own experience in the Philippines may make Americans believe that sometimes Great Britain also has been compelled to assume burdens of Empire both without original intent and much against her will. At present, it is a universal article of belief with the masses of the people of the United States that, while each successive step in the development of their own country has been but an inevitable stage in the unfolding of a manifest and divinely pre-ordained destiny, every consecutive step in the enlargement of the British Empire has been an example of an atrocious national rapacity.

### CAUSES OF AMERICAN DIFFERENCE.

The present contemptuous indifference of the people of the United States towards the Philippines has its root in different causes. In the first place, who base their dislikes of the possession of the islands on political and Constitutional grounds, holding that the United States has neither need, nor business with a Colonial Empire, but that to hold any people in subjection against their will is alien to the spirit of her institutions. Next, there is an even larger number of people who are frankly tired of the whole business. These are largely those who at the outset entertained the loftiest ideas of the mission of their country. Their belief was that the rapidity and completeness with which the civilizing of the Filipinos would be accomplished was to be an example to the world. In the course of a few years, by mere force of inspiration, mild administration, and a few thousand school teachers, the heterogeneous mass of Oriental people who live in the islands were to be converted in a self-respecting Occidental nation, and the Filipino Republic would be introduced to the world standing firmly on its feet, with a Bible under one arm and a copy of the United States Constitution under the other, as a nice, new, self-governing and self-respecting State. But the path of philanthropy has been unexpectedly stony. The Filipinos themselves, with their insurrections, their lawlessness, their incapacity as agriculturists and their persistent eagerness for immediate independence, have been discouragingly difficult to make happy. There were mistakes also, even scandals connected with the early administration of the islands; and when at the end of 12 years, America's missionary labour in the Philippines is found to bear so much resemblance to the work of Great Britain in the Malay States and in Egypt, with serious misgivings as to which of the two countries is really making the better job of what it has to do, it is not surprising that high ambitions should have fainting in something like weariness and disgust.

### Education.

There are many prominent Jamaicans residing here, and several of them are blessed with children, and as a natural consequence would like them to be possessed of a sound education, which is so necessary an adjunct in these days where competition is rife and only the fittest will survive. A sound education, associated with good character, is the foremost principle for one to achieve

so that he can be useful to himself and the community in which he happens to be surrounded.

We some time ago, referred to the necessity of a high grade school here where children of the more fortunate parents can be sent, and where they could be separated from the undesirable ones. Up to the present no one has seen the necessity of establishing such a school. We are not advocating a school for any particular nationality, on the contrary, one that every child that reside here and whose parents are in a position to send their children to.

While on this subject we would like to call the attention of parents to the generous offer made to residents of Jamaica and which is taken from the "Telegraph and Guardian."

"The Hamburg-American Line, wishing to gratify the desire of students abroad to spend their holidays at home, have decided to quote a special rate of 65 dols. round-trip from New York and Jamaica, from June 15th to September 30th, to all students under 20 years of age, who shall present a certificate from the Principal of the school which they are attending, the return portion being valid until the 30th September."

The Hamburg-American Line of steamers reap a handsome harvest here and which every one we feel certain will compliment them for, and trust they will still continue to sara what is legally due to them. What we now suggest is; Cannot the company be asked to extend the same generosity here as done in Jamaica, we predict that if they were approached on the subject in an earnest manner they would acquiesce, thereby allowing students between here and New York to have a reduced fare and which would tend to foster a closer relationship with the company and the Republic.

### Small Estates in Jamaica.

In Jamaica 75 per cent. of the 135,000 landed properties are valued less than \$200 each. Nearly all of these small holdings are owned by negroes who live chiefly on salt fish and on fruits and vegetables, especially yams grown by themselves.

Being able to live in this manner with little exertion those peasant proprietors are averse to entering into contracts to labor by the year or even by the month. Hence, in spite of the fact that 95 per cent. of the 800,000 inhabitants of Jamaica are negroes (including mulattoes), it is necessary to employ East Indian coolies on the large sugar and banana plantations on which there must be a certain proportion of laborers who may be relied upon for steady work at all times.

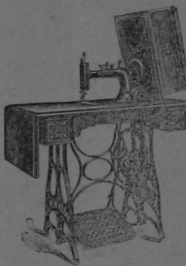

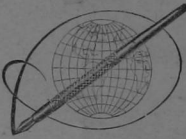
