The Evil of Quacks.

That the quack doctors and obahmen in this progressive little town cannot be denied, hardly a week passes but we are startled with the revolting particulars of some obahman's vile practices, or some quack doctors helping an unfortunate human being on that journey from which no one ever returns. On more than one occasion these Birds of Prey have been cited to attend the Daily Matinee at the Park, but for some unaccountable reasons we never see these notorious Night Hawks kept in confinement or asked to leave the country, the reason is, however, plain. The majority of the quack doctors make the ignorant persons who employ them, believe that they can "work obahm," and through dread of their powers to bring harm to them they will never appear against the vile creatures when charged before a Magistrate. It is regrettable that there are a class of people here who will pay an obahman a hundred dollars to cure an ulcer while they would not pay a certified medical man five colones, simply because they believe that the ulcer or sickness has been caused by an enemy. That these obahmen thrive, eat, drink and dress well is not surprising and at the same time the cemetery gets filled day by day as these men do not draw a line at poison in order to enhance their reputation.

We are now confronted by one of the most barefaced cases in the history of the country, and to which we gave publicity in our issue of the 11th last. The supreme zeal and rascality of the individual who tried to secure a Medical Diploma in Blank, we believe that he has overreached himself this time as from what we know of our progressive Governor he is not likely to permit so vile a man to remain in our midst; many of our readers will recollect an occasion when the then Police Judge started a crusade against a band of housebreakers and scamps who infested Fort Limon, and how he shipped off 19 of them on a Royal Mail steamer to Cartagena. We hope to see the same done again very shortly, and the residents will be happy at their departure. Many of these men have served a term in the prisons of the West Indian Islands and dare not go back to meet one of Mr. Barke's surprises, why then should Costa Rica be their hunting ground? Let every respectable citizen come forward, and name the vagabonds to the authorities without fear. These are the "Wrones that need resistance, for the future in the distance, and the good that you may do."

Adventists Criticised

The Editor of the Times.
Dear Sir,—As a result of certain meetings held here, by a Seventh Day Adventist preacher on their "Law theory, I have decided to open up a series of articles in your paper for the good of Christians and those that love the truth of God.
My first will be the Decalogue.
The Seventh Day Adventists point the people to the decalogue as Gods eternal Law, superior to all else, that which governed angels in heaven, governed man in Eden, and will govern the teeming millions redeemed unto all eternity. These "Law" and extravagant claims are the main pillars upon which the whole structure of

argument used by them for the observance of the seventh day. If they are wrong here, their whole doctrine falls to the ground—an exploded delusion. And fall it must under the banner of eternal truth. When the lawyer asked Jesus, which is the great commandment in the law? Jesus did not point to the decalogue. In fact, he did not quote one precept from the table of Stone. Jesus said unto him, "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, with all soul, and with all thy mind." This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it, "Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. On these commandments hang all the law and the prophets. Matt. 22 v. 37-40. Here are two commandments not found in the decalogue. Yet the Master said that these are the first of all the commandments and that there is none other commandment greater than these. Mark 12 v. 29-31. This spoils the theory pointing to the decalogue. God's superior and eternal Law. These men say you must love God and fellow beings are first and greatest on them the decalogue hangs. Hence it is inferior to that higher law. But 2,500 years of the world's history past before this book began. "The Law was given by Moses." Now what Moses' time was the decalogue given and compiled to that higher law.

This is settled beyond question by Moses himself. Referring strictly to the ten commandments (Exodus 13 v. 22) he says, "The Lord made not the covenant with our fathers, but with us, (Israel) verse 3. The very wording of the Decalogue prove that it was given to Israel as a nation alone. On the tables were written all the words God spoke on the mount, 19 v. 9, verse 10. These words you will find written on the tables. (Deut. 5 verse 6-22) Now let us turn the book and carefully re-read verses 6-22 inclusive, and you have exactly what was on the tables—the Decalogue. Where does it apply? The very first words of the Decalogue refer to the nation given. "I am the Lord thy God which brought thee out of the land of Egypt, from the house of bondage." Thou shalt have no other gods before me," etc. Exodus 20, verse 2-3. Deut. 5, verse 6-7. This was the actual written word with God's own fingers, and placed in the ark. When Advent leaguers hang up their Chart, it will be noticed that they have cunningly left out this part, and begin with "Thou shalt have one God."

Planned to Kill Pope

INSANE MAN FIRES SHOTS—INSULTS PETER'S AT ROME

SAYS PRIESTS PRAYED HIS INHERITING FORTUNE.

Unable to Enter Vatican, He Assaults Clerical Canon, Who Are Chanting Requiem.

Rome, April 4.—The attempt of a man, undoubtedly insane, against the canon during the service in St. Peter's today, caused great alarm for a time, particularly as it became known that he originally had designs against the Pope himself.

After he had been seized by the police, one of whom he wounded, the man subsequently identified as Pietro Pensanti, told a rambling story, in which he said he had a rich uncle and aunt whose heirs he would have been if the priests had not induced them to leave their property to religious institutions.

This exasperated him, he continued excitedly and he killed them both. For years he was in prison, and finally being released, came to Rome to obtain his last revenge—that is, kill the Pope.
Since August of last year, Pensanti said, he had been trying to enter the Vatican, but had not been able to do so. Therefore he had decided to kill some of the ecclesiastics holding office under the Pope. Armed with a revolver, he entered the cathedral, and without warning fired upon the canon, who were engaged in the recital of the breviary "in choir."

French Scholar Deprecates War

Baron d'Estournelles de Constant Says Japan Would Be Inevitably Defeat the Orientals.

San Francisco.—In an address before the Commercial Club to-night, Baron d'Estournelles de Constant, the distinguished French scholar who has been advocating the cause of international conciliation during an extended tour of this country, declared that war with Japan would be not only a crime, but folly, with no end, no result, except revolution and pain.
"Let us suppose," he said, "that the United States, following an unfortunate inspiration, attacked Japan and was victorious. This victory would do no good; Japan would remain inaccessible and even stronger than before standing upon its right against an unjust aggression."

Continuing the speaker said: "Unfortunately, European eyes only see the surface of things in Japan, and the same is true of Europe as seen by the Japanese. The latter think that invasion everything and that they can give an opinion of everything in Europe when they have paid the customary visit to the great cities factories at Osaka and Tokio. They would learn a great deal more by taking a look at our country districts, where our national life is in process of slow elaboration. In any case, Japan is considered, rightly or wrongly, as hostile to peace propaganda, and as a more or less distant danger to peace. For this reason we have asked four distinguished friends and correspondents, Mr. Miyasaka, to set down his impressions in all sincerity and without undue optimism."
His reports show that while Japan is a long way from being won over to the cause of international arbitration, her people are nevertheless beginning to realize that this cause is a predominantly national and patriotic. Many leading men see that the highest interest of every state is to avoid the worst trap set by chauvinism. Every one understands that, while proper means must be taken to protect the country from attack, a government must also try to organize international justice and the maintenance of peace, which is a essential condition of internal prosperity. On this depends the development of labor, agriculture, industries, commerce and output—in a word, progress of every kind."
