Bacteria.

It may not be strict journalism to use the leading articles of a newspaper for the purpose of giving useful information but encouraged by the many words of appreciation we have received of recent articles dealing with public health, we propose from time to time, especially as the Darry News finds its way into most of the homes of Jamaica to write on subjects of this nature.

In this article, we shall briefly treat of badesia or microbes, extremely minute plants which need magnifying a thousand times their real dimensions before becoming visible to the naked eye. They live in the air we breathe, in the water wedrink and in the soil we tread upon and exert an enormous influence both for good and evil upon the welfare of the whole human race.

A bacteriam is a fissiparous organism, that is, it has the power of splitting up into parts, each part forming in turn a complete whole. Some bacteria became full-grown in half an hour or less, hence reproduction takes place with enormous rapidity. As a matter of fect, one individual caugive rise to about seventeen millions in twenty-four hours. When the supply of food runs short or the surroundings become in other respects unfavourable, many bacteria form bodies called spores which are very difficult to kill. In this stage, they remain, inthin the hard tims are own, and then, with unimpair of vigour, resume their ordinary life. Bacteria are far more effective scavengers than John Crows. The services they perform in decomposing and thus clearing away accumulations of rubbish can scarcely be over-estimated. Pasteur and Tyndalic clearly proved about the middle of the nineteenth century that the putrefaction of organic matter was really due to minute and air-born forms.

Such microorganism as usent, the wineger organism as leading access to the bodies of heithly persons, may be the meuns of spreading the diseases.

Injurious bacteria are now, to, other bacteria which cause infectious diseases; and by gaining access to the bodies of heithly persons, may be the meun of spreading

using it as food.

Broperly prepared tinned foods are sterile and so their contents will remain free from decomposition for any leugth of time. Small tins are more likely than large ones to have been thoroughly heated through, and on that ac-

count are to be preferred. This which have bulged out should 1 or rejected, as this indicates decomposition and the formation of gas in the contents. When a tin is opened, the contents should be at once removed to a glass, porcelain or earthemysing vessel. lain or earthenware vessel. Tinned fish should be eaten at

once.

Disease and dirt are closely connected. Bacteria cannot be more effectually exterminated than by scrupulous attention to the clearliness of the person and the surroundings. Cooking utensitis, especially should be carefully cleaned as soon as they have been used.

Light, too, has an injurious effect on bacteria and as much as possible ought to be admitted to all rooms of a house.

The transmission of disease may be largely avoided by taking care that all clothing, utensils, etc., which have been used in the sick room are thoroughly disinfected. Boil the clothes, disinfect the utensils, and fumigate the rooms.

son's Skull.

San Francisco, Champion Jack Johnson visited the German Hospital to see his younger brother, Charlie, who is boing treated for threatened blindness. While expects were taking X-ray pictures of Charlie they engagested that the champion sit down and have an X-ray made of his head to discover the thickness of his skull.

Johnson accepted and the result showed that it required five and a half minutes for the rays to penetrate, thus proving that the champion have a skull ranging from one-half to tare quarters of an inch, which is more massive than the skull of a Paxes steer.

While it took five and a half minutes for the rays to penetrate Johnson's skull they go through an ordinary human heal in from five to fifteen seconds.


