for every kind of industry that man povver became a slump, and production was so prolific by the better means of cultivation and manufacture, that an enormous overproduction was the result which overproduction was intensified by the fact that on account of the slump in labour, there came a reduction in the purchasing capacity of the inhabitants of the globe; because naturally if a man cannot find work to earn wages to support his family, he will not be able to buy the goods which the capitalist produces by his machinery, he must also now devise means for producing, by cultivating enough stuffs to feed himself and his family, hence his limited means of purchasing has also forced the artisan and skilled workman to be also a producer on a small scale, thus adding to the

already enormous supply thrown on the market. The large producer now finds he cannot sell his raw materials to the factory for the manufactory, because the salesmerchant can find no sales for his goods, because the labouring population cannot find wages with which to buy his wares. From the fact of there being so many millions and millions of people unemployed, rents cannot be paid, Cacao cannot be sold because the manufacturer of Cacao products cannot sell his products, bananas cannot be sold, because the starving unemployed artisan is not thinking of buying a banana, which is really only a light relish, he must think of taking home a bread, a potato, a pound of rice and beans to supply his famishing wife and child, hence the United Fruit Co., and other Fruit concerns cannot find a market for the immense quantities of fruit produced; as an instance Columbia which was never a fruit producing country and placed on the market this year 12,000,000 stems of fruit, Honduras 26,000,000 stems, Jamaica has increased her output to 24,000,000; Brazil which has never been known to ship a stem of fruit, is now preparing for her many millions and so on, with every country; and with no new markets available, what must happen to our productions. It is a foregone conclusion that the valuation of our Farms and our holdings must be depreciated, so that as we have said, the extravagant valuations that have been hitherto placed on our belongings,

have been the means of calling a halt in our banking operations, in keeping with the world crisis, and now that the Bankers feel that we have learnt the lesson of soberness, brought about by these varied occurrences, they are willing to start business again, but it will be understood that loans will be granted on a sober basis, a basis of possibly a property valuation of fully fifty per cent depreciation, and consequently the cost of labour will have to be gauged accordingly if labour has learnt to do away with the superfluities of life, introduced by the abnormal wages consequent on the War.

Consequently we must sport less, drink less eat and dress with sobriety; we find the labouring man with very moderate salaries, smoking Camel, Maquados, Chesterfields etc. Why so, may we ask? and so on in every line of life. The tailors, the shoemakers the milliners will all have to learn the lesson of economy, but it is for us to compel them to do so by only supporting those who are willing to step down off the fence of extravagance, fancy a tailor charging eight colonies to make a cotton pantaloon for a labouring man when we can buy one ready made for six colonies, is it not time to compel him to step down to reason? The Capitalist is economizing on the labourer, why should he not demand economy from those with whom he deals? Let us all now adopt rigid economy to suit the times in which we are travelling.

# World News Failure of French Banks

### Conspiracy

Several high Indian officials have been sentenced to long terms of Imprisonment for conspiracy in making Explosives, Arms and ammunitions for the purpose of killing out all high European Police officials and engaging in a general revolution; three Doctors are among the prisoners some getting as long as 20 years sentences.

### Discretion better than Valour

Colonel Herbert Julien who was given the position of Air Minister in the Abyssinian Emoire, has resigned such position and returned to the United States. He states that the Emperor treated him well, but the natives who are engaged in the Aviation service of the country are opposed to progressive ideas of aviation and are jealous of him.

He says that they attempted to poison him and worse of all they tampered with the machinery of his airplane which caused him an accident in his plane, on account of which he had to be sent to the Hospital for three months; therefore he thought it wiser to return home among his own people.

### Beeks vs. The U. N. I. A.

In the above case, a suit brought in British Honduras by Mr. Beeks against the Universal Negro Improvement Association to obtain the residue of the Estate of the late Isaiah Mortor, who willed his entire estate valued at a quarter million dollars to the Society, judgment has been reserved by Justice Sissett.

Mr. Marcus Garvey was principal witness in the case, he went over for this purpose and returned to Jamaica on the 26th inst.

Albert Oustrice Ex water and French financier was placed under detention on account of his peculiar manipulations in financial matters as a consequence of which seven Banks have had to close their doors. £ 11,000,000 are involved in this French financial scandal.

The Minister Justice who was formerly Oustrice's legal adviser, has had to resign his position.

The failure of Bernard Bros in vvhose Keeping was lodged by Costa Rica the amount to cover the indebtedness of this country to France, is said to be one of those Banks who had to close her doors on account of these vvvly operations.

This is a matter giving much differences of opinions. The President of the Republic says that this money will not be lost because it was deposited with the Bernard Freres in instructions from the Bondholders, whilst other opinions feel it was only

an advice that any amounts found in hand might be deposited there for safekeeping until the debt became due. It is therefore left to be seen vvhath will happen before the receiver in Bankruptcy, whether it is considered a special safekeeping lodgment, on which an accomodation would be paid, or only an ordinary deposit.

### On Immigration

Due to several protests before the government of Jamaica on the entry of Chinese, Syrians and Turks into the Island a commission has been appointed by the governor to enquire into the alleged suffering of the population by such immigration, with a view of putting an end to the admission of newcomers the matter is before the Legislative Council.

# AN EXPLANATION

Limón, Diciembre 2 1930  
The Editor of the Searchlight.  
Cartago  
Dear Sir:

There appeared in the Searchlight No. 56 of last Saturday, that you publish, an article relating to the affairs that we the undersigned have placed in the hands of Justice against James Auson Cleland with whom we formed a Society of eight parties to construct and exploit a tramway which turned out to be exploited solely by James Auson Cleland since 1927 until now, without giving us any account whatever, nor even of moneys belonging to us; and by such reasons set forth, we were forced to repair to legal justice to defend our rights.

