Some life on other Planets

No human beings on Venus or Mars. Prof. Perrier says

Whether life as human earth dwellers conceive it exists on the planets is a cuestion on which many eminent astronomers have pronomored various opinions. Now comes a noted coologist, Prof. Edmond Perrier, member of the French Academy of Sciences and director of the Physical Institute in Paris affirmative.

In an article contributed to La Rewae Prof. Perrier deals with the question on a strictly scientific basis, aithough he is led to rather fanciful conclusions. Taking into account the physical conditions which rule the more remote planets of the solar system Prof. Perrier thinks that life as we understand it cannot exist on them.

Mercury too, with its mean temperature of 123 degrees, he considers equally unlikely as a habitation of living things, whether animal or vegetable. In the case of Venus and Mars Prof. Perrier rasions that conditions of gravity, light and composition of matter exist which do not essentially differ from those of this earth.

The writer assumess that on both planets there is or has been water, and that it rains or snows exactly as it does here, from which he concludes that at all events lowe grade plants and canimals, such as algae, fungi and certain forms of insect life must exist there. As regards Venus, its specific gravity is but little best than the eart's and its exial inclination to its orbit is somewat steeper finant the earth's so that despite the shorter Venus year of 224 days the difference in seasons is not very marked. This, Prof, Perrier argues, is favorable to the existence of long lived insects with slow development, such as bestles, locusts and the like.

Te mean temperature of Venus being higher tham ours, there would make possible the growth of ferus and similar plants of our earbon period. Reptiles and amplibious animals might exists in the earth's trinsice period to the existence of long lived insects with slow days length in hight are executing on Venus. On Mars flowering plants would grow in abundance, and Martian flora and fauna may resamble those of the temperate and polar regions of the earth. The greater length of the Martian year, 688 days, with a proportioustely longer summer, would favor living creatures and plants producing one generation to a summer. Prof. Perrier imagines intense growth and reproduction, immensely tall grasses huge fruits, gigantic insects.

Lite being a greater struggle there, the writer is led to asume a high plane of intelligence in Martian insect life. This may consist shielly, he hazards, of creatures of the ant or termite species. Mars, he thioks, would have no massive manumals such as the elephant or the hippopotamus, but rather animals of slender build and fleet floated, such as the gazelle, or maybe certain forms of apes. He further thinks it possible that from the latter creatures of higher inteligence may have sprung or may yet spring beings with an apright gait and not necessarily disendar to the human earth dweller.
