## Coronation

### Gaieties On

#### KING AND QUEEN GROW GAY TO SUIT THE SEASON.

The police arrangements for the coronation are practically completed. For the next six weeks no member of the force will get a leave of absence. On coronation day besides the troops there will be 20,000 uniformed police along the line of the parade. They will be drawn strictly from the metropolitan area and no man will be from the provinces. The Metropolitan area is included in a radius of fifteen miles. There will be more than nine hundred plain clothes men from Scotland Yard under command of Chief Superintendent Frost, who has organized a special branch to deal with American and Continental crooks. It is made up of sixty picked officers who are now located at the principal hotels of London and the leading shops.

These men were chosen for their knowledge of the gentlemen who are not in jail but ought to be. Under the metropolitan police act crooks will be arrested on sight and charged before a Magistrate with being undesirable aliens. They will be imprisoned and deported immediately. The number of sentences passed shows the keenness of the Scotland Yard men in the matter of undesirable aliens.

A reporter for The Sex who visited London music halls in the neighbourhood of Leicester Squares, Piccadilly and the Strand recently, found all under the surveillance of Scotland Yard men. Frost makes personal visits to see that the men are on their posts trying to spot any one now in England who would be better away in June.

### RUSH OF FESTIVITIES.

Monday started a rush of coronation festivities, and for six weeks all individuality will sink in a whirl of overcrowded ceremonies. Tuesday's court was really gorgeous. The dresses were wonderful, but many presented a decidedly quaint appearance because the wearers had breadths of material let into the skirts to comply with the new court regulations against fig skirts, at the same time giving instructions to the dressmakers that the gowns be made so that later the breadths may be taken out and the garments restored to fashionable shape. The court is of course since more regarded as being as much behind the times as was the Victorian court before the first jubilee.

The King and Queen, though they are not lovers of the pomp and circumstance necessary to their high state, preferring domesticity and the more serious side of life, undoubtedly during the last week have shown a brighter side of their characters than heretofore. At Tuesday's court both seemed in excellent spirits. They displayed far more ease than usual, joked with one another and carried off the state aspect as lightly as possible. It was noticed at Newport that the King mixed with the set of racing ladies who generally sur-

rounded King Edward, though certain persons in that set had been passed over again since his accession.

During the drive to the Crystal Palace yesterday and at the palace itself the King and Queen were smiling and animated. They fairly beamed with good nature and displayed not a single trace of the boredom which occasionally had been noticed at similar affairs. The cheers of their subjects were all the heartier for this reason. King George had a great reception at Kempton Park racecourse, which he specially visited because the big event, the Jubilee Cup race, was abandoned in 1910 because of the death of King Edward.

### AMERICAN CONTINGENT.

At least 50,000 Americans and Canadians are expected to come here for the coronation. The big hotels are practically booked up already. Most of them are doubling prices for coronation week, which they regard as only a fair way of recouping the losses occasioned by the death of King Edward, when all ball and reception room engagements were cancelled and the public was not charged a penny for the broken contracts. The smaller hotels are going in for a big harvest, asking 10s. or \$10 a night for rooms usually let at from 4 to 5 shillings.

It is evident that many Americans who usually arrive here in May are holding back until June.

The liners are almost fully booked for the latter part of May and early June. The South American boats are equally full. It is impossible to book passage in the Hamburg-American Mexican service for any sailing near the coronation date.

## Album for

### Carnegie's.

#### GERMAN-AMERICAN SOCIETIES HONOURED HIM LAST NIGHT AT HIS HOME.

Andrew Carnegie received an album containing an address signed by several thousand officers of the German-American so-

cieties in the United States in recognition of Mr. Carnegie's establishing a hero fund in the German Empire. The presentation was made at Mr. Carnegie's home, 2 East Ninety-first street, Bernard U. Ridder made the chief address and the German Ambassador, Count von Bernstorff, and Dr. C. J. Hexaver, president of the National German-American Alliance, followed with addresses. Three hundred singers of the United German Societies of New York also took part in the programme.

The address for which the signatures were obtained by the *Staats-Zeitung* says that Mr. Carnegie's "interest and his care are world-wide. He has made himself a friend of civilized man and the advocate and supporter of the aims of civilization throughout the world."

"German-American citizens," it continues, "have just pride in the achievements of the fatherland, and they are foremost in upholding the fundamental principles of American civil liberty. It is with peculiar pride and satisfaction that they observe the growing intimacy of the two peoples and the friendly relations between the two Governments."

The address concludes by thanking Mr. Carnegie for his "positive constructive services to civilization, to human welfare and to peace and good will between the nations."

## Home and Foreign News.

An embargo was placed on Washington Sterling furniture by the Alcalde yesterday.

Mails for Europe, United States, and Barrios will be closed at the Post Office today at 3 p.m. Registered letters at 2 p.m.

The soldiers that arrived here on the Carriago, in transit for England, to represent Beliza Honduras at the coronation of King George V, was allowed to leave the vessel yesterday prior to their leaving at night.

At a meeting held by the members of the semi-military display committee on Tuesday night last it was resolved that the infantry be battired on Coronation Day as follows:—White tunic (braided), black pants with broad red seams, caps and black boots; the cavalry: white tunic and pants and leggings.

It is announced that the King has decided that the Archbishop of Canterbury shall, in accordance with continuous precedent from early times, crown the Queen as well as the King. Practically the only exception to this rule was at the Coronation of King Edward VII, when Queen Alexandra was crowned by the Archbishop of York. By His Majesty's command the sermon at the coronation will be preached by the Archbishop of York.

The verdict which awarded \$12,000 damages against Sir John

William Bann, leader of the Progressives in the London Council, for the alleged slander and libel, was set aside in the Court of Appeal. Judgment was entered for him. The appeal by Sir John Bann was based on the verdict of a special jury sitting with Mr. Justice Raby, in the action in which he was sued by Mr. William Griffiths and Mr. Benjamin Badall in relation to his public speeches and a letter to "The Times" upon the now abandoned G. B. system of electric traction laid down in the Mile End road, of which system the plaintiffs own the patents.

The Leyland Line steamer "Mexican" arrived here yesterday from Liverpool via Mobile, consigned to Madors & Sons. She brought 5 deck passengers from Colon and several other cabin passengers in transit.
