Killing Turtles

Shooting and Trapping Means Devised to Rid Hatcheries of an Enemy

Turtles are a menace to fish hatcheries and do a lot of damage. They are cannibals when it comes to eating fish and because of their murderous inclinations fish wardens and stduents of fisheries are a puit in favor of their extermination from hatching

The most effective way that is being worked out on a large scale is a series of traps to be located at the incluse of the water from the river into the poulds. The trap is a unique contrivance. Large bixes are to be built of half inch meshed wire. On the river or lake side boards some six inches in width are to be laid on the sides of the wire boxes, making a sort of run way, slauted at an angle of perhaps forty-five degrees. The London "Standard" publishes the following:

Mr. A. R. Ackerley, managing director of Mesars. Elders and Fyffes, the well-known fruit spipars, in an interview yesterday stated that the Postmaster General had approached the firm with regard to the inauguration of a regular direct mail service between this country and the West Indies.

Messrs Elders and Fyffes had, said Mr. Ackerley, for some time been carrying mails to certain parts of the Indies on the poundage system, but without any restriction as to knots or scheduled times of departure from England or arrival at the destination.

The Post Office, he added, were in negotiation with his company with regard to a subsidy and accompanying mail conditions. "But," remarked Mr. Ackerley, "we are fruit carriers entirely. Our sole object is centred in getting fruit from the West Indies regularly, promptly, and in fresh condition. We do not desire to be mail carriers under conditional subsidies."

Carrying mails to the West Indies, he continued, must be considered from two points of view. First, there was the ques-tion of mails to Jamaica, and se-cond that of the service to the other West Indian islands. There cond that of the service to the other West Indian islands. There was no difficulty with Jamaica, for mails could reach there from this country as quickly via New York as direct. With regard to the other islands, a boat with mails called about once in three weeks, and then only remained two or three hours, thus affording no opportunity for a reply to be sent until the next boat called three weeks later.

Mister Ackerley added that Messris. Elders and Fyffes banana trade had so improved that they contemplated a service of regular weekly boats to the principal islands, whether they carried mails or not. The terminal port in this

lands, whether they carried mails or not. The terminal port in this country was not yet settled. At present they had a fortnightly service running into Bristol and a weekly service to Manchestef.
