SINISTER MOTIVES OF WASHINGTON IN PRO-POSING RECIPROCITY.

The "Morning Post", which is rapidly anti-American, prints an entorial in which it holds that President Taft and the promoters of the great meeting at the Guildhall which indorsed the proposal for a permanent peace between England and the United States are enemies of the Empire.

This once staid newspaper is funnier than Punch now-a-days in attempting to deprecate the movement to bind the two great English speaking people more closely. The "Post" says that at the time when President Taft made his offer to negotiate an unrestricted treaty of arbitration it was not known that he was trying to bribe Canada out of the British Empire, and then it raves over want it deems "the sinuster motives of Washington in proposing Canadian reciprocity."

Aft. Asquith and Mr. Briffarrasserted that the treaty first proposed by President Taft would mark a new era in civilization. Mr. Balfour, however, warned his hearers that the treaty would not mean the immediate reduction of armaments.

Mr. Asquith said, in part:—

"That which a few years ago, even a few mouths ago, might have been regarded as the dream of idealists has not only passed into the domain of practical statesmanship, but has become the still the purpose of two great democracies. The profound significance of the new departure is that between Great Britain and the United St. 18, whatever the gravity of the issue and the magnitude of the interests involved, there will be a definite abandonment of war as a possible solution.

"It is not for us to dictate or

"It is not for us to dictate or to preach to other nations, but if the United States and Great Britain renounce war a step will be taken of immeasurable and in-

comparable significance in the onward progress of humanity."
Mr. Arquith then moved the following resolution:
"That this meeting of citizens of London assembled in the Guild-hall cordially welcome the proposal of the United States in favour of a general treaty of arbitration between that country and the British Empire, and pledges its support to the principles of such a treaty as serving the highest interests of the two matons and as tending to promote the peace of the world."

The resolution was received with tremendous applause, which continued until Mr. Balfour rose to second it. He said in part:

"I believe that the great mass of public opinion on both rides favours this move. If the skill of diplomats can embody this feeling in a treaty, I do not believe that when the stress of international difficulties comes, it will be broken."


