For another monopoly

In their effort to raise as much revenue as may be possible from all sources, so as to enable the government to meet its ordinary current and other obligations, it is stated that Don Cleto's advisers suggested that a monopoly, in favour of the government, be placed in the Country's "Salt" trade. Much exception is being taken to the proposal by the commercial community. The matter was referred to the Chamber of Commerce and the Board of Directors has forwarded a letter to His Excellency Don Cleto strongly pro-testing against this new scheme for augmenting our revenue.

first two of the six ships, of first two of the six ships, of the most modern type, were launched in the presence of a large and distinguished gathering, including high officials of the United States government, Latin American diplomats, and officials of other shipping companies. The ships, named the "Talamanca" and the "Segovia", were sponsored by Mrs. Hoover, wife of President Hoover, who broke two reproductions of ancient Mayan vases, specially secured for the purpose, across the flagvases, specially secured for the purpose, across the flag-draped prows in the course of the ceremony. These two ships will be ready for service

ships will be ready for service in six months time. The "Talamanca's" cost will, it is stated approximate £ 705,000, and for the new fleet of six ships £4,200,000.

In speed, depth and beam, the new vessels will exceed all the other ships of the Company. Their specifications provide for a maximum speed of 20 knots, a sea speed of of 20 knots, a sea speed of 18 and a 60 foot beam. Their tonnage will be 11,000.

Haiti recovering

What is regarded as an important step towards terminating the American occupation of Haiti took place on the 5th. ult. when an agreement was signed by representatives of both governments under which Haiti will, on 1st. of October next, be given full control of the Deptartment of Public Works, the Technical Service of Agriculture and Industrial Education and the Public Health Service, which are now controled and operated by the Americans. As also provided by the agreement, a decree was is sued the same day, by order of the officer in Command of the Marines, repealing the state of Martial Lavy which had been in effect since the earlier period of the occupation though dormant in recent years.

The financial receivership

The financial receivership and the Marines will be remaining, it is said, for about two years longer, although by the 1915 treaty the latter are entitled to remain till 1936.

This recent agreement is regarded as an effort to give effect to the recommendations made by the Forbes Commission last year.

Stock Exchange suffers loss

Cable advices from New York that on Thursday last inform there was another heavy loss, estimated at around one thousand mil-lion dollars, on the stock market.

The United States Steel Corporation suffered a drop of 3 points, which is stated to be the lowest since 1929. Other heavy losers were the railroads.
