Fighting Jack Fisher

Fighting Jack Fisher, the Kit-chener of the British navy, as the Admiral of the fleet is popularly know, retires to-day from the active list on reaching his seven-tieth birthday. Lord Fisher of Kilverstone en-tered the British navy in 1854, when steam navigation was in its infancy and when ironclad ships were beginning to be thought about. He served in the Crimaan war the following year, in the

about. He served in the Chinosal war the following year, in the China war of 1859-60 and in the Egyptian war of 1852, when he commanded the famous armored train. Since then he has all the important appointments both at sea and on shore until the became First Sea Lord, an office he relinquished a year ago, and Admiral of the Fleet.

All through his career he has worked on the principle that the gun is the prime material factor of naval war. As a heutenant he specialized in gunnery and when he became the professional head of the navy he at once directed his attention to the improvement of marksmanship. To that end he created a new office, that of inspector of target practice, to which Sir Percy Scott received the first appointment, and in 1905 for the first time the number of hits scored in the annual firing tests exceeded the misses.

Before he had been at the Admirally three months he had altered the whole strategic front of the navy and had swung its greatest strength around from the Mediterranean to the Cannel. This was but the first step in a scheme which even yet is not complete.

But Lord Fisher will also be remembered in after years as the reformer who ruthiessly and fearlessly seized the naval machine, cramped by a peace tradition of nearly one bundred years, and remodelled it to suit new need. Canada's Governor

Uncle of King to Govern the big dominion

Two years rule

His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught, the only surviving som of Victoria the Goud, brotter of Edward the Peacemaker and uncle of His Majesty the King, will in September next, become Governor-General of Canada in succession to Lord Grey.

Official notification to that effect has been received by the Government.

The appointment of His Royal Highness is for two years, but it may at the end of that time be further extended. The Duke and Duchess with their suite will take up their residence at Rideau Hall in September.

It had been found that owing to the need of His Highness's presence in England as next in rank to the King in respect of official State functions pending the majority of the Prince of Wales, he could hardly be spared to Canada at present. Any difficulties in thia respect have, however, not been deemed insurmountable and the original desire of the late King Edward that the importance and status of Canada as the first daughter nation of the Empire should be suitably recognized by the appointment of a foremost member of the Royal Frujily to represent the Crown here will be carried out.

The German Kaiser

For the last few years the German Kaiser has been almost a teototaller. At dinner at home in his palace he usually sips a glass of the light beer specially brewed for him, named Euertenbrau, wile at regimental dinners and on other public occasions he is ordinarily supplied with a tumbler of strawberry colored liquid non-alcoholic in its nature. His own experience of the benefical results of temperance has evidently been favorable, and on several occasions recently he has taken the opportunity to speak of the harmful consequence of excess. A few days before Christmas he addressed a warning to the naval cadets at Murwik, in which he declared that victory in the next war would fall to the nation that habitually consumed the least alcohol. The espeech was reported very briefly, but a fuller report now published shows that the talk with the cadets was of a heart to heart kind. In its course the Kaiser admitted that drinking was an ancient inheritance of the Germans, but said it was the duty of the rising generation to abandon it, and he mentioned the fact that of all the cases of military crime which came under his notice nine-tenths were due to excess in drink.

A Roman Boat

A Koman Boat

Sir Lawrence Gome, clerk to the London County Council, has been making research into the history to the Roman boat recently discovered during the digging of the foundations of the new county hall at Westminster Bridge. The results of his research are interesting.

"No other such find has been made in Britain," he writes, "and the boat thus possesses an interest greater even than that attaching to the clinker built boat of King Alfred's time discovered at Walthamstow a few years ago."

A coin of Allectus, which was found in the boat, points to fits date being about 293-296 A. D. and its condition and position seem to show that is was destroyed in a conflict that took place where Westminster Bridge now stands.

The episode which probably led to its destruction was the defeat of Allectus, the successor of Carausius. Carausius rebelled toward the end of the third century, took possession of Britain and assumed the imperial purple. It is believed that it was he who created the first British fleet.

Among the articles found in or near the boat were five bronze coins, fragments of pottery, three gaming buttons, two British spear heads and five horseshoes. Portions of leather footwear were studded with iron nails very similar to those used by the British workman to-day.

The remains of the boat are being preserved by treatment with glycerine, but it has been found imposible to prevent considerable shrinkage and loss of weight.

New animal

Rumors of the discovery of hitherto unknown animal in Central Africa by Dr. Trovessant prompted the eminent naturalist Richard Lydekker to write to him. Dr. Trovessant sent in reply a copy of the Paris scientific fournal Notuce, in which this appears: "We have just obtained additional information of a mysterious animal inhabiting the lakes of Central Africa. The natives call it a water elephant on account of its aquatic habits.

"M. le Petit, one of the explorers sent by the Paris Museum of Natural History, informs me he is at Tombamayi, on the northern shore of Lake Leopold, in the Belgian Congo. Five of these animals halted at a distance of 500 yards from Le Petit, enabling him to observe them for some seconds before they plunged into the lake. The trunk and ears are remarkably short. The neck is longer than the elephant's. The height does not exceed about six feet. There were signs of tusks.

"The animal's footprints in the mud were very different from an elephant's. The natives readily distinguished them. The animals, catching sight of the traveller, plunged into the water, leaving only the summits of their heads and their trunks exposed. They swam to the opposite shore.

"These details, coming from a trained observer, are sufficiently precise to leave no doubt of the animal, whatever may be its zoological affinities.
