Text of the Judgment.

His Honour the Chief Justice said:

This is an election petition presented by Mr. Henry Cork against the return of 4th name of Mr. Solomon Alexander Gibert Cox as the member elected in January 1911 for the electoral district of St. Thomas and claiming that his name may be so returned.
