To make London's port accesible to ships

German defrauded of muche beer

Lord Devenport, the chairman of the Port of London Authority, in discussing the future of London as a port under the proposed reconstruction at an estimated cost of \$70.00,000, said that the docks of London as now constructed are quite inadequate for the shipping business possible in the Thames. The river requires deepening, and there is no proper accommodation for the ocean passenger trade.

Tentative proposals have now been formulated for the consideration of the Authority, and the first portion of these if carried out will necessitate the spending of nearly \$20,000,000, for the building of new docks and other improvements, which in many respects will make the port a new place. Lord Devenport described how present restricted accommodation in the Tames allowed the docking of ships of only a limited size.

"A big ship is an economy in more than one direction," he said, "and a great carrying capacity tends in the direction of a lower freightage. [We desire in our first efforts to make such changes as will enable the biggets ships all at the enjoy the hospitality of the port of London.

"What will be the ultimate development of the port of London under the new conditions it is impossible to say," he concluded. "Aut that a great development is posible cannot be doubted in view of the fact that despite that stagnation of the last twenty-five years, the port has gone on bounding ahead. A Munich statistician estimates

A Munich statistician estimates that Germans last year were swindled out of \$12.000,000 worth of beer, all through getting short measure, and this it seem has been going on systematically for years. No wonder that the beer drinkers of the Fatherland are in a ferment of excitement about it.

The discovery arose out of the prosecution in the courts of Munich, where beer drinkers foregather at the original fount, of a big beerhalle propietor and his staff of waiters who were accused of habitually serving short measure with intent and malice aforethought; that is, their liter and half liter steins never contained the quantity fixed by law.

The prosecution alleged that the brewery which stood behind the beerhalle made \$52,500 a year extra profit by giving false measure. The case resulted in a conviction, but the defendants brought accross of witnesses to prove that in Munich, Berlin, Leipzig and other German cities, and also in Vienna, short measure was always served.
