A gigantic Swindle in connection with a House-rafle in San José.

The Gen. Mgr. of THE TIMES

Sir,—

On account of several who have lost their money in a house raffing transaction in San José, I now ask through the medium of your valuable paper the protector of rights in Limon, where has that money gone and what has become of its interest! A swindle I never heard of its kind in Costa Rica before. In May 1910 Mr Armando Olivares of this Town was selling tickets for Mr. Luis A. de Laporce who had a house in San José raffing in combination with the Lottery ASILLO CHAPITI for the amount of \$60,000.00 Colones. Mr. Olivares met me and asked me to buy some tickets; I understood from him that the deal was an honest one and I bought 2 tickets for 2 Colones.

The drawing for the month appointed came off; and my not having the winning number I concluded that I had lost, but fortunately or otherwise a few days after, I was told that the raffie had not come off on account of not having disposed of all the tickets. Mr. Olivares then informed me that the raffie would be coming off in June. This also proved to be false; July and August passed and I heard nothing more of the raffie, there was no advise to the effect and lots of tickets were torn with the opinion that it had come off. I was afterward informed that it had not come off, and an Agent from San José was in Limon with the purpose of refunding to the people their money less 10%.

I went to Mr. Olivares from whom I bought the tickets, to collect my money, and was answered by Mr. Enrique Clare who seemed to have been very much interested in the matter that I cannot get back my money unless I produce the tickets. I told him that in consequence of the irregularity of the drawing, I had torn my tickets, but of course as the vendor

has the stubs on which my name is recorded there will be no difficulty in the matter. No, no, said Mr. Clare, you shan't get your money, I wrote Mr. Laporce, the owner of the house and explained the whole affair, and not having received a reply, I wrote him a second letter, but that Gentleman did not see it fit to answer, and so myself, and many others have lost their money in Mr. Laporce's scheme.

I beg through this medium to call the attention of the Government authorities to take steps and investigate this matter, as I am sure the Law of Costa Rica would not permit such illegal transactions.
