THE CONTRAST

There are however various forms of amusement and the ingenuity of man has located a new one. Every country has its own special sport, there is the football of Scotland, crick of England, and there is the ball-light of Spain, who is at once calculated to minister to leavard cruelty, and love of China. Revolt in Spain Brewing.
 By the latest despatch we gather that a revolution in Spain having for its objects the overthrowing of the Monarchy and the establishing of a Republic is being given serious thought. It is believed, that there is every chance of Spain becoming a Republic within the next 3 or 4 years. The people of Spain we are told are anti-clerical and anti-monarchists. It is also said that the King is getting unpopular, and devotes too much of his time to sport, besides which he is sick, and is not expected that he will live beyond the above period. The Government has to face two serious problems and the bringing about of the Republic depends on how they are solved. The first is the capitulation of the Government to the Vatican. The second is, the guarding Morocco with a strong military garrison, against which the people of Spain are opposed. What shall we next hear to happen in the Governments of the World. We may yet live to see one great power ruling the World. Would it not be going back to History? as was the case of Rome in days long past.

Portugal again Figuring.
 The Republic of Portugal is threatened with a Military revolution. The establishing of the Republic is due principally to the military. If these had cast in their lot with the ex-King, the Monarchy would be today one million per cent stronger than it was when the revolution broke out. Fair promises have been made to the military by the new Ministry in having four months leave of absence on full pay; but they could not be so easily caught. The military authorities are clamouring for supreme authority. This is just what we anticipated. How the issue will now be maintained, remains to be seen. We fear that there will be series of revolutions, blood will be more easily and readily flow. Portugal will have a terrible heart-rending time before her. We should not be surprised, if one of the great powers did not intervene. Time proves all things away.
