Toxto. — The new American treaty was bitterly denounced last evening at a dinner given by Dr. Yoshinosuke Hasegawa and at-tended by Admiral Himotsuki and numerous parliamentarians, jour-nalists and business men. Its ob-ject was to form an association

The host described the treaty as the culmination of the disasters overtaking the country in the wake of Halley's counet.

"It effectually checks Japanese expansion on the American continent," he said, "and stuitifies the effort of the hundred thousand Japanese pioneers, who are left to die out.

In the course of the evening a pamphlet entitled "Svecssity, Like Diplomacy, Knows No Fear," was circulated. In it America is described as a "country which, while posing as a lover of humanity and justice, secretly aims at the mastery of the Pacific, and then the world."
