To the Editor of the Times.

The first, old covenant from Sinai included the ten commandments and enjoined the observance of the Seventh-day Sabbath.

We now come to the Sabbath instituted in the ten commandment Law given on Sinai. This law the Sabbath either stands or falls. A covenant was made with the children of Israel from Sinai...

The Lord talk with you face to face on the mount out of the mist of the fire saying:

(1) Thou shalt have no other God before me

(2) Thou shalt not make to thyself any graven image, thou shalt not bow down thyself unto them, or serve them: (3) Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain; (4) Keep the Sabbath day, the Seventh day is the Sabbath; (5) Honour thy father and thy mother; (6) Thou shalt not kill; (7) Neither shalt thou commit adultery; (8) Neither shalt thou bear false witness; (9) Neither shalt thou covet: these words spake the Lord, unto all your assembly in the mount. And he wrote them on two tables of stone, and delivered them unto me. Deut. 5: 2-22. And He declared unto you His covenant, while he commanded you to perform, even ten commandments and He wrote them upon two tables of stone. Deut. 4: 13. When I was gone up into the mount to receive the tables of stone, even the tables of the covenant which the Lord made with you Deut 5: 1. The Lord gave me the two tables of stone, even the tables of the covenant verse 10.

The ark wherein is the covenant of the Lord which he made with our fathers, when he brought them out of the land of Egypt I Kings 8: 31. There was nothing in the ark save the two tables of stone I Kings 8: 9. The table of the covenant Heb. 9: 4. Commandments could not make these texts prove more clearly that the ten commandments were the covenant in Sinai. Eight clear texts declare that covenant was the ten Commandments, I shall next prove that the breaking of any of the ten commandment was called breaking the covenant. They have forsaken the covenant of the Lord God of their fathers, which He made with them when He brought them forth out of the land of Egypt: for they went and served other gods and worshipped them Deut. 29: 25-26. This people will rise up and say: we

ing after the gods of strangers and will forsake me and break my covenant which I have now made with them Deut. 31: 16. And it came to pass when the judge was dead and they returned, and corrupted themselves more than their fathers in following other gods: serve them. (To be continued)

Italian Dreadnoughts

Rome.—At the request of the Minister of Marine the Italian Detero shipbuilding yards and five naval engineers have submitted plans for improved Dreadnoughts of from 25,000 to 37,000 ton displacement. The vessels to carry twelve 34 inch guns, and the main gun to exceed 14,000,000 lbs. The plans will be submitted by the Superior Council of the Navy. Four ships of this kind will be laid down as soon as the plans are approved, and provision has been made for an expenditure of 66,000,000,000 lire.

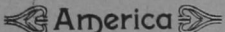
