## Snake Bite and its cure

We live in a country where, owing to the numerous specimens of snakes of a poisonous nature, the saying of David may well be appropriated by those whose business takes them into the country. There is but a step between life and death. Therefore it comes as a fact very interesting to us when we read in an American paper that a remedy has actually been found for the much-treaded snake-bite. The information is given by Dr. Charles Stuart Moody, who prefaces his remarks on the subject by saying that man is unreasonably afraid of snakes. It is rare indeed, he says, that a person concerns himself with the classification of the serpent that chances to cross his path. He immediately possesses himself of a stout club and proceeds to maul the unoffending reptile into the earth without troubling him to find out if the snake is harmless or otherwise. For our own part, we should much prefer to make the examination as to the harmlessness or otherwise of Master Snake after we had mauled him than before. But the point to which we should like to advert is that which professes to deal with the cure of the deadly poison instilled into the victim by those serpents that are really venomous. The Doctor states that all the deadly snakes can pass that presence of mind which is so valuable in such cases. Many fatal accidents can quite fancy a laborer on might have terminated quite one of the Costa Rica farms differently had the victim recognizing to the trouble when he

meets with a snake to examine him so as to find out whether he really has this little depression or "pit" back of his nostrils. About 60 per cent of the people who are bitten by snakes receive the wound on the lower limbs, 35 per cent on the hand or the arm, and 5 on the trunk or the face. Of these, wounds on the lower limbs are the least dangerous. Those on the trunk or the face, being nearer to the large nerves and arterial vessels, most so. The more remote the wound is from the chief centres of circulation, the less dangerous it is. The treatment for rattlesnake wounds, according to Dr. Moody, resolves itself into the application of a few very simple rules. We take it for granted that the treatment in the case of our Costa Rican snakes would be about the same, as the poisonous principle in every case must be more or less the same at bottom. In the first place, he says, a person wounded by a snake usually does the very thing he should not do—he goes tearing off to the nearest human habitation, thereby increasing his circulation and distributing the poison through his system more rapidly. The bitten man should sit down calmly and bind his handkerchief around the limb (if it is a limb, and if he has a handkerchief), then break off a stout twig and insert it beneath the handkerchief, producing a rude tourniquet and twist until the circulation is effectually shut off. With a sharp knife (again, if he has one) he should make an X incision over the wound, taking care to penetrate deeper than the fangs have done. If he has good teeth and no wounds in his mouth, he may now suck vigorously at the wound. It does no good to suck the original wound, as it is a difficult matter to get the poison back through an opening no greater than that which could be made of this is done without delay, the chances are that the sufferer will experience no great incontinence. ## Trouble in Hon-Mexican Refugees Foreign News

Washington, Dec. 24th.—Following the lodgment of formal protests by the Honduran ministers against the sailing of the Hornet from New Orleans on what is charged to be a filibustering movement direct against President Davila the State and Navy Department has instructed the Consuls and naval officers in Central America to look out for the vessel if she appears off the coast of Honduras. Orders already have been sent to the commander of the "Tacoma" on the Atlantic side, and they have now been supplemented by instructions to the commander of the York town, which has been lying at the Nicaraguan ports of Cortico, to proceed Northward to Amapala, Honduras, and guard a violation of the neutrality laws by Americans on the Pacific Coast of Honduras. There is no question as to the right of the naval officers to search the Hornet, or any other suspicious craft if it appears in Central American waters, and if it has an armed force aboard it may be seized, even if the arms and men were taken on after the vessel cleared from an American port. One reason for the renewal of the vigilance of the authorities in this matter is the receipt of reports by cable from the American legation at Tegucigalpa, the Honduran capital, as well as from Guatemala City, to the effect that there are signs of revolutionary activity.

### Shot Himself in Head

New York. After firing a 38—caliber bullet into his head John Rice propped himself on his elbow on the floor and, picking up the telephone receiver, calmly resumed a conversation he had been holding with a young woman at the other end of the line. You should see me Ray," he said, "I'm an awful mess." This little episode took place in the Chatham Club today. It is said at the Hospital that Rice has an even chance for his life. He would not say why he tried to kill himself.

### Dozens of Bridges Burned

El Paso, Tex., Dec. 24th.—The Mexico Northwestern passenger train, which left here yesterday morning for Casa Grande, running without orders, returned late last night and reported that dozens of bridges had been burned below Lena Station. The train was first stopped sixty-five miles below Juarez by a section of dynamite track. An so-foot trestle between Lena and Canejos has been burned, and every bridge of importance for miles was in flames.

Official reports disclose serious suffering in Presidio Country, along the Rio Grande frontier, seven-five miles from the railroad. Not less than 7 000 refugees, chiefly women and children, have recently crossed the river from Mexico to this side as Presidio and other points existence on the other side being unendurable owing to active presence of soldiers and revolutionists it is said. The mining town of Shafter has made up a purse of \$150, which will last about a week.

### Miner Killed

Knoxville, Tenn., Dec. 30th.—A special to the Sentinel from Ducktown says: William A. Bates, a mines in the Ducktown copper region, was seriously and perhaps fatally shot in a fight with officers on Sunday. Deputy sheriffs attempted to arrest Bates on a charge of drunkenness. He ran and barricade himself in his home. As the officers appeared Bates opened fire and two officers were slightly injured. The officers returned the fire, inflicting serious and perhaps fatal injuries to Bates. A passer-by, Thomas Johnson, was also injured by Bates' fire. Bates finally came out of the house and surrendered. Bates was 24 years old Sunday.

### Balloonist killed

Frank Brown, an American, meets death at Havana. Havana, Cuba, Dec. 28th.—Frank Brown, an American, balloonist, who went up this afternoon into his balloon, the Boston, to perform a parachute drop, struck a building and, falling, was killed.

### Labour troubles

New York, Dec. At a meeting of Long-shoremen are Protective Union to-day it was unanimously voted not to go on strike until times are better. Demands already have been made upon the various steamship Companies for an increase in pay. These demands were refused, and to-night a meeting was held for the purpose of determining the temper of the men. There are about 5,000 members of the Association.

### Chinese Assembly

The action of the Assembly met with an Elect. People notified to prepare for constitutional Cabinet, a Imperial pledge that reforms will be granted, the National Assembly then took the back track—Ching's resignation rejected.

A serious situation exist in China as results of a dispute between the throne and the Assembly. Both the government and the assembly issued defiance addresses.

### Shipping News.

The Hamburg American Line S. S. Saschenwald, Captain Muttrich arrived here on the 4th with general cargo from Hamburg via New York she sail on Friday for Porto Barrios taking mails and passengers.

The S. S. Sarnia is expected to arrive here on Friday from Kingston, Colon, Bocas del Torá. She will sail on Monday the 9th 4 p.m. taking passengers for Colon, and New York.
