The Profound Influence of the English Bible.

English was in its first vigour when William Tyndals consecrated it in his New Testament and its consecration has preserved it in immortal youth. The Authorised Version has in it the traces of its origin and its genealogy may easily be reckoned. For, while it has the fulness of the Bishop's Bible, it has also the graceful vigour of the Generan, the quiet grandeur of the Great Bible, the clearness of Tyndals, the harmonies of Coverdale and the stately theological vocabulary of the Rheims.

It has thus a complex unity in its structure, all the earlier versions reigning over eighty years, having bequeathed to it contributions the individuality of which have not in all cases been found down. The Euglish Bible is endowed with a wooderful universality of adaptation. There has been no other book that has been so often eited and alluded to, none which has sumalised so much not. been no other book that has been so often eited and alluded to, none which has supplied so much matter for apt illustration, or has been so often resorted to for its vivid imagery and its energetic diction. It has lived on the page, not merely of such great Divines as Barrow and Jeremy Taylor, but the remark is applicable to modern literature generally: on which literature the influence of the Bible has been incomparably deeper than that left on it by all other ancient books taken together. How often Bacon, Milton, Cowper, Macaulay, whea struggling to give emphasis to their thoughts, nave laid hold, and, as it were, unconsciously, of some Scripture phrase or mstaphor. As a mere literary monument, the English version of the Bible remains the

It is Jesus Christ coming to be crucified in the fulness of time that makes the Old Testament to be so radinate swith the rising light of the morning sun. ession for us: all that fills the New Testament and especially Paul's Epistles with all their noonday splendon.

And all the exquisite beauty of its English style, of which we hear so much, all that is but the "outward adorning" of the glorious Gospel of God our Saviour. And he among you has also seen toe full glory of his Bible, who has found his God and Saviour Jesus Christ enshrined at the centre of all its truth and of all its beauty. And so today millions over the face of the earth, of all outions and kindrefs, and peoples and Longues, and hearing

lions over the Lace of the earth, of all actions and kindrels, and pepples and Longues, and hearing the word of life from the various spulpits and from the various servants of the living God in their own tongue. Truly, we are all having God's word to its "everyman in our own tongue."

The Bible, like the Hebrew captives, has passed through the flery furnace of criticism, opposition, ridicule, and apparent humiliation; has borne the heat of wicked speculations; but it lives like Carist as the Book of Books. Say what some may, but it is truly an inspired Book written by Holyman of God moved by the Divine Spirit of Truth, of Light, and of Life.


