### Guests for Goronetion

Royalty Who Will Assemble in London in June

It is not considered likely that the royal guests will be quite so numerous at King George's coronation as they were on the occasion of the funeral of King Edward, but the work of arranging for their accommodation is none the less arduous on the officials of state with whom it is introated. On the last occasion, nine Kings and a veritable host of minor princes had to be "put up," and the accommodation of Bucking-ham Palace was then severely taxed.

But as there is sure to be a very large attendance of important royalties and their retinues many will have to be "boarded out," so to speak. Good provision is, however, made for the occasions on which the royal residence are likely to be overcrowded. The Buckingham Paluce Hotel, which is quite near the palace, is held on a lease which contains a clause to the effect that the management will house the King's guest when required.

King George's letter to the nation will be issued to the public about a month before the ecromation, the idea of him speaking his message into the gramophone having been givel; up some time ago. The allegorical border, which has been designed by Sir Lawrence Alma-Tadema, is a beautiful example of his style, and by the King's command Raphael Tuck and Sons will publish it, the entire proceeds of the sale being devoted to some charitable institutions to be selected by the King. Queen Alexandra's letter to the nation on the death of King Elward realized 86,275 and was divided among four charities. Now that the court is in residence at Buckingham P a l a c e Queen Mary does not expect her naids of honor to "live in" as was the case in the reign of Queen Victoria.
