## Memorial on the Death of Rev. I. H. Sobey

A day or so ago, the sad intelligence was received of the death of Rev. Mr. Sobey, of the Baptist, who died on the 5th November at his son's residence at Albany, New York. For a number of years he laboured in these parts, and probably, we may be right in recording that his life-work was spent in Costa Rica. Indeed, we are informed that he was the pioneer Missioner. How many dangers he must have braved, how many trials and tribulations he must have encountered and passed through, in order, to preach the word of God with fervency and zeal; in season and out of season; known only to Him, who is the upholder and strengthener of those who love Him. We can quite understand what it must have been in those pioneer days to have been the word of God; with all the demon brood of wickedness stalking around to be squarred at, and to feel how little appreciated one's efforts have been to elevate humanity, yet by an indomitable faith in the righteousness of the cause and integrity of the mission; by courageously not forsaking his duty; in softening his heart to the needs of humanity; by his capacity being strong to apprehend his God; he was enabled to do so much which is left behind as a memorial. Mr. Sobey is well-known in these quarters,

and highly respected by one and all; and now he has passed to the "bourn" from whence no traveler returns! In the good, ripe age of 70 years, so full of honour. We can not buy say that it is our belief, that this christian chieftain has died with that fine courage, benignserenity, and triumphant faith, and that those who watched the scene must have been quickened and strengthened; as they saw him walk into the valley of the shadow of Death all unfeared, and all hoping, graciously sustained and comforted by the rod and staff of the eternal God.

## Dr. accused of abduction.

*E. W. Shaw Arrested on Charges of Inducing Fifteen Year-Old Girl to Run Away With Him—Older Woman Involved.*

Special to The Times-Democrat. Dr. E. W. Shaw of Gunter Switch, Gunter county, Ala., was arrested and brought to Meridian today by Sheriff Jackson of that county. He is charged with the abduction of a fifteen-year-old Lulu Jones, daughter of Jan Jones, a prominent planter in this county. Dr. Shaw was arrested in Justice Kern's court and required to give a bond of \$2,000 for his appearance next Thursday for trial.

The story as told by the police is sensational. It appears that through the efforts of a woman, whose identity has not yet been made public, correspondence between Miss Jones and Dr. Shaw was arranged. The girl came to Meridian to visit her sister, it is said, and Shaw visited her and, it is alleged, induced her to leave Meridian with him. It is also charged he carried her to Santer Switch, a small town near Livingston. When the girl was missed the police were notified and the couple were traced thru the Alabama town. Here it is said Dr. Shaw had housed her in different negro cabins for three days and nights. On learning of the coming of the officers and male relatives of the girl, she was placed on a train, but was caught at Livingston by Detective Monte of Meridian, and returned to her parents.

This was ten days ago, and the arrest of Dr. Shaw was allowed today. The arrest of the woman who brought about the acquaintance of Dr. Shaw and the girl is expected in the next few hours.

## Our special Correspondent.
