The article on "THE COMING CORONATION" by the Most Rev. the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury is concluded. Turn again to the Coronation Service:

Receive this Imperial Robe and Orb. And when you see this Orb set under the Cross, remember that the whole world is subject to the Power and Empire of Christ our Redeemer.

## "IN HOC SIGNO VINCES"

It is true for us all. For, be the scenes of conflict and perplexity, of painful march and doubtful skirmish, as varied as they may, there is none of us but has his own place upon the field: None but has directly or indirectly, as a citizen of the Christian Empire, his own share of the burden to carry, his own definite portion of the great trust to discharge.

All I would urge to this: Let those wonderful Coronation Prayers, as we think over them beforehand, be felt to mean what they say: In the days when they were shaped or compiled, the problem of Christian Rule was, in one sense, less complex than it is to-day. But the prayers hold good. A sword may involve and may therefore typify warfare. But a sword means something more.

Receive this Kingly Sword brought now from the Altar of God. With this Sword do justice, stop the growth of iniquity, protect the Holy Church of God, help and defend widows and orphans, restore the things that are gone to decay, maintain the things that are restor-

ed, punish and reform what is amiss, and confirm what is in good order, that, doing these things, you may be glorious in all virtue.

The Christian Ruler a Statesman, however patriotic, dares not forget that it is a Christian people on whose behalf he acts or speaks, and that that means a great deal and carries with it a vast responsibility. It is well indeed that for such a truth we should together invoke for our Sovereign a quite distinction and special endowment of Heavenly guidance and grace. Our Lord Jesus Christ by His Holy Anointing pour down upon your head and heart the blessing of the Holy Ghost and prosper the works of your hands, that, by the assistance of His Heavenly Grace, you may preserve the people committed to your charge in wealth, peace and godliness.

I have touched only a few problems out of many, and these perhaps not the greatest which the Coronation year propounds. If such thoughts are to help us when the pageants and the shows are dazzling people's eyes, we must be dwelling on them quietly days before.

## Nova Scotia.

News to hand that a new director for the Nova Scotia Bank in the person of Mr. I. H. Plummer has been elected. He is considered as being one of the ablest business men and financiers in Canada. He has a knowledge of detailed banking acquired through his long connection with the active management of the Canadian Bank of Commerce in association with Sir Edmund Walker. Mr. Plummer fills the position vacant through the resignation of Mr. H. C. McLeod.

## Panama Canal.

It is learnt that 92 enormous Steel gates for the Panama Canal, are being built in Pittsburgh. They will be the largest in the world and will be as high as a six-story building, and as wide as many city buildings, and are seven feet thick. The Structural steel that will go to make them will weigh 60,000 tons. The cost will be \$1,100,000. They will be shipped in pieces by steamer via Baltimore and 400 skilled Structural Steel builders from Pittsburgh will go over with them to set them up. It will take three years to complete the job.

## Good News.

From the *Times Democrat* it is learnt that the Royal Mail Steam Packet Company, of England, has bought the Pacific Steam Navigation Company, of South America, and is now making plans for mail subvention from England to Jamaica, through Panama Canal to Valparaiso and Callao, and from New York to Callao and Valparaiso by way of Panama Canal. In addition to this enterprise the Japanese have arranged to subsidize a line from New York to Callao and Valparaiso, and have obtained a subsidy not only from their own government, but from the Peruvian government as well, with the avowed purpose of carrying American goods.

## To build Tramway.

It is learnt that a concession has just been given by the Haytian government to build an Electric Tramway from Port-au-Prince, Hayti, to Petionville. Five companies made propositions for the concession. The most favourable terms offered were those of the P. C. S. Railway Co., which quite recently from a German to an American company and that of an English tramway syndicate represented by Mr. W. Quintain Williams, of Jamaica. The engineers of the P. C. S. Co., and Mr. Williams, on behalf of his Company, have been making a survey of the proposed route of the railway with a view of arriving at an approximate cost.

## The Best Record.

It is learnt that Mr. Drexel, of Philadelphia, broke the world's record for altitude in a flight from Point Breeze, the barograph registering 10,000 ft. The best previous record 9,714 was made by the late Mr. Johnstone, on October 31st., at Belmont Park.

## The Coronation.

The Canadian Associated Press understands that King George V. will adhere to precedent in regard to the Coronation ceremony on June 22, and that there is no disposition to excel any of the historic characteristics by adding any courtly or military display. The only probable alteration of the programme will arise from any specially expressed desire of the overseas dominions to be more comprehensively represented.

## The Seine.

The River Seine is falling. The flood has caused heavy losses to property owners. Hundreds of tenants have been obliged to abandon the houses bordering on the river because of dampness.

## Accidents.

At 6.30 a. m. yesterday morning while Engine 35 was taking the Banana train to the Dock, Raphael Martinez on his way to work, fell from one of the cars and had both legs mutilated. He died a few hours after.

While Alfred Seeley was on his way home from Ciniquita, he was shot in the arm.

Frank Ashley, brakeman on one of the trains met with an accident at Squires. He fell between the cars and sustained a fractured arm, with several bruises over the body.
