Such a permit is delivered to an applicant on payment of a fee of 12s. or thereabouts, after he has furnished the police with his name and address. together with recommendations from two respectable citizens who are householders, and a declaration as to whether the revolver or pistol is to be kept at home or to be carried away on a journey. Violation of these legal requirements, either for the wendor or by the purchaser of a revolver is panishable by fine and imprisonment.


