About the middle of the month, spotting practice with the San Marcos will be carried out by the fleet in the Chesapeake Bay.

Age of the Earth

Chicago.—Four hundred million years was given as the age of the oarth to-day in a lecture by Prof. Thomas C. Chamberlain. head of the department of geology at the University of Chicago. His statement which placed the date of formation of the planet at a time \$800.000.000 years previous to that computed by physicists, is based on a new computation involving a study of radio-activity.

"The rate of the dissociation of uranium rock containing radium," said the professor, "shows us conclusively that the earth is at least 400.000,000 yeard old. This estimate is scientifically more accurate than that of physicits.
