King George a Fine Speaker

HIS ORATORY IS CERTAIN TO PLEASE HIS INDIAN SUBJECTS

Coming Trip To Delhi For Great Durbar.

London.—The strange fashion of diplomatic etiquette has rendered it necessary for King George and Queen Mary to proceed to India all the way by sea, since it would be impossible, according to European custom for Their Majesties to take either the Marseilles or Brindisi route before they have made their official visits to the capitals of the countries that lie upon these routes. However, favourable an impression King George may create upon his Indian subjects personally, he is certain to please them with his oratory for the King is a fine speaker.

The purity of His Majesty's diction when he opened his first Parliament is still commented upon, and one noble Lord pointedly remarked that it is doubtful whether the "King's English" was ever better spoken from the throne.

While the King's oratorical abilities are familiar to his subjects it is not so generally known that he is a capital extemporaneous speaker. For example on one occasion in opening a bazaar he began—

"When I came here I had quite a beautiful speech committed to memory, so that I thought I could repeat it backward, if necessary. But alas! these charming surroundings have driven every word out of my head, and I am as helpless as a ship which has lost its rudder. However, here goes," and forthwith he plunged into a spontaneous address so full of happy compliment and rollicking humour that his audience was alternately delighted and convulsed.

The King has offered White Lodge to Prince and Princess Alexander of Teck, and they will take up their residence there as soon as the present extensive alterations have been completed. Some time ago Lord Farquhar intimated that he did not desire to retain possession of this residence, which will suit Prince Alexander admirably, who finds that his military duties require him in London more often than before, and also that his present quarters in Henry III. Tower at Windsor, are getting too cramped. Thus White Lodge, so long associated with the name of Teck, will once more be the home of that family.

Squirres

(From our own Correspondent)

An entertainment which will take the form of a "Costume Ball" comes off here on the night of the 21st inst. We understand that the preparations are grand and up-to-date and will help to keep our people from rushing into the already overcrowded Limon for want of life and sports.

Froo fights were the order of the night of the 15th inst. Our fairer complexioned brethren knelt at the shrine of Bacchus and bade defiance to the non-worship-

pers of that deity. What was rather startling is, that during the melee, the volleying of fire arms was heard in certain quarters which terrorized us to some extent. We always thought that the police were an impartial lot when it comes to the breach of the "Towns and Community Act."

We think that something ought to be done to stem this ever increasing tide of legal breach. In Great Britain, not only is the carrying of weapons by civilians strictly forbidden, but by the Pistols Act of 1903 the sale of a revolver or of any other firearm with a barrel less than fourteen inches in length is forbidden save to persons provided with special police permits. Such a permit is delivered to an applicant on payment of a fee of 12s. or thereabouts, after he has furnished the police with his name and address, together with recommendations from two respectable citizens who are householders, and a declaration as to whether the revolver or pistol is to be kept at home or to be carried away on a journey. Violation of these legal requirements, either for the vendor or by the purchaser of a revolver is punishable by fine and imprisonment.

Considerable amount of difficulties were experienced during the last banana pick-up here, occasioned by the recent strike among the fruit men. The farm labourers, who were deputized by the Company from Barmouth to do the work found it no easy task to combat the problem, and struck with the plea that they were never-informed that they would be kept at the battle for such a long time. This goes without saying that only those who are accustomed to the handling of fruits over the road can really be depended on. It is of no earthly use, that the governors and supervisors of this huge trust continue their brutal kicking for it will not lead to a successful conclusion.

No services were held here at the Wesleyan Church on Good Friday. About a dozen worshippers present of themselves, but no preacher ever showed up. We wonder what could have been the reason. Oh, we beg their pardon—perhaps the well known words must have certainly occurred to them. "God doth prefer above all temple the upright heart and true."

We understand that a day and night picnic will take place in this town on some time during this month but a suitable room can not be had for the night portion of this picnic. This is a great drawback to this place. Why will not one of our "big men" erect some kind of entertainment hall for our seekers after pleasure.

Banana Gagg's On Strike

THEY SAY THEY WILL NOT AGREE TO CHANGED CONDITIONS.

A few of the men that worked on the banana cars and are now on strike called at our office and laid their grievance. The men said they refused to work since last week Wednesday night in consequence of a rigid change introduced by Mr. Laws, labour agent for the United Fruit Company.

The men, numbering 250 refused to work under the changed condition, and are determined to keep out until the Company meet their demands, or rather pay them at the same rate they formerly did. Mr. Laws called the foremen of the gagg, and through them informed the men what the Company intended paying them.

It was the custom of the Company to pay the men as follows: Double time for night work and on Sunday, full day's pay for any time the men worked during the day, no matter what hour they leave Limon and the hour they start work on the lines, once it was before five o'clock they received a day's pay which an amount was one dollar and a quarter gold and when tied out to be paid at the rate of 50 cents per meal.

According to the new arrangement the men are offered time and a half for night work, also time and a half for Sunday work, and not to receive full pay for any portion of the day, but to be paid for the actual time they pick up the fruit. The time taken up from Limon to their destination is not to be taken into account, that is to say, if the train leaves Limon with a gang of men to pick up fruit at Siquirres, and the men reach there at 11 and they start work at 12 o'clock no time is taken from that hour, hence the hours spent from Limon to Siquirres go for naught.

Only a few of the men agreed to the conditions and are now at work but the greater part of them are out. There was some trouble in getting men to go with the cars. So as to prevent a block in the banana trade the Company had to take a number of men from the national pier and carried on the cars, they also went to the camp where the men from St. Kitts reside and "press" them to go along with the gang, a goodly number of the men refused but to no effect as they were threatened to be put out if they did not go.

The men that went out on Wednesday night were hosted by the idle women that congregated on the track lines and swore vengeance on them.
