President Taft sent to Congress

President Taft sent to Congress a special message in, which he reduced the administration's estimate for fortificing the Parama Cannal from \$8.79,518,818 to \$12,475,325 and as ked that \$5,000,000 be appropriated at this session to begin the work. The message was a pen for fortifications and was accompanied by a letter from Mr. Dekinson, Secretary for War, and a revised report of the Board of Army and Navy Engineers on the fortifications question:

Secretary Dickinson, in his letter, saidof the proposed forts.
