He, in his turn, faces his own price for those commodities which are the results of the jurdicious investment of his cash. Labour Unions bave done a great deal to bring about a better feeling between the two parties. In such countries as England and North America, these Unions are recognised by the respective governments, and their rules and regulations are approved of by State laws and made the basis of arbitration when necessary. The breaking up or burning of factories and other acts. of violence in which the perturp feelings of the labourer used to find vent in former days are hardly heard of now. But in those countries the labourer took the field, owing to the skillful marshalling of the forces arrayed against him. Still, the struggle goes on and will go on until Capital realises the rightful place of Labour in its economy.
