KING'S STATE VISIT TO THE GUILDHALL.

It is expected that the arrangements to be made by the Corporation of London for the visit of the King and Queen to the city on June 29 will largely, if not entirely, follow those observed on Saturday, October 25, 1902, when King Edward and Queen Al-xandra were welcomed in the city after their coronation.

In that eve it the Lore' Mayor and the Saraffs, on nors sback, with their state officials, also mounted, and with the Aldermen and the Common Commillors of the city in carriages, will meet the King and Queen at the city boundary at Temple Bar.

On their arrival the Lord Mayor, having dismounted, will advance to the King and Opeen at the city by Queen Elizabeth. The aucent custom is for the King to touch the sword given to the city by Queen Elizabeth. The aucent custom is for the King to touch the sword and return it, and this being done, the Lord Mayor will remount his horse and take up position immediately in front of the Swereiga's personal escort, where, bareheaded he will carry the city sword of state before His Majesty.

It has already been stated that the King and Queen will attend a service at St. Paul's Cataderal on their way to the Guiddadl, and in regard to this a separate programme will be issued, but it is expected that the Lord Mayor, carrying the sword cerect, will proceed the King and Queen to their sears and there lay the sword before the King. At the close of the service the Lord Mayor will escort their Majesties to their carriage and the state procession to the Guiddall turough the streets will be resumed.

The crowing of Queen Mary, on June 22, will be only a little-less impressive than that of King George. During the long service that precedes the skiting of the crown on the King's head the Queen will occupy a chair of state in the chapter of St. Edward the Confessor. After the King has been proclaimed Sovereign of the British Realmost the Queen will be led to a stool placed between the alter and that historic chair of St. Edward, in which, when the moment arrives, the King will already be scated.

Queen Mary will how be anoint ed upon head and hards by Areabshop Lang, who places the crown on her finger. Grasping the sceptre that bears the dove, the Queen will then be led to a throne two or three steps lower than that of King George, and upon his immediate right. It will not be the Archbishop of Canferbury, how ever, but the Dean of Westminster, who will instruct the King and Queen in the details of the coronation ceremonial.