Such are the facts in the case and even the cited publication is of no importance whatever to us; it is rather a barefaced satire calculated primarily to deceive and mislead the public against the authorities duly constituted to deal with the affairs, and melting out harmful defamation to the reputation of a public employee, in making him appear as an interested party in the suit, meanwhile, he is only a judicial depositor appointed by the Civil Judge of Limón, and in which capacity he has been discharging his duty with ample satisfaction to the Society except to the one partner, the respondent, James Auson Cleland.

Mr. Justino Vallejo, the present Agent of Police in Estrada, has been there, in that capacity, for many years, and is well known for his honesty, moral and material responsibility and as a Government officer of long standing;

and not with farce nor crimes to darken his honest reputation. We explain these conceptions only because there are silly people and others of good intention that may believe these crooked things from people of bad propensities.

As far as we know, the defendant James Auson Cleland has presented some ten incidents and has lost all of them; and now stupidly makes boast of one that the Judge of Limón has pronounced in his favour and which even, is not conclusive, being under appeal awaiting the final decision of the High Court,—bearing in mind—that what's over be the findings of this High Court, this incident is of no importance on the basic principle of this suit; and we are sure that that judgment will be revoked.

In time we will expose those persons who under cover, are attacking Mr. Vallejo, so that they may be arraigned before the bar of plenary justice. At all events, those who are directly interested in this business, already know the correct state of things, that James Auson Cleland is defendant and Mr. Justino Vallejo, the actual Agent of Police in Estrada is only judicial Depositor of the embargoed tramway by appointment of the Civil Judge of Limón and this is all.

Respectfully requesting Mr. Editor to give publicity to the present.



## Our Elections

### Encouraging a Hope

It is to be hoped that the sudden and pronounced interest shown quite recently in healthy outdoor sports among the youth of Port Limon will be productive of much good at least physically. Time and time again, it has been the experience of many old citizens here, that many a good proposition comes into existence backed by fair promises of support and allegiance only to be deserted again by its pseudo-supporters and then go out of existence with the rapidity with which it came into effect.

### Fresh Interest

It would appear, however, that a new and lively spirit of friendly rivalry among the various clubs of foot-ball, cricket, basket-ball and baseball has augmented to a creditable extent. In foot-ball there are the two eternal rivals and famous sport clubs the Gimnastica Limonense and the Barcelona, in cricket the two most enterprising and energetic clubs are the Surprise and the Excelsior, in baseball the Costa Rica, Giants and the Barcelona, in Basket-ball the Gimnastica, Barcelona and the Hollywood. The Hollywood, by the way is a recently organized Ladies' Club composed of cultured and popular young ladies among whom are the Misses Abdelnur, Brock, Alvarado and many others whose names are not yet acquired.

### The Hollywood Basket Ball Club

The Hollywood, a youthful team of inexperienced players, made its debut not very long ago and won its initial match against the Gimnastica Limonense. This was amply demonstrated in the regrettable experience of the Committee who endeavoured to arrange a few matches with the recent visiting cricket team from Bocas del Toro. It is now a matter of history, how, after all arrangements were made to play the matches in the stadium it was unceremoniously denied the Committee who got up a programme of games. As a result no representative match was played with the visitors. There were other motives for not playing these games; but the primary motive was due to the refusal of the use of the stadium for the Estrella Match.

### An Exhortation

Sportsmen be alert: are you keen on acquiring your own sport ground? What about Messrs. Sankey and Syndicate who have on foot the splendid idea of owning a ground of their own. We are all hoping for an early realization of this very ambitious project.

the most educated in the Republic.



## The Jamaican Sugar Problem

Lord Oliver has been doing all possible for the protection of the Sugar industry of the West Indies before Parliament; he pointed out to Lord Pass-

field Minister for the Colonies that whereas due to the overproduction of this article in the Sugar producing countries of the world, and the dumping in

the U. Kingdom of this Commodity from foreign countries, the British consumers have benefited by the low prices for the last three years for the tune of fourteen million Pounds sterling, therefore it is quite feasible to expect that a part of this money could be utilized in granting a Subsidy to the Islands as an impetus for keeping alive this industry within the Empire. Lord Passfield however replied that he did not see how it was possible to put such a proposition to Mr. Snowden the chancellor in view of his statements on his Budget.

The Jamaica Legislature is therefore proposing the suspension of the war Subvention of £60,000 annually which this colony had been paying over to the Imperial government to assist in paying the war debt; with a view of subsidising the Sugar producers of the Colony so as to keep the Industry alive, and thus help with the nonemployment

which would naturally be caused, if sugar manufactory was to become extinct in the Island.

The output of Sugar in Jamaica has risen this year 120.0 tons in excess of the estimate for the year reaching the respectable figures of 67847 tons for 1930 crop. Unfortunately the prices have fallen off due to this overproduction in all countries.

Strange to say that in this country the price of this article has risen instead, retail prices now being at 7 1/2 cents U. S. Currency. In importing countries like the United States and Canada, Sugar can be had for four and a half cents whereas we here who produce the article must pay seven and a half cents.

The Legislature of Jamaica has voted a message of Thanks to Lord Oliver for the interests he exhibited in the Island's welfare with respect to the Commission on the preference tariff relative to our Sugar
